Crusader Lax Opens Their Season with an Impressive Road Win Over Ramapo



April 19 – Franklin Lakes, NJ – The Bergen Catholic Crusaders travelled to Franklin Lakes to open their season against the formidable Ramapo Raiders. It has been an extremely long layoff and both teams brought the energy and intensity you would expect from the very beginning of warmups. Despite the rain, the atmosphere was electric, and so was the Crusader offense early.

A 6-1 first quarter got the Crusaders rolling as the controlled possession and pace for most of the half. Brenden Kelly would get the Crusaders on the board less than two minutes in, and that would just be the start for the Bergen Catholic attacker.



Luke Macejka would make it 2-0 Bergen Catholic off a feed in transition from Brenden Kelly. Ramapo would respond with a goal of their own shortly after, but the Crusaders showed no signs of slowing down offensively. Kelly and Macejka would each tally second goals in the quarter to extend the lead to 4-1 BC.




Ramapo would push after each Crusader goal, but the Bergen Catholic defenders did an excellent job of keeping Ramapo out of the middle and too the outside. Kyle Loughlin would get on the board, and Kelly would add another for a first quarter hat trick. It was a dominant start for the Crusaders and the second quarter would prove to be much of the same.

Ramapo needed to a quick push to get themselves back into the game and they did exactly that to start the second quarter. The Raiders scored early to cut the BC lead to 6-2.

Ramapo would steal the momentum briefly, but Brenden Kelly would halt their comeback hopes yet again, as he would score back-to-back goals for the Crusaders extending the lead to 8-2. Bergen Catholics defense would shut Ramapo down the rest of the half and goalie Dominic Pira was strong in net. The Crusader defense kept the Ramapo offense to the outside, giving Pira the

ability to see and track shots well. The Crusaders would take an 11-2 lead into the half as a result of excellent play on both sides of the field, and Bergen Catholic would never look back.



Ramapo would outscore Bergen Catholic 4-2 in the second half, but it would not be enough as the Crusader's handled their first outing from start to finish. 5 different players scored goals for the Crusader's (Brenden Kelly, Kyle Loughlin, **Nicholas** Mueller, Luke Macejka, Marinaccio), and 3 others would get on the score sheet with assists (Jake Nelson, Charles Opreza, Peter Pitrelli). JV Lacrosse Defeats Green Raiders in Opener



Two DeLaCruz Grand Slams Highlight BC Fireworks



Giovanni Perrone was BC's top hitman with 18 kills, 2 blocks, 3 digs, 5 service points including 1 ace.


James Deegan was one of many Crusaders who performed well. He earned 10 service points including 2 aces. Deegan recorded 3 kills and 11 digs.

Q: What was your toughest match of the tournament?

Joe Cangro - The toughest match in getting to the final was the quarterfinal because I had experience with the kid in the semi-final. I hadn't wrestled the kid in the quarters since last year, but I wrestled the other semifinalist, Ethan Fernandez from Westwood.

I felt confident going into the finals. I warmed up well and things didn't go my way. I last wrestled him in the Dragon Showcase in the fall.

Q: What other wrestlers of ours were you impressed with?

Joe Cangro - Remy Brancato took second as well and he wrestled very well. Nate Camiscioli lost in

the semis to the eventual state champion by one point.
