CRUSADERS SECURE PLAYOFF HOMEFIELD ADVANTAGE

October 22 - Oradell, NJ - The Crusader Football Team played some motivated football on Saturday with a goal of securing a homefield advantage through the state playoffs. BC put themselves in the driver's seat with just one game to

play with its 42-27 victory over St. Peter's Prep on Saturday. The battle between NJ's #2 and #3 ranked teams was likely going to determine home field through the championship game (which will be played at Metlife Stadium on Friday, November 25th at 6:00pm) and one thing the Crusaders are keenly aware of, they do not want to play at Caven Point which has been generally unfriendly to the Crusaders.

It was an inauspicious start for sure, with the BC offense yielding the ball just three plays in. Punter Brandon Arpacilar delivered his finest punt as a Crusader with a 58-yard bomb, to give BC a hand in the field position game. Unfortunately, the field position didn't help against a Prep offense that was still humming, following its 70-41 victory over Paramus Catholic last week.

The Prep delivered its first touchdown, a 37-yard strike and the offensive fireworks were underway.

BC responded with a six-play, sixty-six yard drive, capped off by a 20-yard touchdown run by Saeed St.Fleur. Guytano Bartolomeo made his first of six extra-points on the day and the score was knotted at 7.

That lead lasted just over two minutes until the Marauders struck again with another 40+ yard touchdown strike. DJ Samuels came up big, blocking his first of two PATS (he also blocked a punt) and Prep led 13-7.

STOP. Samuels blocked three KICKS IN ONE GAME. We probably need to unpack his game. In addition to his **THREE BLOCKED KICKS**, DJ recorded **FOUR SOLO TFLs**, **1 assisted TFL**, **TWO SACKS** and **ONE RUSHING TOUCHDOWN.** What did he do the rest of the time? OK. OK.

While we're at it on the defensive side of the ball, Malachi Mercer (who may very well have set a record with his 21-tackle game vs. Don Bosco) recorded 17 tackles against the Prep. Sydir Mitchell had a big game, recording 12 tackles and Christian Gonzalez added 14 tackles, a career-high for him.

Back to the game...

So if Prep thought they were the only ones who could score quickly, they were mistaken. Less than 1:30 later, BC took the lead as Campanile and Quincy Porter connected for their first TD pass combo of the day: a 51-yard strike.

At this point, the Marauders had to prove they could play from behind and their first attempt, failed at the midfield in the opening minutes of the second quarter. This is when Samuels blocked future teammate (at Maryland) Champ Long's punt, giving the Crusaders terrific field position.

Senior QB Jack Duffy started the Bergen Machine, completing a pass to Anthony Perrotti for 9 yards. After two St.Fleur carries, it was time for the Campanile-to-Porter express to return, this time for a 24-yard strike down the near Crusaders' sideline.

The Crusaders, up 21-13, were in a position to put the game out of reach with a stop on defense. The Marauders showed why they are the #3 team in the state, putting together a 10-play, 85-yard drive to make the score 21-19. Prep converted the two-point attempt and we had a new ball game in Oradell.

Jack Duffy was entrusted with the ball in the next drive and did he deliver! After St.Fleur ripped off a 16 yards on two carries, Duffy dropped back to pass on second and nine. He found a wide-open Quincy Porter who scored his third touchdown of the game, this time a 62 yarder, putting BC back in front, now 28-21.

Peters needed to get something going as it was now apparent they were not going to stop BC's offense, so on fourth and two at their own 46 yardline, they went for it. Malachi Mercer and Elijah Kinsler stuffed the Marauder runner short of the yard-to-gain line and BC was back in business with 3:36 left in the half.

Champions make the big plays at big times and senior leaders generally make the best champions. Start it off with Jack Comeau who snatched a Campanile pass, good for a 28 yard reception. Follow that up with a St.Fleur carry for 22 yards and finish it off with Samuels off the left side for 6 yards and a touchdown and you've got a 35-21 lead at the half, exclamation point!



After a scoreless third quarter, it was time for senior linebacker, Joe Barry, to make his name heard. Barry intercepted his first of two Champ Long passes, returning it 16 yards to the Marauder 35.

Campanile showed off his wheels and did his best Charles Blondin impersonation, tight-roping it down the sideline and into the endzone for a 35-yard score.



For some reason, the Marauders tried to attack Barry's side for a second time. This time, Kaden Irby-Mason tipped the pass and Barry made the Prep pay for it with his second interception.



As time began winding down, the Marauders started to get some incredible bounces, albeit too little, too late. After a touchdown pass that seemed to be deflected by about four



different people, the Marauders hoped to cut BC's lead to 14. DJ Samuels thought differently. He blocked his second PAT of the afternoon and BC led 42-27.

Prep recovered an onsides kick, but the Crusader Defense shut things down in the waning moments and BC had a well-earned 42-27 victory. Time to sing the alma mater...

CHONG'S MAGIC FOOT LEADS BC TO LEAGUE SOCCER TITLE

October 22 – Ramsey, NJ – Junior Ryan Chong scored the first half goal and had an assist on BC's first goal of the second stanza to lead BC over Don Bosco Prep in a Big North Conference United Division Soccer Game that clinched a title for the Crusaders. The 3-0 victory notches it for a team hoping to wrap up an undefeated season in the BNC United with a victory over St. Joseph's this coming week. More importantly, it gave BC home-field advantage through the semi-final round of the Non-Public "A" North State Championship (more on that in the next article).



Senior captain, Kyle Tencza came up clutch with a couple of diving saves (4 on the evening) as he posted his 16th shutout of the career (4^{th} of the season).

Though the score remained knotted at 0 through much of the first half, the Crusaders dominated play with strong performance by Sebastian Londono who was around the ball all night.



KANE REACHES GLOBALLY TO HELP OTHERS BE PREPARED

October 18 - Hawthorne, NJ - Freshman Stevie Kane may currently be small in physical stature, but his leadership is extending to make a global impact, specifically in war-torn Ukraine. As a member of the Boy Scouts of America, Stevie's service Eagle Project is helping the Ukrainian soldiers. It is a project he has been dedicated to working on since the beginning of May.

Stevie raised over \$5,000 and was able to research and purchase necessary life-saving medical supplies from all over the world.

Eighty-two medical trauma kits for the Ukrainian soldiers were assembled. These kits are designed for the soldiers to wear in order to help save their lives until they reach medical help. The Kane family drove to the Ukrainian Center in Whippany on Sunday, October 9th, to deliver the assembled kits where they will then be sent overseas.

The Kanes have since learned that the military in Ukraine has received Stevie's life-saving medical trauma kits for the soldiers. Photos included in the collage include Stevie, members of his team of kit packers and Michael Halibej from the Ukrainian Center in Whippany.

The question is, "Do I post it in the Bergen Birds Group" aka Rare-bird alert? A posting like this may very well pull birders out of bed or other hot spots to travel to DeKorte Park to seek out this bird.

Well, you see the picture...what do you think it is? I saw it circling in the water as phalaropes do, so based upon size, shape and behavior, I'm going to make the call and send it out.

Let that be a reminder to all who think an app or a computer program can solve all of your problems. There is no substitute for expertise, practice, diligence, attention to detail and yes, courage. Even in birding, you have to have the guts to make the call. "It's a Wilson's Phalarope."







How to Pray the Rosary

- 1. Make the Sign of the Cross.
- 2. Holding the Crucifix, say the *Apostles' Creed*.
- 3. On the first bead, say an Our Father.
- 4. Say one *Hail Mary* on each of the next three beads.
- 5. Say the *Glory Be*
- 6. For each of the five decades, announce the Mystery (perhaps followed by a brief reading from Scripture) then say the *Our Father*.
- 7. While fingering each of the ten beads of the decade, next say ten Hail Marys while meditating on the Mystery. Then say a *Glory Be*. (After finishing each decade, some say the following prayer requested by the Blessed Virgin Mary at Fatima: *O my Jesus, forgive us our sins, save us from the fires of hell; lead all souls to Heaven, especially those who have most need of your mercy.*)
- 8. After saying the five decades, say the Hail, Holy Queen, followed by this dialogue and prayer:
 - V. Pray for us, O holy Mother of God. R. That we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ.

Let us pray: O God, whose Only Begotten Son, by his life, Death, and Resurrection, has purchased for us the rewards of eternal life, grant, we beseech thee, that while meditating on these mysteries of the most holy Rosary of the Blessed Virgin Mary, we may imitate what they contain and obtain what they promise, through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.
