CRUSADERS BRING AN OLD ADAGE TO LIFE VS. CLIFTON

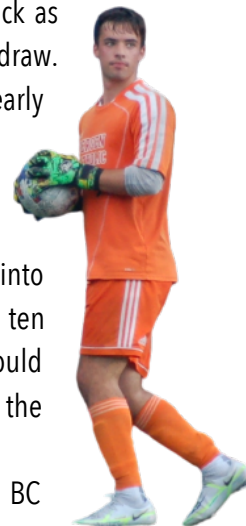
September 13 - Oradell, NJ - Many in my generation know that "Like kissing your sister" means something that is perfunctory, without much pleasure. The saying "like kissing

FOOTBALL EXTENDS STREAK TO 17 IN IMPRESSIVE FASHION

September 17 - Oradell, NJ - The Crusaders hosted Seton Hall Prep in their second SFC United Division Game on Saturday at the Jack and the lads performed quite well in front of an enthusiastic crowd. The Crusaders rolled to a 35-14 victory following a 21-0 first quarter which put the Pirates in a hole they could never climb out of. (ATOET)

Carmelo Velardo (one "L" in each) continued as one of BC's top weapons, putting his opening kickoff (and three of five subsequent kicks) into the endzone for touchbacks.



On the second play from scrimmage, middle linebacker, Malachi Mercer intercepted his, team leading 3rd interception of the season and returned it 15 yards to the 16 yard line.

Saeed St.Fleur then carried the ball 11 yards to set up a first and goal and after a Pirate penalty, hit paydirt to put BC up 6-0. Guytano Bartolmeo converted on his first of five extra points and BC was up 7-0.



In SHP's next possession, Joe Barry recorded a pair of tackles including one for a four yard loss. That short possession and seventeen yard punt set the Crusaders up in great field position once again.

Dominic Campanile and DJ Samuels combined rushing for a first down and then Jack Duffy hit Christian Carti for a 15-yard completion to put BC at the 13 yard line. After two St.Fleur carries to the 1, Duffy found Sydir Mitchell, who aligned as right tight end, for a 1 yard TD pass.



Anthony Morales and Naiim Parrish recorded tackles in the next series before an incomplete pass created a three-and-out for the Pirates.

For the first time, BC was starting its offense on its own half of the field. QB Dominic Campanile hit St.Fleur for a 27 yard completion, quickly getting the ball across the midfield. Campanile spent much of the drive entrusting the ball to St.Fleur, who was the work horse and picking up massive chunks of yardage on each carry. After finding TE, Jack Comeau for a 15 yard completion, Duffy came in to engineer the final yards. Jack handed the ball to Jaiden Estrella who carried the ball into the endzone from 4 yards out.



As the teams moved into the second quarter, they traded short possessions. DJ Samuels recorded a TFL to disrupt a Pirate drive. Finally, with 4:12 remaining in the half, the Pirates were able to reach BC's endzone.

BC was held to three-and-out on offense and Seton Hall's offense was back on the field before half. Sydir Mitchell recorded a TFL on 1st down as BC forced a three-and-out in return.



The Crusaders took over with 1:26 remaining at the SHP 48 yard line. Campanile dropped back and hit Comeau down the seam for a 28 yard completion. Two big runs, one by St.Fleur (9 yards) and one by Logan Casey (11 yards) put BC on the Pirate doorstep. After two carries, St.Fleur punched it across the goal line to lift BC by a third touchdown once again.



As the third quarter started, Chris Mimmo returned the second half kickoff 26 yards to the 35 yard line. The first drive of the half stalled after 7 plays and Brandon Arpicillar punted for the second time in the game.

Mercer recorded a TFL on the Prep's first play and Anthony Morales defended a pass bringing up a third down. That is when Kaj Sanders read the passer's eyes and intercepted, returning the ball to the 37 yard line.

After a short completion to St.Fleur, DJ Samuels put his big run running back hat on. Samuels, for the second consecutive week, sprinted 59 yards to paydirt.



BC got some solid defensive play from Joe Barry who added a pick to his TFL on the game. Mimmo, Christian Gonzalez, Sanders, AJ Seker, Delaney Fludd, Dave Matesic and Chris Murphy all recorded tackles for the Crusader D. Sophomores Mu Russell and Quincy Porter got some quality play during the fourth quarter, helping BC secure the victory.

THE STREAK

With its victory over Seton Hall Prep, BC now has a 17-game winning streak dating back to 2020 when the Crusaders defeated St. Peter's Prep 22-15 in the season finale. The last loss came at the hands of BC's oldest rival, Don Bosco as the Ironmen shattered the Crusader hopes of an undefeated season, scoring on the final play of the game and converting the PAT for a 21-20 final.

The longest Crusader win streak was from 1991-1993 when Coach Fred Stengel's Crusaders won back-to-back-to-back state championships. Two 11-0 seasons in '91 and '92 and an opening-day win in 1993 made up the 23 games until Passaic HS came into BC and defeated BC 34-21.

The '93 Crusaders were resilient, coming back to win their third consecutive NJSIAA championship and starting a streak that would last 15 games. That 3-peat is a feat that has not yet been duplicated at BC.

In the second quarter, Mason Marck threw a half-back option pass to Thomas to set up BC at the four-yard line. Dante Kain immediately burst off left guard to score and put BC up 12-0.



As the third quarter started, Thomas made his third big catch of the game. This one, a 26 yard slant-and-go route



which put BC first and goal at the four. He got his just reward as Zitt threw a quick goal-line fade to the right side and BC led 18-0. Dante Kain read a well-blocked inside-zone play that saw linemen Mikey McMahon and Hudson Brennan double team their defensive tackle about five yards deep into the endzone. The two-point conversion was good and BC led 20-0.

Joshua Cruz intercepted on first down following the kickoff to SHP and returned the football 38 yards to the Pirate 7. The

home team was desperate to keep BC out of the endzone for the fourth time, but they were not strong enough to do so. On fourth down, Kain plowed his way in for a second touchdown and his fourteenth point of the day. The PAT failed but BC led 26-0.

In terms of the video board itself, well... It's one of a kind. And what makes it really sweet? McGovern also informed me that Bergen Catholic is the ONLY high school in NJ to have a video board.

Phase 1 of the athletic renovations was the track and field, phase 2 was the brand new state of the art videoboard, so the question on everyone's mind is what's next? It is clear that a considerable amount of planning went into the design and execution of the scoreboard. According to Mr. McGovern this will not be the last of renovations coming our way here at Bergen Catholic.

There is no set timeline for upcoming renovations, however, the bleachers, perimeter fencing, and a new building at field level, are all in discussions.

'23 – Each week, we plan to recognize a BC Sports Alumnus of the Week. While alumni from BC have succeeded in so many walks of life and professions, the focus of my column will be athletes.

This week's recipient of the Alumnus of the Week goes to Brian Cushing. Cushing attended Bergen from 2001-2005 and is a high school football legend. Cushing started at Outside Linebacker for BC as a sophomore and had an immediate impact on BC.



In his senior year against Saint Joseph Regional, Cush scored 5 touchdowns in a 56-42 victory for BC. In that game, there were other notable high football names such as Jim Dray and Isaiah Williams for BC and Jason and Devon McCourty for SJR.

Later that year, Cushing led the Crusaders to winning a state championship in 2004, where he had 2 touchdowns in 14-0 BC victory over Don Bosco Prep at Giants Stadium. Cushing was later named New Jersey Player of the Year as a Senior.

In 2005, Cushing was named an All American and played in the U.S Army All-American Bowl. With many colleges recruiting him, Cushing landed on University of Southern California to play college football.

Cushing became a starter as a freshman and was selected to the 2005 Freshman All-American team. As a sophomore he continued to perform well and was selected to the All Pac-10 second team. In his junior season, the Trojans beat the Michigan Wolverines in the Rose Bowl and Cushing won the Rose Bowl Defensive MVP Award. In his final year at USC,

Cushing was named to the All Pac-10 first team and was recognized as a first team All-American by Rivals.com and SI.com.

Cushing entered the NFL draft in 2008 and was drafted 15th overall by the Houston Texans. Cushing immediately became a sensation in the NFL being named a pro bowler, Second Team All-Pro, and winning Defensive Rookie of Year.
