2022 BERGEN CATHOLIC CRUSADERS



The Crusaders enter today's game under the direction of Head Coach, Vito Campanile, the eleventh coach in program history. Coach Campanile has done nothing but polish an apple, leading the Crusaders to back-to-back #1 state rankings and a perfect 12-0 record with a #3 ranking in the USA by MaxPreps...the highest national ranking ever in school history.

Coach Campanile's record at the helm is now a gaudy 41-8 (.837 winning percentage) through his first four years.

THE CRUSADERS ON OFFENSE



Likely the most esteemed position in NJ HS football, the QB position at BC has been strong, filled in an interesting way by two outstanding players, right-handed senior Jack Duffy #16 and left-handed sophomore Dominic Campanile #17. Together, they have helped the Crusaders to an offense that averages over 33 points pre-game. Campanile has thrown for 985 yards, 14 TDs and 3 INTs while Duffy has passed for 749 yards, 6 TDs and just 1 interception. Duffy's 71.5 Comp % and Campanile's 69.5% rate #1-2 ALL-TIME in BC single-season history.

With his 158 yards vs. Delbarton, senior RB #7 Saeed St. Fleur became BC's 9th All-time leading rusher with 2,070 yards. He passed over legendary fullbacks, Tom Kearney '87 and Joe DeFranco '94. He leads BC in scoring with 17 TDs. #6 DJ Samuels adds some speed and power on the goal line. In very limited use, he has 5 touchdowns and 234 yards rushing. Junior #1 Kaj Sanders has seen some increasing time in the backfield as of late, rushing for 7.9 yards per carry and a pair of touchdowns.

Sophomore #0 Quincy Porter has emerged as BC's top receiver. The 6'4" split end has 30 receptions for 580 yards and 11 touchdowns (ties John Tsimis at 5th for TD receptions in a season). Senior Tight End, #13 Jack Comeau has been especially deadly in the playoffs. The Princeton commit has now pulled in 24 catches for 422 yards, and 5 touchdowns. Columbia-bound #2 Christian Carti, who blocks like a man on a mission, is a top target with 20 catches, 171 yards and two touchdowns.

The Offensive line has helped the Crusaders put up overwhelming numbers against their opponents. 1,374 yards in just four games is an

average of 343.5 yards per game. More importantly, the ball is getting into the endzone. BC's offense has generated 96 points so far this season because of the logistical relocation skills of #79 Nyier Daniels (6'8, 330), #55 Dylan Garrity (6'3, 255), #64 Owen Fernandez (6'1, 265), #50 Marcus Linder (6'1, 255), #60 Michael Gentilello (6'1, 285), #67 Sean Woods (6'4, 285) and #75 Benji Shue (6'2, 260).

THE CRUSADERS ON DEFENSE



The Crusaders will be challenged to step up against the only team that defeated them this year. Attacking Don Bosco's front and getting off the field on third down will be crucial to BC's success.

With Texas-bound #90 Sydir Mitchell (5 sacks, 11.5 TFL) and Maryland-bound #6 DJ Samuels (5 sacks, 12.5 TFL) starting it off, #91 Elijah Kinsler (4.5 sacks, 4.5 TFL) and #77 Anthony Morales (4.5 sacks, 9.5 TFL) have had very strong seasons. Friday night's game needs to be their "A" on the Final Exam for BC to win.

#5 Malachi Mercer leads BC with 106 tackles and four interceptions. He is joined by talented outside linebackers, #34 Joe Barry (54 tackles, 3 INT), #29 Christian Gonzalez (82 tackles, 2 INT) and #14 Kaden Irby-Mason (24 tackles, 4.5 sacks)

Sophomore Naiim Parrish leads the Crusaders with 5 interceptions from his cornerback position. He and #8 Daquan Samuels, #3 Chris Mimmo and #1 Kaj Sanders will look to contain the Bosco air attack

BERGEN CATHOLIC SPECIAL TEAMS

#37 Guytano Bartolomeo has been outstanding on execution with extra-points. The sophomore is 45 of 46 with PATs and 1 of 2 in his field goal attempts. Senior kicker, #9 Carmelo Velardo has driven 22 of 61 kickoffs into the endzone for touchbacks. He is also 3 for 3 with his PATs.

While BC has not had very many opportunities to return kickoffs to date, sophomore Anthony Perrotti is very dangerous on the back-line with one KOR for a TD. The sophomore is averaging 29.0 yards per return on 10 returns to date. Chris Mimmo has 9 returns for 15.6 yards per return. Mimmo is also the team's punt returner, averaging 7 yards per return.

When BC punts, Brandon Arpacilar is entrusted with the task. The junior is averaging 31.5 yards per punt and a 29.4 yard net. Brandon's longest punt was a 62-yard bomb vs. Paramus Catholic. Jack Duffy is able to pooch a ball inside the 20 at strategic point of a game.

2022 DON BOSCO PREP IRONMEN



The Ironmen are coached by Mr. Dan Sabella who has been sharpening the saw since 2019. In that time, his Ironmen have achieved a record of 26-15, good for a .634 winning percentage.

While at the helm, he has faced BC six times, splitting his decisions the Crusaders. After dropping a 23-17 regular-season decision to the Crusaders in 2019, Sabella's Ironmen knocked BC out of the playoffs with a 24-7 victory at Granatell Stadium. In 2020, the Ironmen dealt what Coach Vito Campanile would call the toughest loss of his career while at BC. The 21-20 victory as time expired at The Jack is the last time BC lost a football game to date. Perhaps that game was the motivation as BC was looking to complete an undefeated, #1 ranked season during a Covid-shortened season against a 1-3 Ironman squad.

BC shut out Bosco last year at Granatell Stadium 17-0, then brought home the school's 18th state championship over the Ironmen at MetLife Stadium in November.

The Crusader win streak lasted 17 games until the Ironmen defeated BC earlier this season 31-7. This game is sure to be an interesting one!

THE IRONMEN ON OFFENSE



This has been a very potent offense for the Ironmen who average 37 points per game.

Frankly, the most dangerous element of the Ironmen may be their offensive line.

Averaging 6'3 and 295 pounds across, this line is a formidable challenge for any defense. Left Tackle #71 Chase Bisontis (6'5, 315 lbs, Sr.) is currently the top-rated recruit the state according to NJ.com. He and his linemates, Left Guard #51 Chris Moreno (6'3, 290, Sr.), Center #55 Aidan Twomey (6'0-270, Sr.), Right Guard #78 Kevin Garcia (6'4, 325, Jr.) and RT #74 Armori Francis (6'3, 270, Jr.).

Quarterback #16 Nick Minicucci is having a great start to his season statistically with 1,967 yards passing and 19 TD Passes. He has completed 132 of 211 passes (63%) and thrown only 5 interceptions.

The running game is somewhat of a three-headed monster but junior RB, #20 Logan Bush has emerged as the most dangerous player, rushing for over 1263 yards and 13 touchdowns. Minicucci has rushed for 8 touchdowns on 634 yards while sophomore #23 Nolan James has 8 TDs on 594 yards on the ground. James is equally dangerous as a receiver, leading the Ironmen with receptions (43) and pulling his total yards from scrimmage numbers over 1000 yards with his 500 yards in receptions and 6 TD receptions. The Ironmen scored seven rushing touchdowns last week in the semifinals against Seton Hall Prep in order to earn their spot in the finals. There is one more threat, senior runner #5 Ronnie Heath, who has six touchdowns on the season on 309 yards.

#15 Dan Parisi currently leads the Ironmen receivers with 556 yards and 6 TDs on 36 catches. Junior #4 Bobby Mays and senior #6 Nasim Cosby both have over 17 catches, 290 yards and three TDs as well.

THE IRONMEN ON DEFENSE

Junior Linebacker #33 Lamont Lester, #3 Connor Cosgrove and #40 lead a swarming unit. Defensive tackle #99 Jovan George leads the team in sacks. The Ironmen were able to hold the Crusaders to less than one quarter of offensive football the last time they played. If BC is not able to establish ball control, the Crusaders will have a tough time achieving the outcome they desire.

THE IRONMEN SPECIAL TEAMS

Sophomore placekicker #46 Jack Donnelly is currently 4/5 in field goal attempts and is 51/55 on PAT attempts (.927).

2022 NJSIAA PLAYOFFS: HOW WE GOT HERE

This week is the NJSIAA Non-Public, Group A State Tournament Semi-finals. The second-seeded Crusaders (9-1) take on the sixth-seeded Green Wave (6-5). On the other side of the bracket, top-seeded Don Bosco Ironmen (8-2) faces fifth-seeded Seton Hall Prep's Pirates (6-5). The winners of these games will be heading to MetLife Stadium in East Rutherford next Friday night at 6:00 PM to play for the State Championship.

ROUND ONE: Don Bosco and Bergen Catholic earned byes through the first round.

On the top half of the bracket, eighth seed, St. Augustine won in dominant fashion 45-0, defeating St. John Vianney to advance to the quarters. Fifth-seed Seton Hall proved to be too much for Pope John XXIII as they won 42-13 against the 12th seeded Lions. Fourth seeded St. Joseph Regional defeated Paul VI 45-13 to move onto the quarter finals.

Third-seeded St. Peter's Prep's offense was on a roll as they exploded to a 57-22 victory over fourteenth-seed Notre Dame. This was the single highest scoring game by a team in the playoffs so far. Six seed Delbarton beat St. Joe's Metuchen 42-6 to advance and seventh seeded Donovan

Catholic edged out Hudson Catholic in a back and forth game that would end in a 27-20 victory for the Griffins.

QUARTERFINALS: Don Bosco, the number 1 seed in this year's bracket, defeated 8th seeded St. Augustine with the final score being 37-0. Seton Hall Prep recorded a huge upset victory, scoring a touchdown with 7 seconds in regulation to come from behind. They defeated 4th seeded St. Joseph's Regional, 34-30 to advance to reach semi-finals.

Second seeded Bergen Catholic, is coming off a dominant win against Donovan Catholic. The Crusaders won 41-7. Sixth-seeded Delbarton pulled off the second big upset win of the tournament. They defeated number 3 seed, Marauders of Saint Peter's Prep. Delbarton won 35-12 going away and advance to today's game vs. BC in the semi-finals.

The stage for the semi-finals is now set. Seton Hall played in Ramsey against Don Bosco Prep last night. Delbarton is facing the Crusaders today at The Jack in Oradell.

SEMIFINALS: On Friday night, fifth seeded Seton Hall Prep travelled into an actual meteorological white-out that would become at Granatell Stadium in Ramsey. Top-seeded Ironmen found themselves in a 7-point deficit to the visiting Pirates, but then scored 27 before the half. Bosco continued to freeze out the Pirates with a 48-14 victory. Bosco plowed SHP, rushing for 403 yards. Logan Bush and Nolan James each ran for more than 150 yards and a touchdown and Nick Minicucci and Ronnie Heath each ran for two touchdowns. Jayden Richards scored on one carry for one yard, giving the Ironmen seven rushing touchdowns and 6 out of 7 PATs.

The Crusaders followed suit, playing sixth seeded Delbarton on Saturday afternoon. The Green Wave also scored first, blocking a punt and returning it for a score, but BC's defense stymied the Wave as Saeed St. Fleur ran for over 150 yards, cracking the 2,000 yard rushing mark for his career. Jack Duffy scored a pair of touchdowns and Dominic Campanile connected with Quincy Porter and Jack Comeau for a pair of TDs and giving BC a 28-7 victory to advance to the state final.

BERGEN VS. BOSCO: NEED WE SAY MORE?

This is Bergen Catholic's Rival. Say what you want about all of the others, no other game measures up to Bergen-Bosco.

Consider this, before BC opened its doors in 1955, eighth graders accepted to the two schools, selected the schools they would attend. From that point forward, in area Catholic Grammar Schools, those same boys divided up in the playgrounds at recess and the Bergen-Bosco rivalry was born. Whether it be kickball or wiffleball or tag or whatever other way you could think of to compete SCARLET AND GOLD vs MAROON means GAME ON!

Thanksgiving Day was the game day for Bergen-Bosco from 1958 through 1988. It was then, that the Northern New Jersey Interscholastic League (NNJIL) decided to break up the only Thanksgiving Day rivalry Bergen Catholic ever knew, due to its realignments of the Atlantic and Pacific Divisions.

The two teams would meet in the regular season in 1989-1991, but those meetings would become less frequent, depending upon if they matched up in the state playoffs. This time period lasted much of the 1990s as the Crusaders were dominating football in New Jersey as the state's Team of the Decade. In 1999 when the Greg Toal Era began at DBP, the Ironmen had unprecedented success against the Crusaders, putting together win streaks of eight and eleven games against the scarlet and gold in a 13-season span from 2000-2012.

Much to BC's good fortune, both Coach Toal and Coach Stengel rejoined the Crusader Coaching Staff in 2017 and helped Coach Nunzio Campanile defeat the Ironmen during the regular season and continue onto the school's 17th State Championship.

Coach Vito Campanile has been having success with the Ironmen, putting together a 5-3 record over the course of 4 seasons. The Crusaders are hoping for a repeat of last year's State Final, a sound defeat of the Ironmen, As you can imagine, the Ironmen would prefer a repeat of the two team's meeting earlier this season.

CRUSADERS WINNING STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS

The Bergen Catholic HS Football Program has a rich history of success, going back to their first championship teams in the early and mid 1960s, before the state playoff system began. We are going to take a look at the teams that won state championship games in these paragraphs to follow.

THE TONY KARCICH ERA

1979 – BC won its first tournament championship with legendary Bergen County Coach, Tony Karcich at the helm. The Crusaders defeated DePaul 14-6 at Giants Stadium in East Rutherford.



The victory was especially cherished because BC had been close for years before actually hoisting the trophy. In 1974, prior to the playoff system, BC lost to DePaul in power points, which determined the championship during the regular season. In 1975, BC fell to DePaul once again, but in overtime in a game that actually ended in a tie. The deciding factor was to be most yards in 4 plays in OT which were measured with a tape-measurer. In 1977 and '78, BC fell to Seton Hall Prep, so defeating DePaul in '79 was especially meaningful.

QB Ken Jagiello (Syracuse) and LB Joe Azelby (Harvard, Buffalo Bills) played critical roles in helping the team to victory. Azelby recovered a pair of fumbles and Jagiello ran for 81 yards and 2 touchdowns in the Crusaders option offense. In addition, he went 4 for 4 passing for 59 yards and a 2-point conversion.

1980 – Current UCLA Defensive Coordinator Billy McGovern (Holy Cross) was a speedy safety/quarterback who helped shut out Seton Hall Prep and lead BC to its second-consecutive title 12-0 at Giants Stadium. Hasbrouck Heights legend Timmy Doherty (Delaware) starred at linebacker for the Crusaders and also dove into the endzone for a three yard touchdown rush.



BC forced 6 Pony-Pirate turnovers including interceptions by McGovern and Guy Darienzo. Chuck Lester was all over the field for BC as was Joe Waters (Union College) who recovered a fumble.

1982 – Mike Morgan set the state scoring mark to beat in BC's Friday night State Championship win over Immaculata. His third touchdown of the day gave him 178 points on the season. Passaic's Craig "Ironhead" Heyward (New Orleans Saints) would score all of the Indian's 21 points (including kicking PATs) to beat him out 179-178. No matter, QB Bob Murray (New Hampshire), who threw two touchdown passes on the evening at Montclair State University came out on top, leading BC to its 1st ever #1 ranking and Star Ledger Trophy. The Crusaders a perfect finished 11-0 for the first time in program history.



THE BILL ROCA ERA

1986 – Tom Kearney (Yale) ran wild against his father's alma mater, St. Peter's Prep, leading BC to a 33-0 victory at Hinchliffe Stadium in Paterson. The senior fullback carried 25 times for 141 yards and two touchdowns behind offensive tackle Kevin Twomey (Rhode Island). QB Mike McGovern (Lehigh) connected for two touchdown passes with current New Orleans Saints Associate Head Coach, Darren Rizzi (Rhode Island). Tim Waters (USMA) solidified the defense along with All-State nose guard Anthony Matesic (Penn State). Mike and Joe Rinaldi were solid in the defensive secondary and Mike Rios provided speed at the WR position.

THE FRED STENGEL ERA

Buckle up. This is going to take a while!



1991 – In his fourth year, Coach Stengel's Crusaders won the first of ultimately 9 state championships. This is an unprecedented number at BC as are a number of accomplishments. Eric Lane (Tennessee, New York Giants), Zeke Rodgers (UConn) starred at QB and DB as the Crusaders shut down St. Joseph Regional 14-0 on a muddy Crusader Stadium. Mark Fabish (UPenn) and Mike Bajakian (Williams) played exceptionally well in the secondary with Rodgers and Scott Robinson (Yale). The Crusader line dominated with Tom Foley (UPenn), Dom Piccinich (Williams) and John Matesic (VA Tech) opening holes for Lane.



1992 - "The Game of the Century" Current BC Head Coach Vito Campanile was coached by current freshman coach (and father) Mike Campanile at Paramus Catholic as the Paladins put a scare in the undefeated Crusaders. BC won its second consecutive championship 44-34 at Harry Cooke Memorial Field at Union. The win was BC's 22nd consecutive victory.



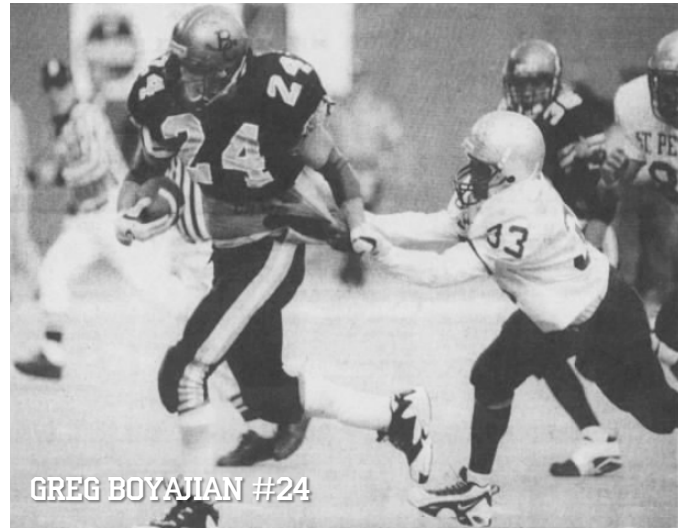
Mark DeRosa (UPenn, Atlanta Braves and a number of other MLB teams) starred at QB. He and Fabish were a devastating combination to opponents and were devastating to the Paladins on this day. Current freshman head coach, Dave Cavalluzzo (Trenton State), played the best game of his career, coming up clutch as a tight end and middle linebacker and running backs Joe DeFranco (Trenton State) and Billy Tierney (Fordham) churned out yards in the second half, keeping the ball away from the Paladins. After a late score, Ronnie DiBisceglie (USMA) recovered an onside kick to end the PC threat.



BILLY TIERNEY #11

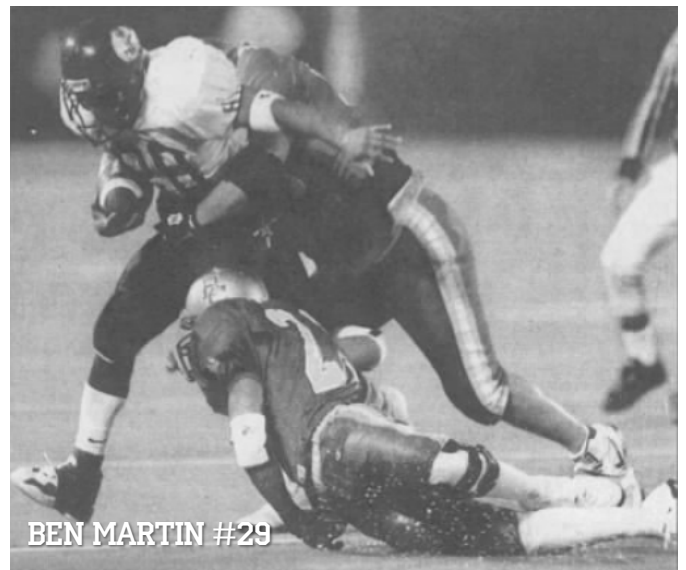
1993 - An "off" 9-2 season, following a pair of 11-0 seasons, still translated into a state championship. The Crusaders knocked off their favorite foe, Don Bosco Prep for the first time in a state title game 7-0 in a soggy Crusader Stadium. Chuck Mazzarone (New Haven) scored on a Joe Piela (UPenn) pass for the Crusaders only touchdown. Jimmy Finn (UPenn, Colts, Giants) intercepted three passes. Ryan Carfley (North Carolina) played a significant role for BC on the line of scrimmage, despite being only a junior. Captain Billy Tierney led BC on both sides of the ball.

NOTE: To this point, BC had won its state championships against unique opponents: DePaul ('79), Seton Hall Prep (80), Immaculata ('82), St. Peter's Prep ('86), St. Joseph Regional ('91), Paramus Catholic ('92), Don Bosco Prep ('93).



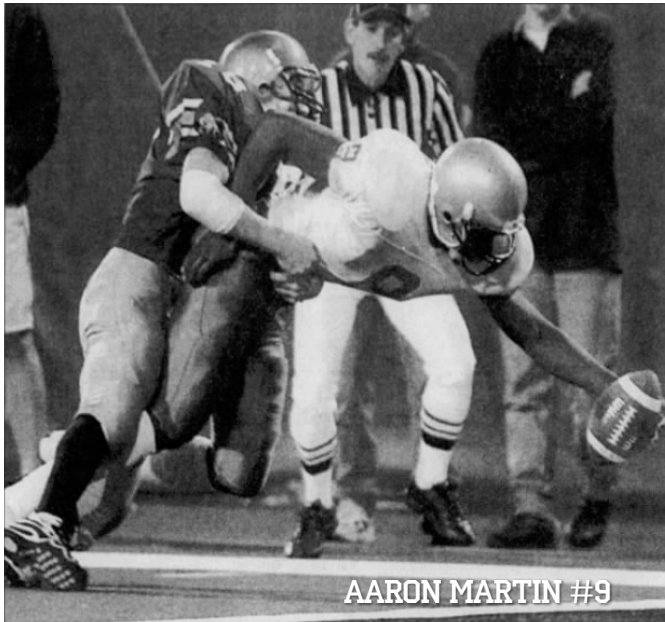
1995 - BC earned a rematch with St. Peter's Prep after falling 26-24 to the Marauders in '94. With a healthy running duo of Greg Boyajian (Cornell) and Jon Piela (Fordham), BC pounded the JC team 19-7. Piela scored one touchdown and sophomore QB, Craig Pengitore (William and Mary) scored two. Linebackers Mike Higgins (Princeton) and Taylor Suman (Temple) and defensive linemen Jimmy Telesmanich (Stanford), Carmelo Rubano (UPenn) helped to stymie the Marauder offense, holding them to 29 yards on 27 carries.

1996 - On a rainy, windy night in East Rutherford, the Crusaders defeated Holy Cross High School's Lancers 42-28 at Giants Stadium. Craig Pengitore, now a junior, ran for 3 touchdowns and passed for 247 yards and 1 touchdown in the victory. Alex Fonti (Johns Hopkins) rushed for 180 yards and Matt Student (Pomona) ran for a 54 yard touchdown. Ben Martin (Rutgers) and Jon and Ed Galan (both UPenn) along with Matt Craffey (Georgetown) led a defense that was able to contain the Lancers just enough for the victory.



1998 - The Crusaders entered the game 11-0 and as the number 2 seed in the state tournament. That said, in their minds, they were the best team ever. Ultimately the Record would recognize them as the Team of the Century. No wonder. On a perfect 67° December evening, BC defeated nationally-ranked St. Joseph Regional 35-9 in a game that was not nearly that close. Rich Scanlon (Syracuse, KC Chiefs), Jim Burt, Jr.

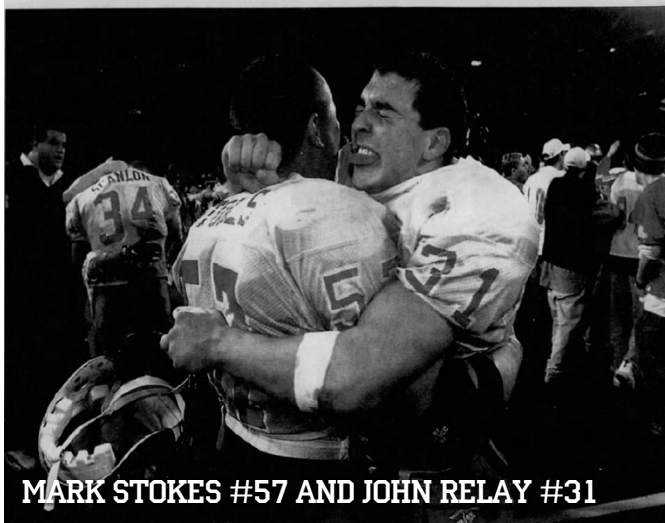
(Miami-baseball), Mark Stokes (Union), Sean Pena (Dartmouth), Jeff Muller (Penn), Chris Andreano (Cornell), John Relay (Columbia), Dom Santoli (Delaware), Steve Lhotak (UPenn), Mario Matesic (Penn State), Rob Ferranti (Iona) and Greg Abramopaulus (Northeastern) made up an incredible defense.

The team scored 599 points on the season, an average of 49.9 per game. Add in a deadly accurate kicker, Doug Kirschner (Richmond) and you had one of the best, smartest, toughest, scariest teams in school history.

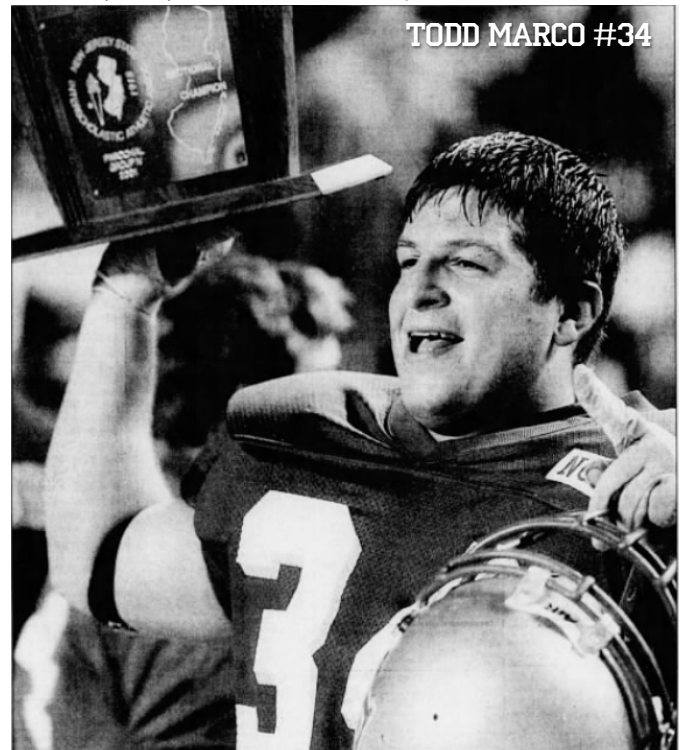


MARK STOKES #57 AND JOHN RELAY #31

1999 – Lovecchio, Santoli, Andreano and Mueller returned for their swan song and finished off Don Bosco Prep in dominant fashion 42-12. Lovecchio connected with Andreano to start things off and then Rob Bertolini rushed for four touchdowns. Mueller returned an interception for a touchdown as the Crusaders rolled.

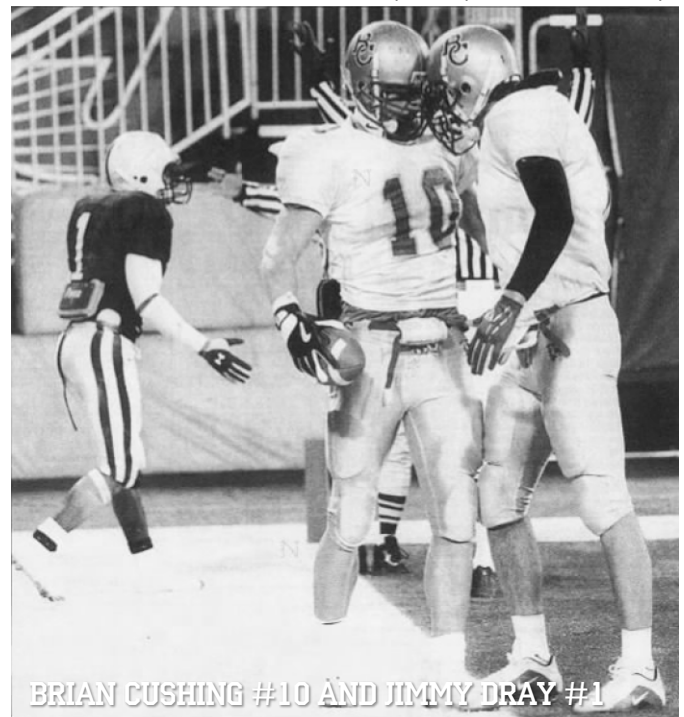
2001 – How about a fourth-quarter 45-yard field goal to win it? That's just what Chris Hanley provided in BC's 10-9 victory over Delbarton at

Rutgers Stadium. The Crusader defense was strong with Darren Marco (photo) and Robbie Holuba (Princeton) anchoring the Crusader defense. Eric Dezelan scored the lone Crusader touchdown on a Brian Saverino (Johns Hopkins) pass to the left side. Hanly's PAT was the differential.

2004 – BC. Bergen Catholic. Brian Cushing. The Crusaders' most dominant football player of all time dominated the state final. 180 yards, two touchdowns. He outran one of the state's fastest sprinters for an 80 yard rushing touchdown. He got both toes down to score at the back of the endzone as he led BC to a 13-10 championship over Don Bosco Prep.



BRIAN CUSHING #10 AND JIMMY DRAY #1

Cush became the school's second all-time leader QB sacker with 19. He was behind only teammate Brad Dussault (21) and just ahead of BC's # all-time leader Jimmy Dray (Stanford, AZ Cardinals) who had 16.

Cushing was recognized as the National Two-Way Player of the Year, Parade All-American. He starred in the Senior All-American Game in San Antonio and went on to star at USC, where he became only the second player to ever start in four Rose Bowls (Archie Griffin, 2x Heisman Trophy winner from Ohio State had done it before). He was the defensive MVP of one of those Rose Bowls and went on as a first-round draft choice for the Houston Texans, NFL Defensive Rookie of the Year, Pro-Bowl and All-Pro.

THE NUNZIO CAMPANILE ERA

2017 - Mission 17 was accomplished as BC won its 17th State Championship in 2017 at MetLife Stadium. This was the Johnny "Football" Langan show, as Langan's will would not be stopped by St. Peter's Prep's Marauders. Langan (Rutgers) was the son of former BC standout Brian Langan who starred for the Crusaders as the fullback of their 1982 State Championship team.



Rhamir Johnson (Nebraska) provided some serious footspeed in the backfield and Josh McKenzie (Yale) was an exceptional runner for BC as well. A line solidified by BC's first ever four-year starting offensive lineman, Brian Felter (Rutgers) led the charge in the 44-7 victory. This was BC's largest ever margin of victory in a state final.

On the defensive side of the ball, Javonte Jean-Baptiste (Ohio State) and Jeremiah Grant would go on to ultimately tie for the school's single-season sack record (11.5).

THE VITO CAMPANILE ERA

2021 - Coach VITO Campanile led the Crusaders to their second ever 12-0 record as Princeton-bound Running Back Ryan Butler, through grit and determination, broke nearly every rushing record in school history. The two led BC over Don Bosco Prep 28-7 at MetLife Stadium. This team was the first team to ever complete an undefeated season since the Super Football Conference United Red Division was created. It meant that BC defeated Don Bosco, St. Peters, St. Joseph Regional, Paramus Catholic, Seton Hall Prep and Delbarton all in the same season. No other team had run the gauntlet.

The 2021 Championship Game saw the Ironmen take a first quarter 7-0 lead. From that point, BC methodically scored a touchdown each

quarter, rushing for 300 yards and passing for 101. Princeton-bound Ryan Butler ran for 140 yards and two touchdowns and Saeed St. Fleur rushed for 125 yards and DJ Samuels ran for a 6-yard score. Malachi Mercer recorded 10 tackles in the game, shutting down a strong Ironman offense.



FRIDAY NIGHT LIGHTS

The Crusaders are 6-3 in State Championship Games on Friday Nights. They defeated Immaculata ('82), St. Peter's Prep ('95, '17), St. Joseph Regional ('98) and Don Bosco Prep ('99, '04). The three losses came against Don Bosco Prep ('10, '11) and Paramus Catholic ('12).

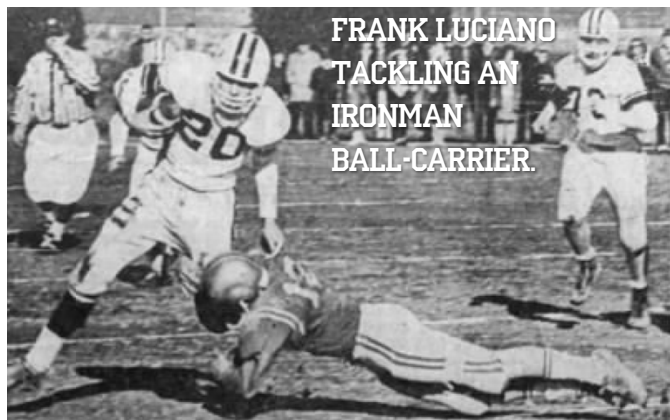
THIS DAY IN BERGEN CATHOLIC FOOTBALL NOVEMBER 25

1965 - Legendary runner Dave Stack scored 25 points as the Crusaders finished the season 9-0, despite recovering from broken ribs. The victory was Head Coach Keith Krayner's first and only state championship at the helm of BC. Bill Rabadan also scored for BC, who rolled 40-13 in Ramsey.

1971 - All about defense today! The Crusaders shutout the Ironmen as they won 7-0 in Ramsey. Ted D'Amico scored on a 65-yard run, the only touchdown, to ensure BC finished with a winning record under Coach and long-time BC faculty member Don Viggiano.

1976 - The Ironmen defeated Bergen 21-14 as talk of cancelling Thanksgiving Football Games developed with the advent of the new state playoff system. Bob Murtagh and Remo Biagione scored for BC.

1982 - All the stars performed for the #1 Crusaders who dominated Don Bosco 33-0. QB Bob Murray reached the 1,000 yard plateau (a significant accomplishment at that time). He connected with Bobby Beuhler for a TD and Mike Morgan and Brian Langan scored for BC.

1989 - The Green Knights leaned hard on the Crusaders, cruising to a 28-0 decision over BC.

1995 - BC continued its dominance over Ridgewood in the Fred Stengel Era. Jon Piela ran for two touchdowns and Will Poppe pulled in a touchdown pass and returned an interception for a TD to win 28-7.

2000 - The Crusaders fell to St. Joseph's Regional at home 21-7, marking the first and only season Coach Stengel would suffer a losing record at BC.

IT'S AN HONOR!

Coach Campanile took the helm at Bergen Catholic in 2018, succeeding brother, Nunzio, who led BC to a state championship in 2017. Coach Vito immediately found success during the 2018 season, leading BC to the state final before the Crusaders were upset by St. Joseph Regional at MetLife Stadium.



Following a five-and-four 2019 campaign, Covid-19 prevented Campanile's #1-ranked Crusaders from pursuing a state championship as the state tournament was cancelled for the season.

In 2021, Coach Campanile led BC to its 18th state championship and second-ever 12-0 record. The Crusaders were the class of the state of New Jersey and earned the school's highest ever ranking to date of #3 in the country.

In recognition of his commitment to excellence and leadership, Coach Campanile was recognized by the **USAToday** as the Nation's High School Boys Coach of the Year.

In his fifth year at the helm of BC, Coach Campanile has a record of 35-7 (.833 winning percentage), one state championship and two #1 rankings in NJ. In his 16-year head coaching career, Coach Campanile has a record of 118-57 with a .674 winning percentage.
