CRUSADERS TAKE HOME 2022 GREAT AMERICAN RIVALRY SERIES TROPHY



BC 31- SJR 21

October 15 - Montvale, NJ - It was as perfect a perfect autumn day could be in Green Knightville on Saturday. The Crusaders played very much like a motivated team in the first half of the game, putting up 31 points before shifting into cruise control a little in the second half, en-route to a 31-21 victory over St. Joseph Regional.

Dominic Campanile lit it up from behind center, throwing three, first-half touchdown passes and Saeed St.Fleur took care of business on the ground, rolling up 179 yards, 1

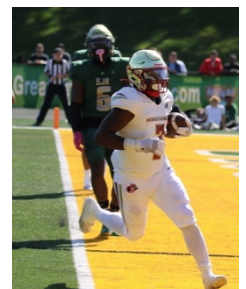
touchdown and earning the Game's Most Valuable Player Award.

It wasn't difficult to see many outstanding performances all over the

field however. Quincy Porter scored BC's opening touchdown, a 22-yard reception from Campanile and Guytano Bartolomeo provided perfection, kicking his first of four PATs, and adding a field goal in the mix.

Carmelo Velardo drove the ball deep, putting five of his six kick-offs into the endzone for touchbacks and one, deep through the uprights. On six kicks, the Crusaders yielded only 18 return yards. The hopelessness was quite apparent on the faces and body language of the Green Knight returners who could do nothing to help their team generate a spark because of Velardo's drives.

Senior QB Jack Duffy directed BC's second score of the afternoon, handing to St.Fleur who scampered in, untouched, from 8 yards out.



The Green Knights opened the scoring in the second quarter on a 57-yard touchdown pass to cut BC's lead to 14-7, but the Crusaders were swift to answer.



Campanile delivered a 30-yard strike to senior receiver Logan Casey who made terrific catch, but was injured on the play. So Dominic converted to runner mode and scampered 29-yards on his own on the following play. After two runs by St.Fleur, Campanile connected with senior tight end Jack Comeau who scored his third touchdown on the season, putting BC up 21-7.



The Crusader defense shut down the SJR offense, going three-and-out on the following drive which gave Duffy a chance to deliver a perfect strike to Daquan Stewart, who converted a short pass into a 41-yard big play.



Stewart dove for the endzone, but came up just short and the ball was marked at the three yard line.

That drive set up Bartolomeo's 24-yard field goal and BC led 24-7.

Sophomore defensive back Naiim Parrish intercepted a pass on the Green Knight's second play following the kickoff and the Crusaders were in business, driving the ball down to the one-yard-line. The SJR defense tightened and despite trying to get the ball into the endzone, BC was unable to do so on fourth down and changed over to defense.



With 3:44 remaining in the half, the Crusader defense came up big and stopped St. Joe's three-and-out once again. Following a 34-yard punt by the Green Knights, BC had the ball first and ten at the Joe's 42.

Bergen wasted no time. Following a short gain on first down, Campanile spread the ball around; first to St.Fleur for a 22-yard completion, then Porter who had a 14-yard completion and finally to senior receiver Christian Carty, the day's Student-Athlete of the Game who scored on a five-yard slant.



The half ended following a big play by SJR that went for 70 yards, setting up a touchdown with seconds remaining. BC went into the half with a 31-14 lead and after a scoreless third quarter came away with a 31-21 victory.

Malachi Mercer had another exceptional game from his "MIKE" linebacker position. He recorded 8 tackles (56 on the season) and added one to his season-high 4 interceptions. He leads the Crusaders in both categories.

Not to be outdone, Christian Gonzalez and Joe Barry each recorded eight tackles as well and played huge roles in holding the Green Knights to just 11 first downs on the afternoon. Gonzalez recorded a solo TFL and solo sack on the day and Barry added 1.5 TFLs.

Parrish finished his afternoon with two interceptions and recorded four solo tackles (five in total).

Jack Duffy executed a perfect "quick kick" on a punt, dropping the ball to the 2 yard-line, while punter Brandon Arpacilar averaged 29.5 yards on his four punts.

CREW OPENS AT HEAD OF THE PASSAIC

October 9 - Rutherford, NJ - Three boats competed in the Head of the Passaic Regatta on Sunday. The event covered parts of the river between Rutherford and North Arlington.

This race was 4.5 kilometers, though regattas tend to be



different distances depending upon the site. A "Head" is a race that is sometimes referred to as a time trial. Each boat starts approximately 15 seconds apart and is timed electronically.

BC rowers are scullers. Scullers are rowers that use two oars when they compete. Sweeper events are those where the rowers have only one oar.

Sophomore, Ronan Howell showed well in his varsity debut posting a time of 20:11.8 due to a one minute penalty for passing another boat in a no-passing zone.

In a double event (scullers), the teammates have very specific responsibilities. The "Bow" is the sculler in front of the boat. He is responsible for steering the boat (scull). As the scullers are facing the back of the boat, you will often see him looking over his shoulder to ensure the boat is on course.

The person in the back of the boat (the stern) is called the "Stroke." He is responsible for setting the pace of the rowers. The Bow and the Stroke are always the front and back rowers. When 4 or 8-man boats are racing, they bookend their additional 2 or six teammates.

The Sophomore scull of Avery Drapkin (bow) and Howell (stroke) placed ninth in the two-man event, recording a time of 17:38. BC had a second "All-Sophomore Scull," Alex Georgiou (bow) and Luis Santos (stroke), who finished 19:31, good for fourteenth place.

Similar to track, regattas in the fall tend to be longer distances (think Cross-country). As the spring regattas start, more sprints (1500m) races are the focus. Congratulations the rowers on a great showing!

The Crusaders were unable to stop SJR enough and will need to work during a short practice-week to rebound vs. St. Peter's Prep on Friday.



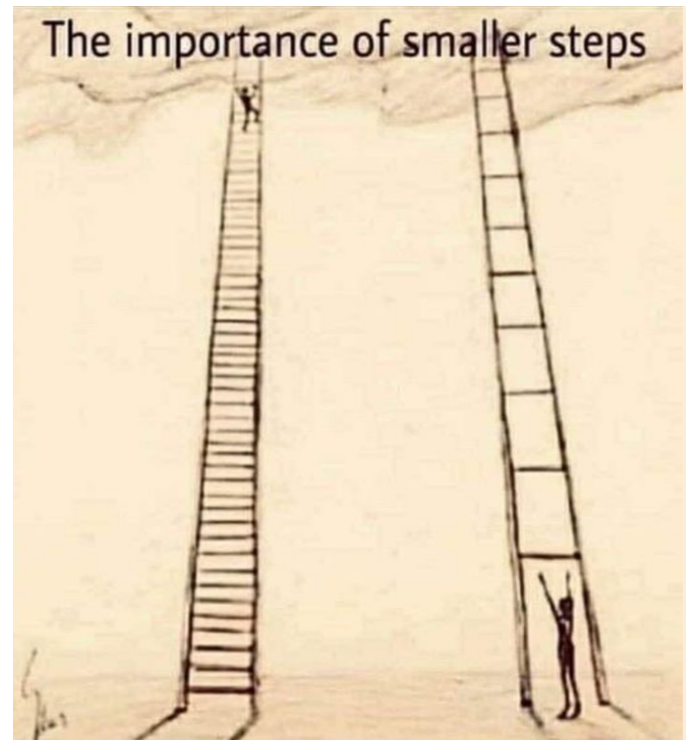
WHITE'S WORKOUT OF THE WEEK!

Before you begin any exercise program, be sure to consult your doctor and we recommend you consult a personal trainer to assist with learning exercises listed in WWOTW! and developing a program to achieve your goals.

Your body is your temple and it's more than essential to treat it that way. Anything damaging you do to your body you're doing to yourself. Having said that, treat yourself with respect, eat healthily, and improve your body.

The exercise I chose for White's Workout of the Week is the squat. The squat can be done anywhere at any time with any equipment, or none at all. Some prefer squatting just their body weight, while others prefer to squat heavy weight loads. It's generally best to begin learning a new exercise with very little to no weight and progress from there.



To start your squat, stand with your feet about shoulder-width apart and your toes slightly pointed outwards. Make yourself comfortable, brace your core and keep your chest up. Initiate the basic squat movement, keeping the hips back, and knees bent, ensuring they do not cave in. Optimally, it is best to have your toes, ankles, knees, and hips all in alignment when executing a squat.

When squatting, concentric contraction occurs in the quadriceps when you move upwards, and the quadriceps shorten. Eccentric contraction happens when you move downwards, and the quadriceps lengthen.

To ensure the most muscle growth, use the greatest range of motion. You can go down on a 3-2-1 eccentric and hit that depth. When on the way up make sure to lock out and keep your form.

If a bodyweight squat becomes too easy or access to a gym is not available a quick tip is to put weight in a backpack or hold the weight in your hands.

If you are barbell squatting, there are 2 different ways you can set up your squat. A high bar squat is more quad-focused, and it is when you rest the barbell on your traps. (high-up on your back) A low bar squat is more hamstring and glute-focused and it is when you place the bar on your delts. (rear delts) You can generally push more weight low bar squatting, but with a high bar squat, you can utilize more range of motion and lengthen the quads the best.



Putting form aside something else that is very important for your squat is breathing. I like to take a good breath before I descend. Then once I'm at the lowest point of my squat I breathe out and return to my starting position maintaining proper form. Healthline is a website dedicated to making health and wellness information accessible and understandable. Nicole Davis, a Boston-based writer, and personal trainer claims that you may even be sabotaging your workout if proper breathing technique is not used. Davis even goes as far as to say, "Making a habit of improper breathing can cause your blood pressure to rise, possibly resulting in dizziness, nausea, or even a heart attack." Having said this make sure to keep proper breathing throughout your squat and any other lifts.

I hope you found these tips helpful and be sure to fuel your body after your workout. A

high-protein option would be best. This is because eating protein can help rebuild and repair those damaged muscle fibers from your workout as well as aid in building muscle.

BIRD OF THE WEEK

PILEATED WOODPECKER



October 12 - Allendale, NJ - A rare bird was spotted at Crestwood Lake in Allendale on Tuesday. A VERY RARE SPARROW, known as a Henslow Sparrow showed up which drew many pairs of binoculars.

I wasn't able to make it over on Tuesday, so I bolted over between PSAT and football practice to see if there was any chance I could get lucky.

Regarding the Henslow's, I wasn't fortunate. But I enjoy birding, getting out in nature and appreciating God's creation, so Wednesday brought me great joy.

While out there, an American Kestrel flew overhead. There were Palm and Yellow-rumped Warblers, Ruby-crowned Kinglets, Eastern Phoebe, Red-bellied Woodpecker and a bird I've been needing on my 2022 Bergen County List, the infamous, Yellow-bellied Sapsucker. I was fortunate enough to see a female Belted Kingfisher as well as Red-tailed and Red-shoulder Hawks, as well as Song, Savannah, White-throated, Swamp and House Sparrows.

But the bird that is generally most striking among that group is the Pileated Woodpecker. The bird is often recognized as having inspired the character Woody Woodpecker. It is best identified by its size (a little larger than a blue jay) and its red *pilus* (*lt.*), or cap.

If you look closely, you can see that this particular woodpecker has a red "moustache" that extends back from its bill. That distinguishes it as a male, whereas the females have a black moustache. How many woodpeckers do you think you can find this fall? Here is the list of woodpeckers that we generally see in North Jersey.

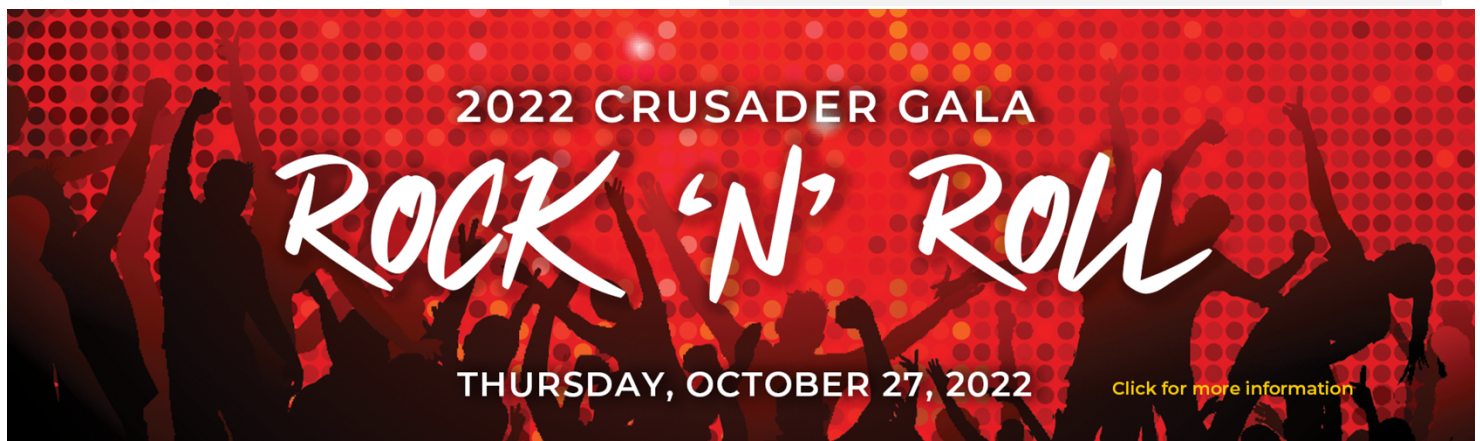

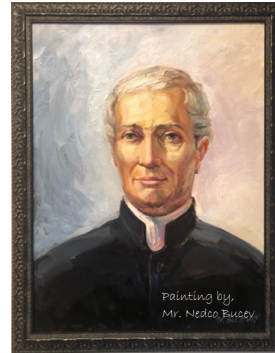

How to Pray the Rosary

1. Make the Sign of the Cross.
2. Holding the Crucifix, say the *Apostles' Creed*.
3. On the first bead, say an *Our Father*.
4. Say one *Hail Mary* on each of the next three beads.
5. Say the *Glory Be*
6. For each of the five decades, announce the Mystery (perhaps followed by a brief reading from Scripture) then say the *Our Father*.
7. While fingering each of the ten beads of the decade, next say ten Hail Marys while meditating on the Mystery. Then say a *Glory Be*. (After finishing each decade, some say the following prayer requested by the Blessed Virgin Mary at Fatima: *O my Jesus, forgive us our sins, save us from the fires of hell; lead all souls to Heaven, especially those who have most need of your mercy.*)
8. After saying the five decades, say the Hail, Holy Queen, followed by this dialogue and prayer:
V. Pray for us, O holy Mother of God.
R. That we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ.

Let us pray: O God, whose Only Begotten Son, by his life, Death, and Resurrection, has purchased for us the rewards of eternal life, grant, we beseech thee, that while meditating on these mysteries of the most holy Rosary of the Blessed Virgin Mary, we may imitate what they contain and obtain what they promise, through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.
