For the Ninth Time in School History, the Crusaders Finish the Regular Season 9-0!

October 30 - Jersey City, NJ - Ryan Butler, Saeed St. Fleur, a dominant offensive line and punishing defense methodically took the will out of St. Peter's Prep on Saturday afternoon at Caven Point in Jersey City. BC finished with a 21-0 victory and completed their ninth regular season in school history at 9-0. Of those nine times, BC has gone on to win 8 state championships, including two Star-Ledger Trophies in 1982 and 1998.

It was the first time in school history that BC posted a shutout at Caven Point and the first road win vs. the Marauders at Cochrane Field since October 28, 2011. As a matter of fact, despite having a 14-13 overall record against the Prep, BC had only won 4 of 12 games in the shadows of Lady Liberty, dating back to 1973.

Now to the game. It was a relentless assault on the home team with BC pounding the ball for 215 yards on the ground. Ryan Butler carried the ball 27 times for 169 yards (7.3 yards per carry, 2 TDs) and Saeed St.Fleur carried 8 times for 59 yards (7.4 yards per carry, 1 TD) over the four quarters.

BC got on the board first thanks to a first quarter, 32-yard run by St.Fleur. Giancarlo Carbonaro, who was 3 for 3 in PATs,

drove through his first of the day and BC led 7-0. Field position did not favor the Crusaders through much of the remainder of the quarter.

As the second half began, BC fielded the ball at the yard line on the opening kickoff and was in a precarious position to start. QB Steve Angeli found TE Jack Comeau, who got BC out of a major hole with a catch and 16-yard run to move the ball out to the 21-yard line. Richie Reid had a very good day punting and got the Crusaders out of a hole, moving SPP back to midfield.

After the BC defense held, the Marauders punted and Chris Mimmo demonstrated why he should be a fighter pilot or neurosurgeon or professional poker player...I'm really not sure. I just know the guy's got remarkable courage. Knowing that if he let the ball roll, BC would be backed up again, he caught a low, fluttering punt on the run moving to his right. While he only advanced the ball 5 yards, it helped BC avoid being backed up inside their own 5 again.

Butler got the Crusaders going at that point, with a 20 yard run down the right sideline. After a short completion from Angeli to Justan Luzzi, Butler and Saeed St.Fleur ran the ball down the Marauder's throats, leading to silver frustration and a 15-yard unsportsmanlike conduct penalty against the hosts.

Three plays later, Butler rumbled nine yards into the endzone and after the Carbonaro PAT, BC led 14-0.



Some exceptional defensive play helped to keep the Marauders out of the endzone. First of all, Malachi Mercer was ALL OVER THE FIELD, recording a season-high 16 tackles. While he, John Fiore, AJ Morris and Sydir Mitchell all had good days, some critical plays were made by everyone on the defense.

Gerry Crum made a critical tackle on fourth and two, as the Prep was threatening in the waning seconds of the first half. The tackle was a back breaker for SPP who settled for a 7-0 deficit going into the locker room.

DaQuan Stewart showed off his great speed and great heart after the receiver he was covering broke loose and caught a pass, sprinting 48 yards toward the Crusader goal line. Stewart never quit on the play and ran down the Prep ball-carrier, tackling him and giving the defense the opportunity to shut the door on SPP midway through the third quarter.

Butler would go on to score his 16th rushing touchdown on the season, an eleven yard run, allowing BC's faithful to get into some of their favorte chants..." If you're winning an you know it..." and "Nah, Nah, Nah, Nah..."

EXTRA POINTS: UNDEFEATED – 2021 marks the 9th time, BC went undefeated and untied during the regular season and the first time this millennium (1965, 66, 82, 91, 92, 94, 97 and 98). The 2021 Crusaders is pursuing a championship season and the seventh undefeated and untied season in school history. The last perfect season was under the direction of Coach Fred Stengel in 1998. The Crusaders finished 12-0 and #1 in the state of New Jersey. Coach Stengel's Crusaders were undefeated twice before as well in 1991 and 1992, putting a 23-game win streak together that ended during the 1993 season. Coach Tony Karcich led BC to one undefeated season in 1982, his last season at the help of the Crusaders. He also led the Crusaders to an undefeated state championship in 1979 (10-0-1). Keith Krayer led Bergen to an undefeated, state-champion season in 1965 and Bob Norton led BC to an undefeated season in 1966.

Ryan Butler's career statistics become more impressive historically every game. Butler's 475 career carries earn the #2 overall rank out of all BC rushers. His 2,833 yards place him #3 all time in Rushing Yards, just ahead of Wolver Jean-Pierre '05 and Justin Dunleavy '98 on the all-time list. Butler's three rushing touchdowns lifted ahead of Eric Lane '93 (former NY Giants FB) and now places him #3 all-time. Butler now has 36 rushing touchdowns in his career. Ryan is now sole place of third all-time with 258 points and 43 TDs ahead of Wolver Jean-Pierre '05. He is currently 48 points behind Mike Morgan '84 and 68 points behind #1 Joe Sandberg '03.

QB Steve Angeli added to his outstanding season, now passing for 1,227 through 9 games (he's played in 8). Angeli's 2,441 total passing yards moves him into 9th All-Time ahead of former Seattle Seahawk, Tanner McEvoy '11. Steve is 6th All-Time in completions (177) and is now 7th overall with pass attempts in a career (275). Steve has completed over three-quarters of his passes this year (72.1%) and averages 15.4 yards per completion. His current completion percentage would rank him #2 all-time behind Brad Hartung '05 and just ahead of legendary passers Mark DeRosa '93 and Matt Lovecchio '00.

Defensive Lineman, DJ Samuels, remained tied for the school's All-Time Sack Record on Saturday after being "HELD" sackless in St. Peter's Prep. He is still tied with Brad Dussault at 21. Two of Dussault's classmates ranked #1, #2 and #3 in total sacks at the time of their graduation. The threesome finished off their high school careers in 2004 with 10 consecutive wins and a state championship, defeating Don Bosco Prep. The other two players? NFLers Brian Cushing '05 (19) and Jimmy Dray '05 (16). Kurt Holuba '14 was previously at #3 on All-Time sack list with (18).



October 31 - Oradell, NJ - Coach Vito Campanile's Bergen Catholic Crusader Football Team has earned the #1 seed in the 2021 NJSIAA Non-Public "A" Tournament.

The Crusaders have a first round bye and will face the winner of Donovan Catholic and Notre Dame in the Quarterfinal Round of the Tournament at The Jack on November 13, 2021 at 1:00 pm.

JV Soccer Hosts Northern Valley Demarest in Counties

October 27 - Oradell, NJ - The Crusaders faced off against the Northern Valley Regional High School @ Demarest on Wednesday afternoon at the Jack. The game was the first



meeting of the two schools and represented some top play in Bergen County at the JV level.

BC generated three very good scoring opportunities in the opening 10 minutes, first with a nice crosser which translated into a 5-yard shot that was saved. The second was a feed inside that Dan Dictenberg lofted from about 7 yards, just inches above the crossbar and then Donovan Reid found Justin Botta cutting on a fast break and gave him an opportunity for a 30-yard shot that sailed just wide right of the net.

Gabe Tinoco was holding up his end of the bargain in the goal, turning away two shots in that same time frame. In the twenty-three-minute mark, the Norseman rang a piper off a point-blank range shot that Tinoco tipped. Nick Angeli and Kevin Schliem were filling in passing lanes as the Crusaders played without Nikholas Torres for a part of the first period, due to an injury.

A late whistle set up a free kick from the 27-yard line and Liam Chin, Dylan Makino, Schliem and Angeli set up in a wall and provided enough distraction that the kicker's shot sailed past the endline.



Seconds later off a Tinoco restart kick, BC pushed the ball down the middle of the field. It wound up in the sure feet of Botta who drove the ball in the net for the opening score of the game in the 19-minute mark.




With 18 minutes remaining, BC created another great scoring opportunity off a selfless header from Donovan Reid to Andrew Lama. Lama generated a shot that seemed to miss the mark as he appeared to be fouled. It was a call that wasn't made and the score remained 1-0.



BC really started putting on the pressure, creating multiple corner kicks in the next few moments, but the Norseman keeper was sharp and turned away some great opportunities.

It seemed the visiting squad was using a different type of communication throughout the game which the Crusaders did not seem accustomed to. It seemed to be some type of Norse code. Thirteen minutes into the game, however, it wasn't helping much as BC continued to press the Norse side.



As the half wound down, Kevin Schliem proved his worth, blocking shots driving 1v1 ball up an out of bounds. At the 6:30 mark, Tinoco "jumped on the grenade," covering up a shot as it was being taken right on top of him. Liam Chin did a fine job controlling the ball on the defensive end and setting up opportunities for the Crusaders to transition onto offense.

At the end of the first half, BC led 1-0.

The Crusaders came out flying in the second half with the infusion of Dino Borghi on the front line. All of a sudden, just five minutes in, Nikholas Torres found Borghi and Borghi found the back of the net much to the delight of the Crusader



faithful who sang, "DE-NO, DE-NO, DE-NO, DEEE-NOOO, DEE-NOOO!"

The brisk autumn air and stellar goal play of Gabe Tinoco kept the remaining fans stomping their feet and tooting their horns as seconds and minutes ticked away.

In the thirty-minute mark, Borghi found himself one-onone with the goalie once again. His shot just cleared the top of the crossbar, but it became clear the ships of the team from the Northern Valley were taking on water.

The defense was getting some great support from the bench in the second half as J'Niles Simpson, Harry Kim and Brandon Quirizumbay competed for every loose ball, marked



any open men and cleared the ball up the field to the forwards.

BC started playing a much more defensive style of game as the clock hit the 18-minute mark. Much of the play started taking place in the Crusaders defensive end of the field, in a way, suffocating the space Norsemen attackers had.

NVD was able to generate a great scoring opportunity with



a 1v1 following a loose ball that was pooched deep into the

Crusader end. Tinoco played the role of the gambler, coming out of the net and challenging the ball. It forced a premature shot which drifted into the corner, far away from the Crusader goal.

BC was not finished adding players to contribute. Aidan Hines stepped on the defensive end and immediately made an impact driving the ball up the bleacher-side of the field and away from danger.

Jason Lessieu worked hard in the midfield, directing the defense and challenging anything near the middle of the field.

In the 10-minute mark, Demarest once again generated a great scoring opportunity. A Norseman drove a shot that Tinoco was able to save, but not control. The rebound came right back to the shooter who once again drove the ball at the goal, but Tinoco continued to attack the ball and reduce angle on the shooter, preserving 2-0 lead.

In the end, there's no question the Norsemen showed they belonged in the County Quarterfinals. They were a good team that never quit and was generating quality scoring opportunities right to the end of the game. This day was about Tinoco and the depth of the Crusaders. Ultimately, BC just had too many horses and advanced to the semifinals with a shutout.

Ramapo HS in the BCCA Quarterfinal Round 3-0 represented a solid effort, though none of the players, nor coaches were hoping for this outcome.


