### BC – BUTLER/CARBONARO

**DUO COMBINES FOR ALL 28 POINTS, HELP BC REMAIN PERFECT**

**GOULD INTERCEPTS PAIR, BLOCKS PAT TO SET TONE FOR CRUSADER DEFENSE**

**September 18 – Oradell, NJ** – It seemed no one really expected a 14-13 halftime lead, but that's just where BC found itself at the end of two quarters. The game was 21-19 with the visiting Green Wave going for two (didn't work out for them) before the Crusaders were able to put their first New Jersey opponent of the season to rest and improve to 3-0 on the season.



The game opened as any Crusader fan would hope. BC received the ball and immediately went to work. With Ryan Butler picking up big gains on the ground and successive Steve Angeli completions to Jayden Bellamy (37 yds) and Santino Correa (19 yds) set up Butler TD #1 on the day, a 22-yard overpowering run. Five plays and 81 yards, capped off by Giancarlo Carbonaro's first PAT of the afternoon, and BC led the Green Wave 7-0.

After John Fiore tackled a Delbarton receiver following a completion, USC-bound defensive back Jaden Gould made

his first big play of the day, an interception, returning the ball to the Delbarton 37 and putting BC in business once again.

The offense was unable to capitalize, but the defense stopped Delbarton at their own 15. After three-and-out, the wave punted and then received a full dose of Butler, smashing into their defense play after play, moving the chains.

Angeli tossed a couple of quick balls to Christian Carti and Saeed St.Fleur to continue moving the chains, then it was back to Butler. A little sprinkling of a pass to Logan Cox may have served as a distraction to the visitors before Butler



powered the ball into the endzone from the five-yard line. The next extra point would prove, in the coming twelve minutes, to be critical. The Green Wave took full advantage of a couple of pass plays for touchdowns, but Jaden Gould blocked the extra point following the first touchdown and that put the visitor in a trailing position through the game.

As the second half began, Delbarton tried to build on the momentum in the air. Notre Dame-bound defensive back Bellamy leapt and got a piece of a Green Wave Pass which was quickly intercepted by sophomore Kaj Sanders who returned the ball to the 30-yard line.



BC went three and out and forced Delbarton to punt after a short possession. This is when things got interesting.

Punt returner Chris Mimmo attempted to field a punt, but muffed it. As he scrambled after the ball, he was running backward toward his own endzone. Delbarton players swarmed and wrapped him up, running into the endzone. The ball was marked, correctly, at the five-yard line and the field position and danger of the play seemed to spark the Crusaders. Saeed St.Fleur ripped off a twenty-six yard run and in four plays, the Crusaders were a midfield. That set up big-play time for Mr. Touchdown. Butler ran 49 yards to the scoreboard and no one was able to catch him. Carbonaro's extra-point was good and it was starting to force decision time for the Delbarton staff.

The Green Wave answered with a long touchdown pass and here came the decision...Do we chase the points now? They chose, "YES." They were wrong. BC snuffed out the attempt and now the Wave was down 2.

There was absolutely no messing around in the ensuing drive. BC struck 10 plays, 80 yards with St. Fleur, Angeli and Butler running the football down Delbarton's throat. Butler finished with his fourth touchdown of the day. As importantly, Carbonaro finished the game 4-for-4 with PATs and BC was up 28-19.

Nine points is obviously a two-score difference and psychologically must feel like having to climb Mt. Everest in just 12 minutes when facing the Crusaders in the fourth quarter. BC moves to 3-0, Delbarton 2-1 on the season.

**EXTRA POINTS:** Ryan Butler's career statistics become more impressive historically every game. Butler's 378 career carries earn the #3 overall rank out of all BC rushers behind only Joe Sandberg '02 (515) and Mike Morgan '84 (459). His 29 career TDs place him 7<sup>th</sup> overall, passing Joe DeFranco '93 (28) and NFLers Jim Finn '95 and Rich Scanlon '99 (27). His 204 career points place him at #8 on the all-time scoring list and his 2,256 yards make him BC's 8<sup>th</sup> all-time leading rusher.

QB Steve Angeli's 64.7% completion percentage currently ranks #2 all-time behind only Michael Halligan '10 (68.2%). Steve is currently #10 all-time with passing attempts.

**September 18 – Woodland Park, NJ** – The Crusader Cross-Country Team continues to improve under the leadership of Coach Powers. Junior Tom Rogers once again led BC in his first year of running, posting a time of 17:57 in the 5000m Race. Rogers finished 14th overall in a field of 97 runners. Alex Shaia placed 34<sup>th</sup>, finishing one minute and one second behind Rogers.

Joe Griffith (44<sup>th</sup> – 19:15) finished a second ahead of teammate Nick Pesanello (45<sup>th</sup> – 19:16) and they were followed by James Hughes (53<sup>rd</sup> – 19:35) who also broke the 20-minute mark at Garrett Mountain. Elias Garcia (68<sup>th</sup> – 20:07) and Miles Suitt (70<sup>th</sup> – 10:38) also finished for the Crusaders who placed 7<sup>th</sup> overall (184 points – 19:00 average time) as a team, out of a field of 13. The first-through-fifth runner split for BC was fourth best among all teams at 1:38.

Hunterdon County's North Hunterdon Regional High School won the event with a score of 47 points and average runner time of 17:38. Bergen County opponents in the race included Ridgewood (3<sup>rd</sup> – 84 pts, 18:04), Northern Highlands (4<sup>th</sup> – 136 pts, 18:36), Hackensack (5<sup>th</sup> – 151 pts, 18:33), Ramapo (11<sup>th</sup> – 277 pts, 19:54 avg) and Teaneck (13<sup>th</sup> – 365 pts, 22:30).

## JV-B BOYS 5000 METER RUN

Matthew Marques led the Crusaders, finishing 9<sup>th</sup> place overall in the one-hundred-ten runner field. His time of 19:41 was forty-two seconds off the lead. William Micholas finished 30<sup>th</sup> overall, recording a time of 21:10. Also finishing for BC were Matthew Geraghty (79<sup>th</sup> – 24:30), Jackson Vonderhorst (87<sup>th</sup> – 26:06), Ronan Flynn (31:29) and John Gallagher (31:43).

As a team, the Crusaders placed 10<sup>th</sup> in the field of 12, scoring 234 points, with an average runner time of 24:35. The first runner through fifth runner split for BC was 11:48.

## FROSH RUN STRONG IN THE BOYS 3200m RUN

Rhyse Ruffy continued a strong freshman campaign, once again leading BC by finishing 7<sup>th</sup> on Saturday. His time of 12:30 was just 38 seconds off first place in the field of 47 runners. Bergen Catholic is showing a very strong class as Daniel Calianese (11<sup>th</sup> – 12:51.00), Andrew Byrnes (21<sup>st</sup> – 13:48.00), William Ryan (24<sup>th</sup> – 14:15), Avery Drapkin (25<sup>th</sup> – 14:17.00), William Saracino (26<sup>th</sup> – 14:18.00) and Alexander Georgiou (31<sup>st</sup> – 14:44.00) all finished within 2:14 of one another with a 13:32 per runner average. The 1-5 runner split was 1:47, helping them to run strong as a unit.

# ***BIRDS OF THE WEEK***

## ***LITTLE BLUE HERON - SNOWY EGRET***



**September 5 - Lyndhurst, NJ** - I know. I know. Neither of these birds are blue. So why is one called a Little Blue Heron (LBHE)? Actually, the bird on the right will be turning blue in the coming year and some of its under feathers in the tail have actually started showing color. First year LBHE's present as white birds and can be difficult to distinguish from Snowy Egrets (LEFT), which are similar in size. There are a couple of distinct differences between the two, though. Little Blues are "stand and wait" foragers. While in the water, they patiently wait for prey to swim nearby so they can strike with their dagger-like bills. Unlike Egrets, they have duller colored legs and feet. LBHEs have two-colored bills, and their lores (area between bill and eyes) is typically a pinkish color.

Snowy Egrets (SNEG) have a Black Bill which is thinner than the LBHE. The lores between its bill and eyes are bright yellow. You can notice SNEGs using more of a "stir it up" approach. The bird on the left has bright yellow feet that it uses to stir up small fish, frogs and the like as they move quickly around in the water.
