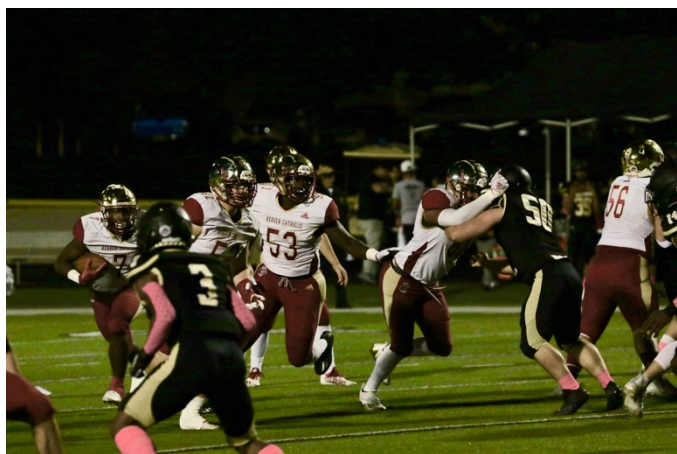
### CRUSADERS PUMMEL

### PALADINS 63-0

**Seven Rushing Touchdowns and 2 Defensive Scores Help Nation's #6 Team Roll!**



**October 8 - Paramus, NJ** - The Crusaders were kind in controlling the score on Friday night. It was a game the nation's #6 team could have posted almost any score, but instead chose to build confidence and provide opportunity for a number of players who had a chance to show just how talented they are.



Jack Duffy proved capable of relieving ND-bound starter, Steve Angeli, by leading BC down the field quickly and efficiently for a touchdown within two and a half minutes. It was time for Saeed St.Fleur (9 car, 71 yds, 3 TDs) to get to work. St.Fleur scored the first of BC's seven rushing touchdowns from the 5.

The Paladins demonstrated a bright spot as their kick return team gave them reasonable field position. Unfortunately, the Paladins' next decision was a poor one.



Choosing to pass on first down, the pass protection that was executed did not block one player... DJ Samuels. That was not good for the PC

quarterback. Samuels levelled him with a hit that was frankly, one of the loudest and hardest hits in a number of years. The ball was instantly fumbled and linebacker, John Fiore tracked it down and scooped it in stride. Fiore sprinted down the middle of the field and gave Carbonaro a chance to nail down his second PAT of the night and BC quickly led 14-0.



St. Fleur would rack up two more touchdowns in the quarter, sandwiching a run by Kaj Sanders (7 carries, 81 yards) of 7 yards and his first TD of the season.

Justan Luzzi was the back of record in the second quarter, showing his tremendous speed with a 52-yard carry and



ultimately scoring on a 4-yard burst. Luzzi finished with 3 carries and 60 yards.

Once again, Chris Mimmo got the stadium excited, scoring a touchdown on a 34-yard interception return in his zip code.



BC's Offensive line was awesome, creating huge holes and protecting their QBs to perfection. Quentin Lane, PJ Bonistalli, Dominick Brogna, Joe Malone and Dylan Garrity once again showed the value of hard work, done with expectation of no glory but that for the team.

The second half was a running clock, due to the fact BC was up more than 35 points (49 to be exact). Jaiden Estrella has

been showing tremendous potential in the JV games throughout the season and was able to reach paydirt in a varsity contest with a 12-yard run. He finished the evening with four carries for 43 yards. Chris Merrill scored BC's ninth touchdown, giving kicker Giancarlo Carbonaro an opportunity to go 9-for-9 on PATs. The last BC kicker to do so was



Doug Kirschner in 1998 in BC's 63-0 victory over Clifton.

Carbonaro also played a role in preserving the shutout with a TD-saving tackle on a kickoff. His years of experience with linebacking drills really paid off for this one!

Bergen got solid leadership at the quarterback position from Jack Duffy who was 5-for-6 passing for 64 yards. Freshman, Dominic Campanile was just as efficient, completing all six of his passes for 39 yards.



## A WORD ABOUT GOOSE EGGS

The Crusaders shutout of Paramus Catholic marked the 150<sup>th</sup> shutout in school history. Ten percent of those came against

the Paladins as Friday night marked #15. The back-to-back-to-back shutouts marks the first time BC shutout three consecutive opponents since North Jersey's "Team of the Century" in 1998. Those Crusaders streak included blanks against Paterson Kennedy 55-0, Barringer (Newark) 61-0 and Bishop Ahr 41-0 in the first round of the NJSIAA Non-Public 4 Tournament. The last "milestone" shutout was #100 at home vs. Don Bosco Prep 54-0 in 1991.

BC's 63 points tied for third most in school history. Everyone remembers the 76-0 victory over SJR in the schools' inaugural meeting in 1965. In 2010, the Crusaders scored 65 points vs. Red Bank Catholic in the state quarterfinals (one week before the Crusaders would score 60 against Seton Hall Prep). # ***BIRD OF THE WEEK***

## ***WHITE-RUMPED SANDPIPER #206***

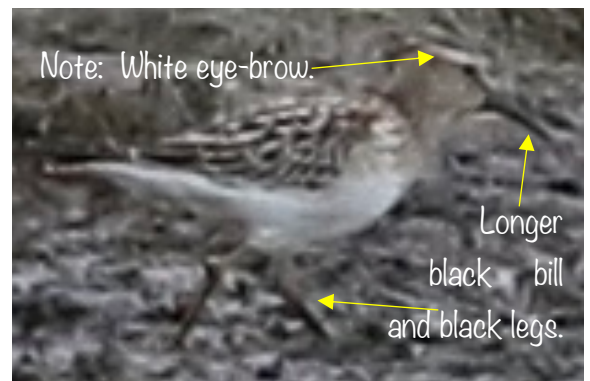
**October 8 - Allendale, NJ** - "You know, you should really be at the Celery Farm," a man said to me as I meandered around Crestwood Lake in Allendale this weekend. "That's a great place for birds."

I appreciated his help and reassured him I was fully aware of the Celery Farm, but the birds I was specifically interested in were here, not there. Birders have a pretty solid social media network. *E-Bird* and *GroupMe* are typically the most helpful with *Facebook* sharing some follow-up photos regularly. There were a number of birds that were high on my list and I was hopeful I would break my single-year Bergen County record with a visit. Target birds were **American Pipit**, **Pectoral Sandpiper** and **White-rumped Sandpiper**.

All had been seen in this swimming pond which is fully drained each fall. It's amazing that Great Blue Herons can still find plenty to eat there (guessing snakes) at this time of year. But I digress.

While you might think sandpipers are only found on the coasts, they are often found in a variety of places, especially in migration. Actually, this sandy area was perfect for these sandpipers who could dig around in the moist pond bottom for all sorts of morsels only a sandpiper could love. There were also nearly two dozen Killdeer, a Wilson's Snipe and 8 other species.

To put things in perspective regarding how many different species of birds have been observed in Bergen County this year, 261 different species are on the list. Currently, the top birder on the list in Bergen County has a 2021 county list of 247 birds identified with his most recent observation including an American Pipit, his bird #247. That person is NOT me.
