BREAD AND BUTLER

Hard-nosed football, led by a hard-nosed running back is BC's recipe for success.

October 23 - West Orange, NJ - After watching Ryan Butler running with the ball on Saturday and talking with a number of legendary Crusader alumni running backs, everyone is so proud of the heart and determination the current primary protector of the pigskin is displaying with his senior year.

Butler ran for 240 yards and three touchdowns, willing the Crusaders to victory over Seton Hall Prep on Saturday and an 8-0 start, BC's first since 1999 when the Crusaders finished 10-1 and Non-Public 4 Champions with a victory over Don Bosco Prep at Giants Stadium in the final.



The Crusaders opened Saturday's game with a solid threeand-out on defense followed by a terrific punt-return by Chris Mimmo.

That was followed by a textbook five-play, forty-four-yard opening drive for a Touchdown. Steve Angeli fired his first TD



pass to Christian Carti, who replicated his effort from a week ago, diving into the end-zone and putting the Crusaders up 6-0. Giancarlo Carbonaro continued his excellent work



driving the point after touchdown through the uprights and BC led 7-0.

Carmello Vellardo continued driving kickoffs long and deep, putting the ball into the endzone and forcing the Pirates to begin at their own 20-yard line. The Crusader defense was lights out to start and help SHP three and out, setting up punt which travelled to the BC 44-yard line.



The Crusaders began to drive again, but were stopped at the 30-yard line on fourth down when Angeli went down with an injury.

The Pirates moved the ball across midfield and punted to the Crusader 15. An illegal block in the back marked the ball back to the BC 7 yardline.

Jack Duffy took over at QB and completed a pass to Ryan Butler to convert on third down for a first down. On the next play, the Pirates intercepted and returned the ball to the Bergen 8. Three plays later and a kick and the game was tied 7-7.

The Pirates held the momentum as the second quarter began. Duffy engineered a drive from BC's 27 to the Pirate 25 with big chunks of yards coming from Ryan Butler (22-yard run) and a Logan Casey catch and run for 11.

The Crusader drive stalled, however, leading to a Pirate drive from their own 28, seventy-two yards for a touchdown and a 14-7 lead.



Angeli was able to return to the game and despite moving gingerly, Butler provided the punch, along with the offensive line to move the ball to midfield. BC was faced with a 4th and 1 at the 50 and Butler punished the Pirate defense out of a two-tight end set to move the chains. On the next play, the Pirate bubble burst. Butler found a seam in the home-team front and sprinted 48 yards for a touchdown with just 3:41 remaining in the half.

On the ensuing drive, BC's defense held and DaQuan Stewart intercepted a pass with 1:11 remaining, giving BC an ideal opportunity to go into half time with a lead. The



Crusaders were unable to capitalize late in the half and the teams exited the field.

Giancarlo Carbonaro scored the only points in the third quarter with his third field goal of the season, putting BC up 17-14. The lead lasted just until the opening seconds of the fourth-quarter as the Pirates put together a drive and regained the lead 21-17.



After a kick into the BC endzone, the Crusaders moved from the 20 to the 30 with five-yard runs from Butler and Saeed St.Fleur. Angeli executed a textbook RPO (Run-passoption), deciding on the pass option and finding Santino Correa (4 catches for 121 yards) who sprinted seventy yards for the touchdown and giving BC a 24-21 lead.



On second down of the next drive, Dom Brogna sacked the Prep QB for a six-yard loss. The play created a third and sixteen which SHP was unable to convert.

After BC had a short possession, Seton Hall showed it was a determined bunch and would not go quietly. A fifty-seven yard touchdown pass and PAT with just 6:25 remaining made the outcome appear uncertain for the Crusaders. That is before you consider how badly Ryan Butler and his teammate want to win.

Chris Mimmo returned the ensuing kickoff thirty-two yards to the 35 yard line. On first and ten, Angeli handed the ball off to Ryan Butler who bounced the ball to his left and found his way to the sideline where he sprinted 65 yards to paydirt.



Thanks to John Hund for capturing the photo of the day. As Butler outran the entire SHP team, what made the play so exceptional was #12's attempt to push Butler out of bounds. As you can see, less than 12" separate Ryan from the sideline and contact with the Pirate defender occurred around the twenty-yard line. Somehow, Butler was able to fight him off and remain moving to the endzone and finish the run that would give Bergen the lead to stay.

In watching BC football since 1982, this is one of the greatest runs I have seen. Especially when considering the situation and the effort required, Butler's day was an Athlete of the Week worthy performance without question.

BC's defense held the Pirates due to two sacks by Christian Ross on first down and Malachi Mercer on third down. SHP was forced to punt. Mimmo returned the punt twenty-five yards to the SHP 23 yardilne.

With 3:35 remaining, it was Big Cat time. Seton Hall got a face full of Butler who physically finished every run in a punishing style of running that everyone wearing must have felt on Sunday morning.

EXTRA POINTS: UNDEFEATED – The 2021 Crusaders is pursuing a championship season and the eighth undefeated and untied season in school history. The last perfect season was under the direction of Coach Fred Stengel in 1998. The Crusaders finished 12-0 and #1 in the state of New Jersey. Coach Stengel's Crusaders were undefeated twice before as well in 1991 and 1992, putting a 23-game win streak together that ended during the 1993 season. Coach Tony Karcich led BC to one undefeated season in 1982, his last season at the help of the Crusaders. He also led the Crusaders to an undefeated state championship in 1979 (10-0-1). Keith Krayer led Bergen to an undefeated, state-

champion season in 1965 and Bob Norton led BC to an undefeated season in 1966.



Ryan Butler's career statistics become more impressive historically every game. Butler's 448 career carries earn the #3 overall rank out of all BC rushers. His 2,664 yards place him #3 all time in Rushing Yards, just ahead of Wolver Jean-Pierre '05 and Justin Dunleavy '98 on the all-time list. Butler's three rushing touchdowns lifted ahead of Eric Lane '93 (former NY Giants FB) and now places him #3 all-time. Butler now has 36 rushing touchdowns in his career. Ryan is now tied for third, all-time with 246 points and 41 TDs with Wolver Jean-Pierre '05. He is currently 60 points behind Mike Morgan '84 and Joe Sandberg '03.

QB Steve Angeli added to his outstanding season, now passing for 1,278 through 8 games (he's played in 7). Angeli's 2,441 total passing yards moves him into 9th All-Time ahead of former Seattle Seahawk, Tanner McEvoy '11. Steve is 6th All-Time in completions (171) and is now 8th overall with pass attempts in a career (265). Steve has completed over three-quarters of his passes this year (72.1%) and averages 15.4 yards per completion. His current completion percentage would rank him #2 all-time behind Brad Hartung '05 and just ahead of legendary passers Mark DeRosa '93 and Matt Lovecchio '00.

Defensive Lineman, DJ Samuels, remained tied for the school's All-Time Sack Record on Saturday after being "HELD" sackless in West Orange. He is still tied with Brad Dussault at 21. Two of Dussault's classmates ranked #1, #2 and #3 in total sacks at the time of their graduation. The threesome finished off their high school careers in 2004 with 10 consecutive wins and a state championship, defeating Don Bosco Prep. The other two players? NFLers Brian Cushing '05 (19) and Jimmy Dray '05 (16). Kurt Holuba '14 was previously at #3 on All-Time sack list with (18).
