### CRUSADERS ADVANCE TO TOC

### SEMI VS ROSELLE CATHOLIC

**March 15 - Toms River, NJ** - The 2022 Basketball Season continued on Tuesday night with the Crusaders earning a 17 point win over Woodrow Wilson High School of Camden. BC has now won 7 games in a row dating back to February 19<sup>th</sup> when the streak started on a 77-69 victory over Ramapo in the BCCA Jamboree Semifinals at Hackensack High School.



As is the case at this part of the season, all teams are ready to play. The Tigers were able to give BC a solid run in the first quarter, but the guard play of Will Richardson (27 points, 4 rebounds, 5 assists, 3 steals) and Julian Brown (19 points, 3 rebounds, 3 assists, 1 block and 1 steal) were the difference in the Crusaders separating to a 30-17 lead at the half.

Bergen extended the lead to 21 after three quarters and cruised to the finish line with eyes set on a rematch with Roselle Catholic.

BC held a tremendous height advantage in the game with Terry Copeland (8 points, 7 rebounds) and Brandon Benjamin (4 points and 8 rebounds), but BC did not depend on the scoring from the twin tower sophomores as much as they normally do.



Elias Espinosa continued with his deadly outside shooting and consistent defensive play. Throughout the streak, and the season for that matter, his points seem to be many of the most timely and necessary in terms of maintaining and gaining momentum for BC.

Jalen Robinson had a big night for the Crusaders knocking down 6 points and grabbing three boards. Along with Elijah Flournoy, David Munro and Austin Spencer, the Crusaders continue to show the depth of their roster as they contribute key minutes throughout the games.



BC is fortunate to have a solid group of senior leaders to come off the bench in Gianluca Phelan, Austin Sargenti and Alex Wohlrab. All three have made this team a strong one and provided a glimpse into leadership required for players like Tyler McQuaid who saw some minutes on Tuesday as well.

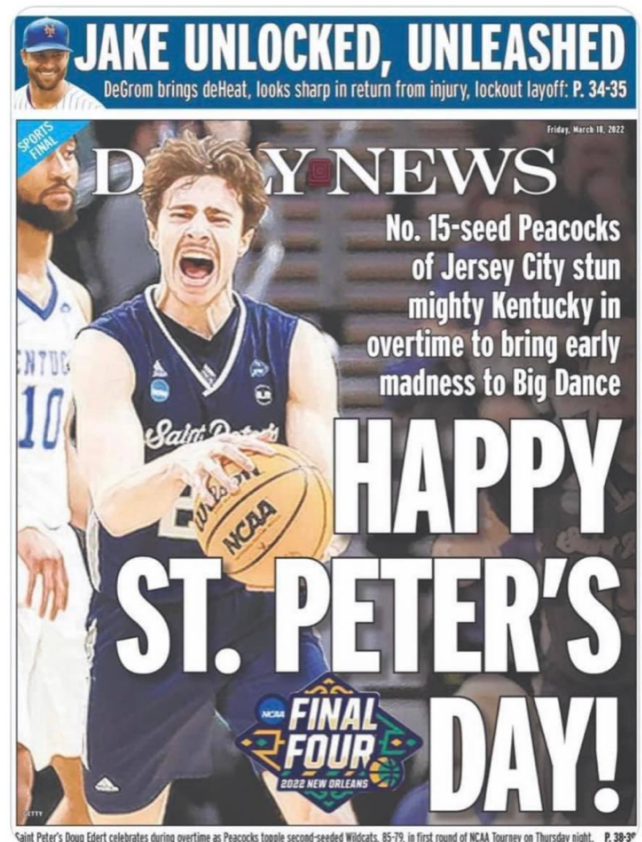

**March 17 - Indianapolis, IN** - Doug Edert played a major role in lifting the Peacocks of St. Peter's University (Jersey City) to its first ever NCAA Tournament victory, 85-79 over #2 seeded Kentucky in the first round of the 2022 NCAA Basketball Tournament.

Edert scored 20 points which included 2 for 2 shooting from three-point range and 8 for 8 shooting from the free-throw line. He and his current teammates tip it off against Murray State at 7:45 pm on Saturday, March 19, 2022 on CBS. Don't just look for Edert if you're watching, though.

You might just see the Peacock's Director of Player Development/Recruiting Coordinator, Morgan Williams, a BC Alum, urging on the team from the bench!



Doug was a 1,000 point scorer while at Bergen Catholic teaming-up with future 1,000 point scorers Zach Freemantle '19, Matt Zona '20 and Will Richardson '22 to the 2019 Non-Public "A" State

Championship and a run to reach the finals in the 2019 Tournament of Champions.

Zona is currently playing with Notre Dame. The Irish defeated Rutgers at the buzzer in the play-in round and then upset Alabama on Saturday night. ND faces Texas Tech at 7:10 pm on TBS on Sunday, March 20.

Freemantle is currently contributing at Xavier. Xaview knocked off Cleveland State in their first round game on Tuesday and will play Florida on Sunday on ESPN at 1:00pm.

Let's not forget Gabe Stefanini. After completing his studies at Columbia (and losing basketball seasons to Covid-19), Gabe helped San Francisco earn a bid to the NCAA Tournament as well.

**SURIANO WINS 2<sup>ND</sup> NCAA TITLE, GRIFFITH  
TAKES SILVER AS 6 CRUSADERS COMPETE**

**March 17-19 - Detroit, MI - March 17-19, Detroit Michigan**

—Of all the schools in the country, only Blair Academy (NJ) has more wrestlers (7) than BC's six qualifying for the NCAA Division I Wrestling Tournament this year. Two of Bergen's best, Shane

Griffith and Nick Suriano look to add their second NCAA Championship to their resumes and have won to reach the finals.



**125 POUNDS: NICK SURIANO (20-0) - #1 SEED** - Suriano

dismissed all five of his opponents in order to win his second NCAA Title in three years. Nick became the first wrestler to win NCAA Titles for two different Big10 Schools (Rutgers and now University of Michigan). Nick was the first wrestler in Rutgers University history to win a National Championship, which he did in 2020. In his high school days, Nick was simply awesome going an unprecedented 159-0 in his four year career for the Crusaders. Individually, Nick won four Beasts of the East, four County's, four Districts, Regionals and State Championships, but in addition his teams won four state championship and one national championship. Congratulations to BC's All-Time Winningest Wrestler.

**165 POUNDS: SHANE GRIFFITH (20-4) - #4 SEED**

— Griffith won his opening bout by Technical Fall and continued to defeat his three subsequent opponents en-route to the final. Leading most of the way, Shane lost by decision in the finals, earning a silver medal for the Cardinal. In over 100 years of Cardinal Wrestling, Shane became Stanford University's First-Ever-National Champion. The school was on the verge of cancelling the program, but Griffith's victory was so inspiring to Stanford Alumni, they raised in the 10's of millions of dollars to endow the program which is giving Shane this opportunity this year.

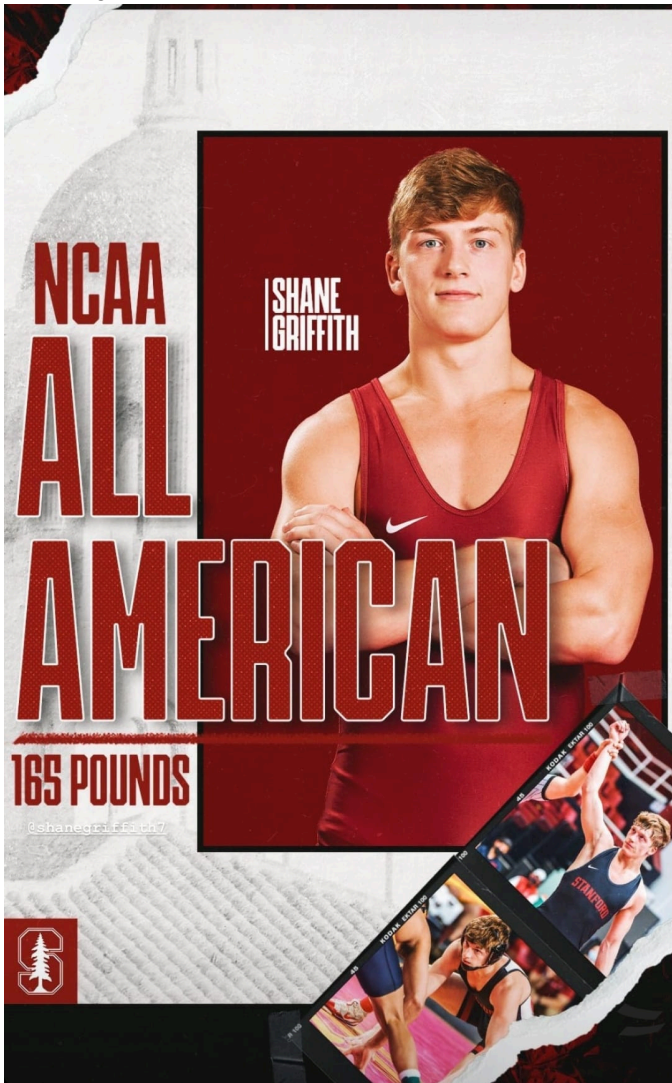
**141 POUNDS: JOE ZARGO and DYLAN CEDENO** - Zargo (Wisconsin) earned his first tournament win after losing his opening bout. He was eliminate in the second round of the



Consolation Bracket. Cedeno (Virginia) was unable to win a bout in Detroit.

**174 POUNDS: CHRIS FOCA** – Foca (Cornell) lost by decision in his opening bout, but earned his first tournament PIN in the consols. He lost a decision in the subsequent bout.

**197 POUNDS: JACOB CARDENAS** – Cardenas (Cornell) lost his opening bout, but earned a MAJOR DECISION in his first wrestle-back. He was eliminate via sudden victory in the following round.

# BIRD OF THE WEEK

## THE INDIAN PEAFOWL

*Pavo cristatus*



**March 20 - Hillsdale, NJ** - Considering the drab, winter coloration of Jersey's state bird, the Eastern Goldfinch for this week's BOTW, I paused. Nope. THIS WEEK, that is not NJ's state bird. The state bird according to me is officially the PEACOCK (at least for just this week). I bet I could get a certain doctor, lawyer, a couple of classmates, a politician, a couple of "Run-Baby-Run" Teammates and now famous college basketball player to sign the petition. (They're all BC guys.)

But I can't really do it if I don't have a photo, can I?

NO.

Think.

Think.

I know I have one. I think it was when I was chasing those Black-bellied whistling ducks in Salem County, NJ. When was that? Thank God for E-bird! Ah... life bird #294, July 27, 2015. There they are. OK, now to my iPhoto Account. Only 88,000 photos to peruse...that job just got much easier. VOILA!

There is A LOT of pasture in that southwestern part of the state. Actually A LOT of NOTHING in that southwestern part of the state. This was going to be a bad trip (6 hours driving round trip) if these ducks weren't there. Thankfully, I saw this peacock in the middle of a field.

I know what you're wondering. No, I did not count it. This was clearly someone's bird, kept as a farm pet. So I took the picture and I'm glad I could share it.

As an alumnus of St. Peter's, watching Doug Edert and Morgan Williams and the team succeed has been a joy. It reminds me how lucky I am that my mom encouraged me (actually she drove me down to Glenwood Ave and Kennedy Boulevard in Jersey City) to register for classes. Had she not done that, my life would never have been as full as it has been. Thanks Mom.

By the way, I did see the black-bellied whistling ducks. I guess I have an idea for next week's bird now.

In 1758, Carl Linneaus assigned to the Indian peafowl the technical name of *Pavo cristatus* (means "crested peafowl" in classical Latin) in his work **Systema Naturae**.

The earliest usage of the word in written English is from around 1300 and spelling variants include pecok, pekok, peacocke and peacock among others. The current spelling was established in the late 17th century. Geoffrey Chaucer (1343-1400) used the word to refer to a proud and ostentatious person in his simile "*proud a pekok*" in *Troilus and Criseyde* (Book I, line 210).

The Greek word for peacock was *taos* and was related to the Persian "tavus" (as in *Takht-i-Tâvus* for the famed Peacock Throne). The Ancient Hebrew word *tuki* (plural *tukkiyim*) has been said to have been derived from the Tamil *tokei* but sometimes traced to the Egyptian *tekh*. In modern Hebrew the word for peacock is "tavas". In Sanskrit, the peacock is known as Mayura and is associated with the killing of snakes.
