WRESTLERS BRING HOME 14TH CROWN

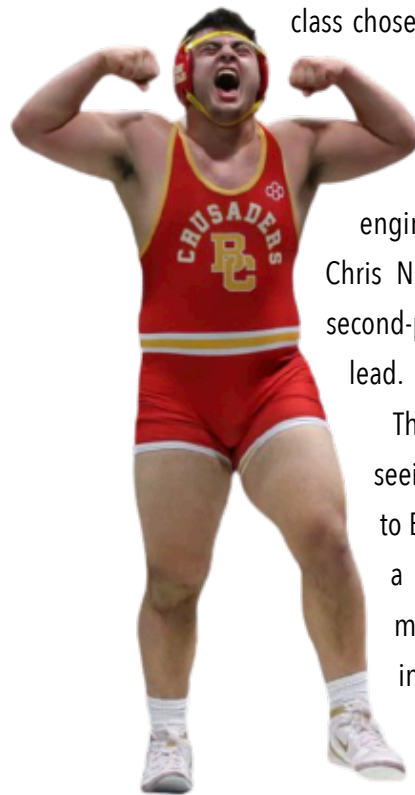
Crusader WRESTLING

February 13 - Franklin, NJ - The 9th in 10 seasons and 14th overall, the Crusaders are Non-Public "A" State Champions in Wrestling. This year, BC defeated the Colts from Christian Brothers Academy to earn the honor. The Colts won their first ever South Sectional Title on Friday night and brought their state #6 ranking into Sunday morning's title match.

In case you were wondering, each match starts at a weight class chosen randomly. Sunday's final started at the 106 pound weight class where BC started the Crusaders engine with a major decision. Chris Nucifora followed up with a second-period pin, giving BC a 10-0 lead.



The Colts had no intention of seeing a repeat their 51-12 loss to BC in the regular season and a number of adjustments made the championship a very interesting match. After duplicating BC's major decision and pin in the 120 and 126 pound weight classes, the Colts were hoping to

keep the momentum rolling. Ryan Ford disagreed. He earned a pin at the 1:05 mark for BC giving BC a lead they would not relinquish.

Despite a loss at 138 pounds between #1 ranked Joe Cangro and his #2 ranked opponent, Christopher Bacchioni, August Hibbler grew BC's lead to 10. Justin Onello won a 4-2 bout at 165 pounds and Remy Brancato and AJ Fricchione earned decisions before Dom Brogna slammed the barn door closed on the Colts with a pin at just 0:15 into the match.

2022 NPA NORTH #22 '22 SECTIONAL WRESTLING CHAMPIONS

February 11 - Morristown, NJ - The Crusaders won in dramatic fashion on Friday night as fans watched from as SRO Delbarton Gym and on the live stream on Local Live. The final score officially was 24-23, but the final point required about 15 minutes to determine.



This match lived up to what you would expect from the #1 and #2 teams in New Jersey. Every point was well earned. No bout ended by pin or technical fall and the only four bonus points of the match came by way of four major decisions (two on either team).

BC opened with three wins, including two major decisions by Remy Brancato and Dominick Brogna. Those bonus points would prove to be incredible significant as the match unfolded. Brian Melamud gave BC an 11-0 lead, but the win streak was snapped at 113 pounds.

Noah Kochman and Aidan Wallace each earned victories and BC led 17-3. Ryan Ford lost an incredibly hard-fought battle 1-0, but Joe Cangro was there at 138-pounds to prevent the Green Wave from gaining any momentum. BC led 20-6.

At this point, things began to look bleak for BC as Delbarton went on a 5 bout run, including a pair of major decisions. The Green Wave ultimately took the lead 23-20 heading into the final bout of the evening.



Enter AJ Fricchione. In his most significant bout as a Crusader, the 190-pounder came through in the clutch, winning by decision 11-5. It actually appeared as if he had his opponent pinned, but alas, the only people on the mat who needed to see it did not.

TIE BREAKER PROCEDURE

- ~~a. The team whose opposing wrestlers or team personnel has been penalized the greater number of team points for flagrant misconduct or unsportsmanlike conduct shall be declared the winner~~
- ~~b. The team whose opposing head coach has been penalized the greater number of team points for coach misconduct shall be declared the winner~~
- ~~c. The team whose opposing wrestlers has been penalized the greater number of match points for coach misconduct during a match shall be declared the winner.~~
- ~~d. The team who won the greater number of bouts (including forfeits) shall be declared the winner~~
- ~~e. The team who accumulated the greater number of falls, defaults, forfeits and disqualifications shall be declared the winner.~~
- ~~f. The team giving up the least number of forfeits.~~
- ~~g. The team having the greater number of technical falls shall be declared the winner.~~
- ~~h. The team having the greater number of major decisions shall be declared the winner.~~
- ~~i. The team having the greater number (total match points) of first point(s) scored shall be declared the winner.~~
- j. The team having the greater number of points for near falls shall be declared the winner.**
- ~~k. The team having the greater number of takedowns shall be declared the winner.~~
- ~~l. The team having the greater number of reversals shall be declared the winner.~~
- ~~m. The team having the greater number of escapes shall be declared the winner.~~
- ~~n. The team whose opponent has been penalized the greater number of points for stalling shall be declared the winner.~~
- ~~o. The team whose opponent has been warned the more often for stalling shall be declared the winner.~~
- ~~p. The team whose opponent has the greater number of penalized for all other infractions (i.e. false starts) shall be declared the winner.~~
- ~~q. If none of the above resolves the tie, a flip of a disk will determine the winner.~~

Upon determining the winning team by the criteria system, a single team point shall be added to the prevailing team.

BIRDS OF THE WEEK

SHORE BIRDS AND SEA DUCKS



February 12 - Barnegat Light, NJ - So I'm talking to my mom, Kathy, about the "regular backyard birds" that my father wanted to see in our BOTW and she, of course, said, "Well I really like the more exotic birds." Hey Mom, so do I. But I like them all, but I definitely like the ones you don't see all the time, so this week is for Mom.

Brother Fagan and I travelled to Barnegat Light State Park on Long Beach Island on Saturday and had a terrific day. While we were hoping to see two "Lifers" (a Life Bird is a bird you identify/encounter for the first time in your life), we were happy with what we saw. (Oh, the birds we missed were a Thick-billed Murre and a female King Eider). There was a Razorbill that was spotted, but we missed as well. So, what did we see???

Well, Mom, I'm not sure they are all the most exotic of species, but there are probably a number that you (and our friends who read this column). And they are not the kind of birds you go to the rain forest for, most are a northern birds that settle down on the Jersey Shore for more reasonable weather and conditions to find food...it's always about food. So clockwise, starting at 11:00, we have a flock of Brant. These are like smaller versions of the Canada Goose and they can motor. I bet you'll never guess where the 12:00 duck got its name. Actually, the duck was known as an "Oldsquaw" back in the day. The name was changed for obvious reasons.

Herring Gulls are large, pale-eyed gulls. They are not afraid to compete for food with others. We were happy to see this White-winged Scoter, one of three scoters (Black Scoter, Surf Scoter) that frequent the Jersey Shores in winter. Among the rocks were three different sandpiper type birds, the Ruddy Turnstone, Purple Sandpiper and Sanderling. Northern Gannett is one of my favorite birds. These extremely LARGE birds flash a bright white when you see them off at a distance above the horizon. When you catch a glimpse of them in groups, they are often diving to the sea like missiles, fishing and diving as deep as 60' below the surface. Harlequin Ducks are often a reason to go down to LBI. You are guaranteed to see them on the jetty, the trick is walking out far enough. Lastly pictured in the center is this Common Loon in winter plumage. This one had a nice crab meal as we watched him.
