# CRUSADERS DEFEAT PALADINS

## 48-20 ON SENIOR DAY

**October 29 - Oradell, NJ** - The Crusader Football Team, ranked #2 in New Jersey, steamrolled Paramus Catholic 48-21 on Saturday afternoon at the Jack.

The Crusader defense forced the Paladins to punt on their first possession. From there, it was Coach Campanile's winning recipe of power running and timely passing to move 9 plays, 73 yards down the field to score. Jack Duffy, Kaj Sanders, Saeed St.Fleur and Chris Mimmo carried were entrusted with the ball and helped to move the ball to the 8-yard line. Dominic Campanile then connected with Quincy Porter for the game's first score on a tunnel screen.

St.Fleur scored the only touchdown of the second quarter and opened up third quarter scoring with his 13<sup>th</sup> touchdown of the year. Saeed broke the 1,000 yard rushing mark with 213 yards on the ground.

## READY TO OPEN 2022 NON-PUBLIC "A" NORTH SECTIONAL TOURNAMENT

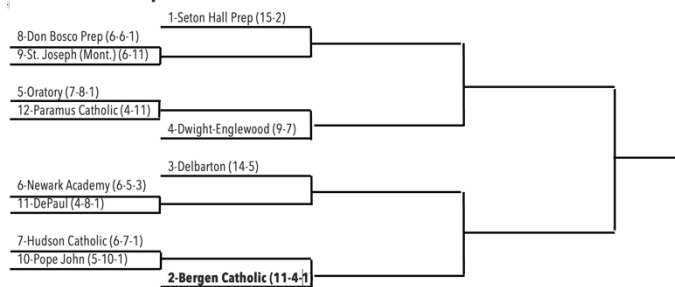

## CRUSADERS FOOTBALL BEGINS QUEST FOR REPEAT!

**October 30 - Oradell, NJ** - The Bergen Catholic Football Team will hope to bring a BC tradition of back-to-back championships back in vogue in Oradell. The Crusaders have done that five times in school history, including a three-peat from 1991-1993.

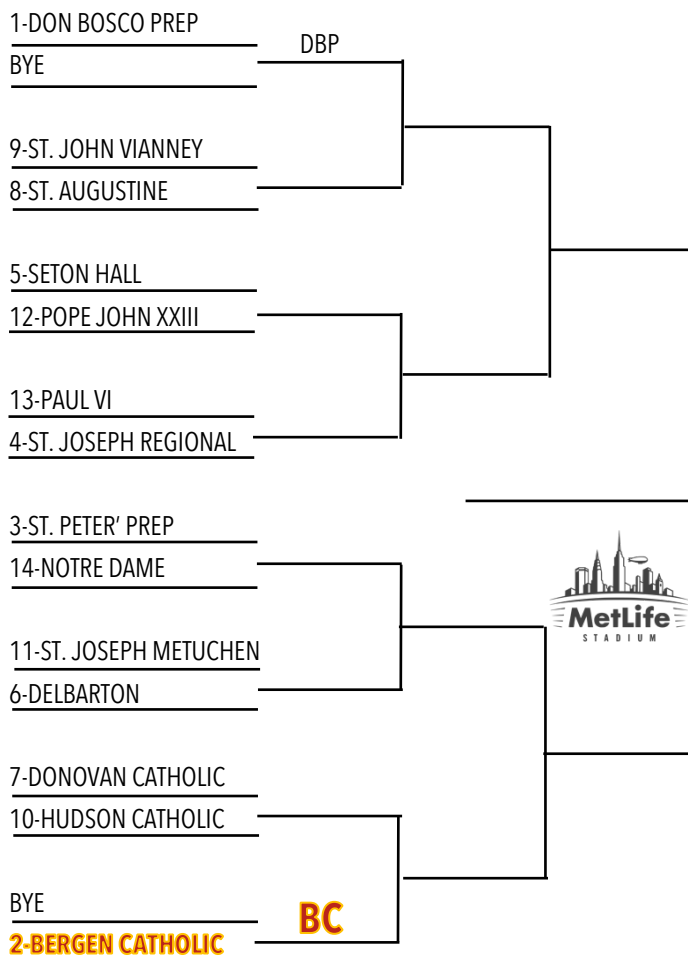
The Crusaders are the #2 seed in the tournament which means they receive a bye the weekend of November 5<sup>th</sup>. BC will host the winner of Donovan Catholic vs. Hudson Catholic on Saturday, November 12<sup>th</sup> @ 1:00 PM at the Jack. With the 8-1 record comes a homefield throughout the playoffs, including the semi-final round on November 19. The State

Final will be played at MetLife Stadium on Friday, November 25 at 6:00 PM.



BC's first state championship was earned in 1963, but many of the early Crusader alumni feel "football school" moniker was borne of the 1965-1966 back-to-back undefeated champion teams of Stack and Rabadan.

The championships actually were won under two different head coaches, Keith Krayner and Bob Norton. Tony Karcich would be the next to lead BC to glory. He put back-to-back championship teams in 1979 and 1980 with his 1982 undefeated 11-0 team being the first in school history to win a **Newark Star Ledger** Trophy and earn a national ranking in the **USAToday** (#10).

Head Coach Bill Roca's short stint as coach earned BC a state championship in his first season, 1986. He was followed by the winningest coach in Bergen Catholic History, Fred Stengel. Coach Stengel's Crusaders won 9 state championships. His 1991-1992 teams were both undefeated and nationally ranked (#11 and #13 respectively) and his 1998, 12-0 team was named the Team of the Century by **The Record**. That Crusader team scored 599 points and was led by stars all over the field. The underclass was so strong, it too followed up with a championship in 1999.

That was the last of the repeats. Twenty-three years and counting since the last one. This could very well be the year the Crusaders start a new championship streak. As happens this time of the year, everyone is talented. The championship generally goes to the senior class that is more determined and wants it the most. I know the Crazies are betting on our guys!

**October 24 - Jersey City, NJ** - Riley O'Dowd caught his



second touchdown pass in two weeks. This time, it was a dazzling left-handed, one-hand catch on a fade route down the left sideline to

cradle a Chris Conte pass for six points from 32 yards out. The Crusaders early scoring led them to a 18-0 victory over St. Peter's Prep.

Conte opened the scoring for the Crusaders in the first quarter with a one-yard plunge. His score was set up by a quick scramble and pass to a wide-open Mike Campanile who found a hole in the Prep zone and ran for 40 yards. Mu Russell scored the two point conversion and BC was off to the races.

After O'Dowd caught the score to start the second quarter, Matt Daly. On the next drive, the Marauders moved the ball down to the 15 yard-line, but Jesse DeNobile, on a blitz, blocked and caught the quarterback's pass on a dead run. He sprinted 85 yards from there to the endzone and BC was up 22-0.

Nick Shortridge scored BC's final touchdown. He started off-tackle to the left and then jump-cut wide to his left before putting the hammer down and running through three would-be tacklers from 20 yards out. The PAT failed, but BC was up 28-0 in the third quarter.

The first goal went into the BC net within the first five minutes of play. It wasn't a Waldwick player who scored it however as a ball was misplayed on the defensive end and translated into a goal that would remain the leading margin for most of the first half.

As a brief, ten-minute rain shower soaked the teams at halftime, the rain subsided and stanza two was underway. Unfortunately it began much the way the first half began,

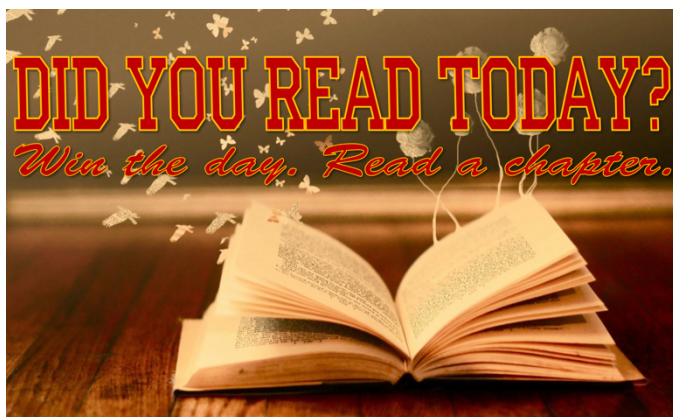

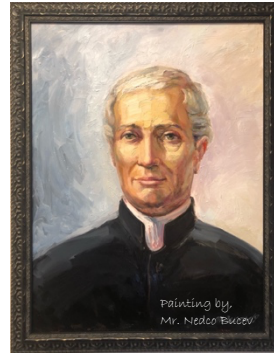

## How to Pray the Rosary

1. Make the Sign of the Cross.
2. Holding the Crucifix, say the *Apostles' Creed*.
3. On the first bead, say an *Our Father*.
4. Say one *Hail Mary* on each of the next three beads.
5. Say the *Glory Be*
6. For each of the five decades, announce the Mystery (perhaps followed by a brief reading from Scripture) then say the *Our Father*.
7. While fingering each of the ten beads of the decade, next say ten Hail Marys while meditating on the Mystery. Then say a *Glory Be*. (After finishing each decade, some say the following prayer requested by the Blessed Virgin Mary at Fatima: *O my Jesus, forgive us our sins, save us from the fires of hell; lead all souls to Heaven, especially those who have most need of your mercy.*)
8. After saying the five decades, say the Hail, Holy Queen, followed by this dialogue and prayer:  
V. Pray for us, O holy Mother of God.  
R. That we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ.

*Let us pray: O God, whose Only Begotten Son, by his life, Death, and Resurrection, has purchased for us the rewards of eternal life, grant, we beseech thee, that while meditating on these mysteries of the most holy Rosary of the Blessed Virgin Mary, we may imitate what they contain and obtain what they promise, through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.*
