Schwake's Natural Hat Trick Plus One Leads Crusaders to Opening Day Win

September 9 - Oradell, NJ - The Crusaders have had DePaul's number for the past few years. As a matter of fact, BC is on an 11-game winning streak against the Spartans with Coach Berkanish's only imperfection against DePaul being a 4-4 tie in 2015. Under his tenure, BC is 13-0-1. The unbeaten streak stands at 16 games with the last loss coming in 2013.



Senior forward NICK Schwake scored three first half goals, giving him a natural hat trick on the day. Ethan Bogg assisted Schwake on goal number one. Danny Kissil set him up on goals #2 and #4 and Spencer Neal assisted on the hat trick goal. His fourth came at the start of the second half which may have distracted the laser focus of the Crusader defense.

DePaul Catholic scored their one and only goal of the day shortly afterward, but the Crusaders answered with goals from senior defender Brian Maron, who was assisted by Bogg and Tyler Ferris found Eddie Payan who wrapped up the Crusader scoring.



Kyle Tencza was outstanding in the net, making an incredible diving save in the first half. He finished the day yielding only one goal against with 7 saves. Andrew Blodgett finished up, halfway through the second half for BC.

September 11 - Mahwah, NJ - The Coach Josh Powers Era has begun in very strong fashion. In its opening meet, the Varsity earned second place in the Season Opener Invitational and the Frosh Team won its meet.

Junior Tom Rogers led the varsity, placing fifth overall with a time of 16:55 in the 5000m event, just 13 seconds off the top time. Senior Alex Shaia placed 15th with a time of 18:07. Junior Joseph Griffith (20th - 18:19) edged out classmate James Hughes (18:20 for 21st) who pulled in just ahead of Senior Nick Pesanello (29th - 18:38), Matt Marques (31st - 18:52) and Elias Garcia (34th - 19:01).

Lakeland Regiona HS finished with 63 points and an average time of 17:47. BC was number two at 81 points and an 18:03 average time.

FROSH FOOTBALL CLIMBS TO 2-0



September 11 - Wyndmore, PA - The Crusaders dominated all over the field against one of Pennsylvania's top programs on Saturday. BC found all sorts of ways to score whether on offense, defense or special teams, the influence of Head Coach Dave Cavalluzzo's relentless pursuit of excellence was on full display.



On the first play from scrimmage, Anthony Perrotti carried around the right end, picking up 20 yards. The Explorer defense tightened and the teams exchanged short possessions.

The dam was breaking, however as BC's Mujahid Russell



punished the hosts on 3 carries, picking up 25 yards. That set-up a spectacular play that QB Dominic Campanile and WR Naiim Parrish executed to perfection. Parrish beat his defender down the BC sideline and Campanile delivered a beautiful

pass, good for 39 yards and the first six points of the game. Campanile followed up the pass with a perfectly executed 1-step fade to Quincy Porter and BC was up 8-0.

On the following possession, Russell sacked the Explorer QB in the endzone and forced a fumble in the process. It was recovered for a touchdown by Kaden Irby-Mason and after a quick pass from Campanile to Perotti, BC led 16-0.

Guytano Bartolomeo continued his outstanding kicking throughout the day, pinning LaSalle deep. After three plays,



they executed a beautiful, high-spiralling punt. Parrish must have thought it was beautiful too as he settled under it at the 21-yard line and began his return. He started toward his left and started gaining some ground when a would-be tackler grabbed him by the sleeve of his jersey. He spun him around, but it only seemed to accelerate Naiim, who was now sprinting across the field to his right and he cruised into the endzone for a highlight reel return.

Campanile and Porter connected again on a perfectly-timed Rocket Screen for the two-point conversion and BC was up 24-0.

The Crusaders would score their final touchdown of the day on a screen from Campanile to Mu Russell who took the ball 15-yards for the score. The PAT was blocked and BC led 30-0.

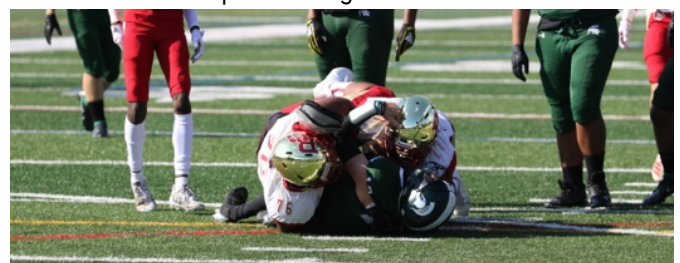

BIRDS OF THE WEEK: RAPTORS



September - Alpine, NJ - The fall migration season has begun! It is one of the favorite times of year for birders who get out to witness some of nature's most beautiful creatures heading south. A young person who was near me on Sunday exclaimed, "A kestrel! A kestrel! Fall Migration is here!!!"

Above are some of the larger birds that you will likely see if you head over to the north-eastern-most part of the state off the Palisades Interstate Parkway at a location called the Stateline Lookout. The 400' cliffs provide a terrific vantage point to observe birds of all shapes and sizes heading toward their winter grounds in the south.

Above we have three birds you will likely see, but there are many more you can experience. (LEFT) Black Vulture. This bird is a scavenger that loves road kill, often with large numbers of other black vultures. His large, wide wings allow him to soar, circling high in the sky (called "kettling"). He does not have to dive for prey, but is better designed for softer landings around its meal. This is a large bird, just a little smaller than an eagle. The difference in identifying them is the black head and tail, body and wings. Black Vultures have conspicuous white patches at the end of their wings. There are often other vultures present called Turkey Vultures. TVs have bald red heads (difficult to see) and their coloration is dark with greyish portions on the lower parts of the wings.

In the middle, we have a bird known as an Osprey. These are tremendous fishers with striking white and black/brown features. As you compare their wings with those of Eagles or Vultures, you see a considerable amount of white with some dark streaking. They have a white cap and dark mask-like markings on their face. The wings are more aerodynamic than that of the vulture as it needs to dive to catch fish it finds sometimes 30-40 feet below them. Ospreys can hover when they find a fish near the surface of the water and quickly plunge, extending their talons to catch the fish upon impact.

Last pictured is the fastest creature on the planet, the Peregrine Falcon. This is an immature falcon and one of three that was seen this past weekend. When you look at the wings of the falcon, you can see they are much more pointed and built for speed. These birds can really go, reaching upwards of 140 mph when in a dive. As thousands of blue jays cross the river, they can see them from a mile away. With a mile of space over open waters, they are often easy prey for this bird hunter.

If you're curious about when to go, check a weather app for wind directions. Winds out of the North West are generally best as they are ushering birds down from the north and toward the coast. It is quite likely you will see me at the Stateline Lookout on Sunday's between 10:00 am and noon. Feel free to say hello and we will see how many birds we can count.
