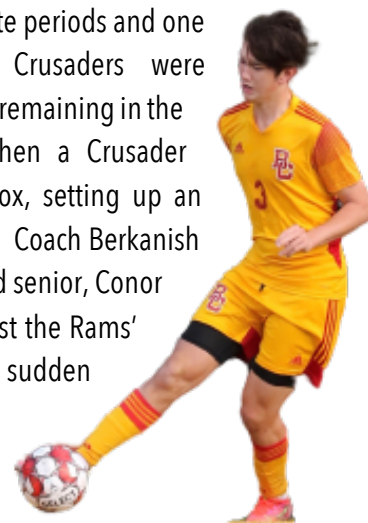
OVERTIME GANG UPSETS #4 RAMS; ADVANCES IN QUARTERS

CRUSADER SPORTS ALUMNUS OF THE WEEK

October 3 - Oradell, NJ - by, Carter Pontone '23 - This week's recipient of the Crusader Sports Alumnus of the Week is Doug Edert '19, who currently plays college basketball at Bryant University. Doug attended BC from 2015-2019 and was known for his leadership and hard-working attitude. He is a ferocious competitor, proving in the 2022 NCAA Tournament, where he helped the 15th seeded Saint Peter's upset #2 ranked Kentucky as Peacocks advanced all the way to the Elite 8.



In his senior year at BC, he helped lead the Crusaders to a league, county, section, and state championship. That same year Doug accomplished something that few have at BC, and scored 1,000 points. Prior to his senior basketball season, he committed to Saint Peter's University in Jersey City.

Carter: What was your favorite moment at BC?

Doug: "The run we made my senior year where we won the county championship and made it to the state sections. That whole season was so special. The pressure of having to win and if we lost we would never be able to play with each other again. Unfortunately our run came to end in the finals. It was my favorite moment cause I went through my whole high school career playing with these guys and being able to make a run like that in the end was just the best thing to experience."

Carter: Who were some people at BC who helped influence your game?

Doug: "Coach Billy Armstrong had a major influence and how he went about things. He helped me a lot to understanding the game of basketball and helping me have a better IQ. He

has taught me so much that even helps me today. Another person who meant a lot to me at BC was our manager Tommy Corbett. He was always in a great mood and if I was frustrated he would always put me in a good mood. He always brought this great energy to the team that made a big difference for us and he was super helpful during my time at BC."

In Doug's first season at Saint Peter's, the Peacocks ended the season at a record of 18-2, and finished 2nd in the MAAC. Doug put up very solid freshman records, scoring 7.8 points and 2.5 rebounds a game. In his second season, Saint Peter's ended their season with a record of 14-11 and finished third in the MAAC. Doug put up similar numbers from the past year, scoring 7.7 points and 3.3 rebounds a game. In his third season, Saint Peter's ended the season with a record of 14-6, finishing second in the MAAC. Doug's numbers improved in his junior season, as he scored 9.5 points and 2.5 rebounds a game.

Carter: What are some of the biggest differences you have seen between high school and college level basketball?

Doug: "There's a lot of differences between high school and college basketball. It's a huge difference in regards to like the amount of detail and how specific everything is. In high school you can get away with taking a break on defense to catch your breath, but you definitely can't do that in college. There's not as much leeway going into your freshmen year of college from high school. Your coaches call you out on every little play to make sure you understand what you're doing and to make sure you don't make the same mistake in the future."

The same season, Doug and Saint Peter's made the NCAA tournament, being the 15th seed in the east region. Their first game of the tournament was against the 2 seed Kentucky Wildcats. It was very unlikely that Saint Peter's would win this game and many people doubted them in their March Madness brackets. Saint Peter's went on to beat

the Wildcats in an overtime victory, with Doug scoring 20 points, 2 assists, and 4 rebounds.

Carter: What was it like playing in the NCAA tournament?

Doug: "It was awesome. It was a whole different environment with the amount of people there. The noise and pressure in the environment is so crazy. Playing against Kentucky basketball was insane cause everyone knows who they are and no one really knew who Saint Peters was. We were the 15th seed going against the 2 seed and going into the game we just didn't care who we were playing and went out and played how we always do. That win really put us on the map and we just continued doing that throughout the tournament.

We just kept on moving forward and we wanted to keep playing together and show everyone what we were all about."

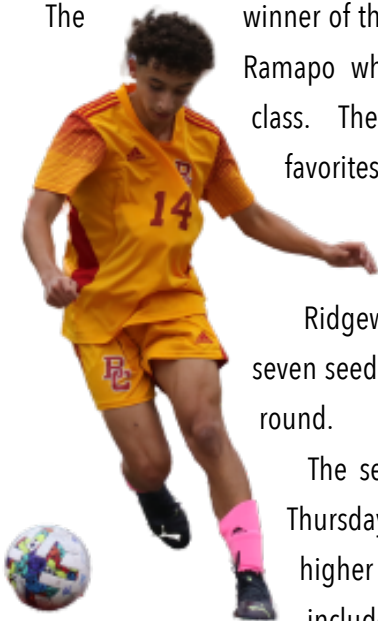

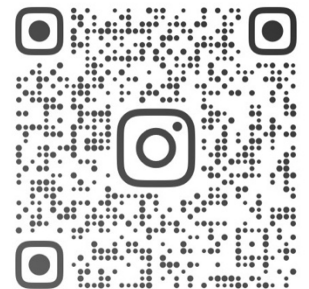

NIL DEALS: THEIR IMPACT UPON HS RECRUITING & TRANSFERS

October 6 - Oradell, NJ - Ian Knab '23 - The introduction of NIL (Name, Image and Likeness) deals have changed the way student-athletes are recruited out of high school and when transferring among colleges. It changes the school a player may pick based on the amount of money or professional opportunities they can make at a particular school.

Student-athletes today who are getting recruited out of high school to go play college athletics are getting NIL deals and other sponsorships to persuade them to pick a certain university. Big market colleges like USC or Notre Dame often have more money to give to stars compared to smaller schools. Boosters will pay high amounts of money and offer other deals to top high school players to try and convince them to go to their school.

According to **USAToday**, a booster from Eastern Michigan University offered Caleb Williams one million dollars to transfer to play quarterback for the Eagles. He turned down this offer to attend USC where his Oklahoma coach, Lincoln Riley, now works. Williams was the biggest name in the transfer portal this year and earned offers to almost every school in the nation. Since transferring to USC, Williams landed 5 NIL deals. They are valued at roughly 2.1 million dollars according to **On3NIL.com**. He is currently the 3rd highest-rated NIL player behind fellow Quarterbacks Bryce Young and C.J. Stroud.

Bergen Catholic senior defensive end, DJ Samuels says that NIL deals were available to students in the summer. He said it did not affect his recruiting process, but he has acquired NIL deals since his commitment to the University of Maryland.

Aidan Wallace, a senior wrestler at BC, has an NIL deal from Buckedup which is a pre-workout company. Wallace will be attending Duke University and will wrestle for the Blue Devils in 2023.

BIRD OF THE WEEK HERMIT THRUSH



October 10 - Alpine, NJ - It was an absolutely perfect day to bird on Columbus Day, so I did my best to make the most of it. As I began my way around Bergen County, I started at State Line Lookout off the Palisades Parkway in Alpine. It is definitely one of my favorite birding hotspots.

Ruby-crowned kinglets were most abundant, popping around all over. There was a golden-crowned kinglet, and a wide variety of woodpeckers and back-yard birds as well as vultures and raptors, but my favorite photo of the day, and capture of the day was this little hermit thrush.

Like the wood thrush, veery and Swainson's thrush, hermit thrush's have a flute-like melodic call. They are seven inch brown birds (on top) and white below with spots on the breast. They have a rusty patch toward the rump which helps to identify this ground forager. If you're hiking around in the woods or even walking down a quiet path with some cover on the sides, keep your eye out for a hermit thrush. If you see one, I'll bet it will make your day!!!

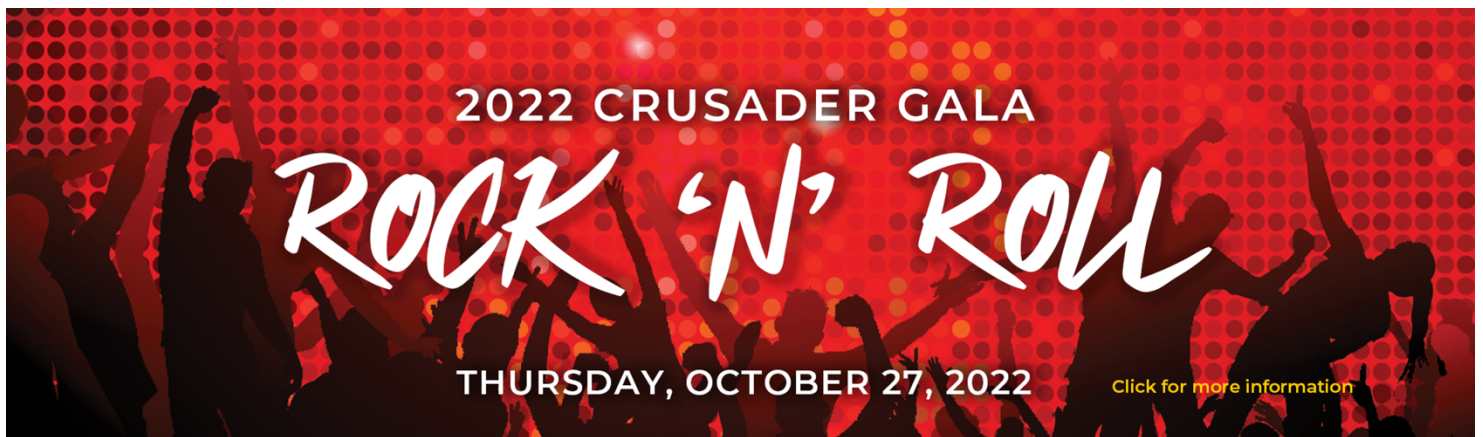

How to Pray the Rosary

1. Make the Sign of the Cross.
2. Holding the Crucifix, say the *Apostles' Creed*.
3. On the first bead, say an *Our Father*.
4. Say one *Hail Mary* on each of the next three beads.
5. Say the *Glory Be*
6. For each of the five decades, announce the Mystery (perhaps followed by a brief reading from Scripture) then say the *Our Father*.
7. While fingering each of the ten beads of the decade, next say ten Hail Marys while meditating on the Mystery. Then say a *Glory Be*. (After finishing each decade, some say the following prayer requested by the Blessed Virgin Mary at Fatima: *O my Jesus, forgive us our sins, save us from the fires of hell; lead all souls to Heaven, especially those who have most need of your mercy.*)
8. After saying the five decades, say the Hail, Holy Queen, followed by this dialogue and prayer:
V. Pray for us, O holy Mother of God.
R. That we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ.

Let us pray: O God, whose Only Begotten Son, by his life, Death, and Resurrection, has purchased for us the rewards of eternal life, grant, we beseech thee, that while meditating on these mysteries of the most holy Rosary of the Blessed Virgin Mary, we may imitate what they contain and obtain what they promise, through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.
