HALL OF FAME INDUCTEES

2002-03 STATE CHAMPION ICE HOCKEY INDUCTED INTO NJHSIH HALL!



September 26 - West Orange, NJ - The state's top Hockey Team in 2002-03 got a just reward, earning entrance into the New Jersey High School Ice Hockey Hall of Fame on Sunday night. Current Head Coach, Tom Keough was a member of that team and proud to share the news of his brothers and he.

The Crusaders won the "Triple Crown" of NJHS Ice Hockey, taking the Gordon Cup, Parochial and Tournament of Champions trophies. BC was 21-1-2, scoring 137 goals and yielding only 39 on the season.

JV Soccer Remains Undefeated, Untied



5 GRIDDERS CROSS GOAL LINE AS CRUSADERS DEVOUR LIONS

October 2 - Oradell, NJ - The Crusaders improved to 5-0 on the 2021 season as five different players scored

touchdowns. This week's victim, Pope John XXIII's Lions Football Team.

Santino Correa started the BC scoring barrage with a 55-yard TD reception from QB Steve Angeli. Giancarlo Carbonaro drove his first of five extra-points through the uprights and BC was in business.

EXTRA POINTS: Ryan Butler's career statistics become more impressive historically every game. Butler's 394 career carries earn the #3 overall rank out of all BC rushers behind only Joe Sandberg '02 (515) and Mike Morgan '84 (459). His 2,319 yards helped him pass former NY Giants Fullback, Jimmy Finn at #7 on the all-time rushing list.

QB Steve Angeli is nearing the 1000-yard mark on the season with 944 through 5 games. He is completing an outrageous 78.5% of his passes for an average gain of more than 15 yards per completion. Steve is currently #10 all-time with passing attempts at 216.

The shutout was #149 in school history and the first time BC recorded back-to-back shutouts since 2007 when the Crusaders shut out Paramus Catholic (50-0) and Bloomfield (31-0) in succession.

Frosh Football Remains Undefeated

October 2 - Sparta, NJ - The youngest group of Crusaders took the gridiron on a perfect autumn Saturday morning in Sussex County. Like the weather, the team moved the ball perfectly on its opening drive until the drive stalled on fourth down at the Lions 14 yard line.

After forcing Pope John XXIII to punt from their own endzone, the Crusaders once again were stymied at the 14.

Defensively, BC remained perfect and forced a punt after three plays. The ball took a strange bounce and hit the BC returner. Pope John XXIII recovered giving them possession at midfield. The Lions took a shot with the deep ball on first down and completed it, setting up a first and goal. They scored three plays later and kicked the extra point, providing for a 7-0 lead.



That was the wake-up call for BC. Muhajid Russel took a Dominic Campanile screen pass 32 yards into the endzone and the Crusaders were on the scoreboard. After a failed PAT, the Crusaders were down 7-6.



The next time BC had the ball, Quincy Porter made an incredible block, springing slot back Anthony Perrotti for a long gainer. Perrotti finished off the drive, making a great catch

of a Campanile pass on a corner route. The PAT failed and BC led 12-7 at half.

BC held for a three and out and four plays later, Campanile found Porter on a fade route, good for 6. The frosh started attempting kicks as their points after touchdowns and Guytano Bartolomeo booted the point.



Two plays later, linebacker Danny Gilmore snuffed out a screen pass and intercepted. Reid sprinted into the end zone, Bartolomeo kicked the PAT and BC led 26-7.



The scoring for the game came on Pope John's next possession. Naiim Parrish intercepted a pass near the BC sideline at the 32 and returned it 68 yards for a touchdown. Bartolomeo's PAT was good and BC completed its 33-7 victory.

XC RUNS AT STATE'S LARGEST INVITATIONAL

October 2 - Holmdell, NJ - Tom Rogers once again led BC finishing 14th overall with a time of 17:29 in a field of 170 runners at the New Balance Shore Conference Invitational. Alex Shaia placed 33rd, finishing with an 18:17. James Hughes (18:56), Joe Griffith (19:37), Nick Pesanello (19:38), Elias Garcia (19:39) and Miles Suitt (19:49) all scored for BC.

The Crusaders finished 11th overall in the event.

JVXC AT BRETT TAYLOR INVITATIONAL

October 2 - Mahwah, NJ - William Micholas excelled for the Crusaders, finishing second overall with a very solid time of 18:50. Other Crusaders running in the 171 runner field were: Jackson Vonderhorst (24:06), *Matthew Geraghty* (67th - 25:41), John Gallagher (28:40) and Ronan Flynn (28:53) and all ran strong for the JV harriers.

FROSH STRONG AT BRETT TAYLOR INVITE



The Knights jumped on top in the opening minutes of the match, but were unable to build on the lead. They went into halftime with a 1-0 lead and BC's defense was playing strong.

BIRD OF THE WEEK

BLACK-THROATED BLUE WARBLER



October 3 – Rockleigh, NJ – A little bigger than a hummingbird, wood warblers are the “jewels” of the birding world. Their 4.5” – 6” size makes them an interesting find and there is a great variety about them, all with unique vocalizations, coloring and behaviors.

Talking with a young birder a week or two ago, he said that this specie, the Black-throated Blue Warbler, often like to stop and feast in a series of berry trees at the State Line Lookout as they migrate south during the first weekend of October. I’m glad I could ensure he wasn’t a liar. I first caught a glimpse of this guy, exactly where we were discussing he might be.

This is a male bird and well-marked. Males and female BTBW’s actually look so different, they were actually originally classified as two totally different species. Fall often can be a difficult time of year to identify warblers as they are not really singing (aka trying to impress a female) and at times, their coloring can be dull or different. Again, because they are more interested in moving than mating.

Black-throated blues breed in the east and winter in the Caribbean. They thoroughly enjoy insects, especially many that are covered by sap in the Dominican Republic...a sweet treat for a cool little bird.
