CRUSADER FOOTBALL LEAVES PA QUAKING AS DEFENSE DOMINATES IMHOTEP IN SEASON OPENER

September 7 – Philadelphia, PA – The day finally arrived. After a seemingly interminably long preseason, BC's football team opened on the road vs. Imhotep Charter of Philadelphia. While the Crusaders, whose Game 1 was "hurricaned" out in Fort Lauderdale last week, the home team was scrapping against two of the nation's top teams in LaSalle College Prep (PA) and DeMatha (DC).

It was an awesome defensive effort as BC held the home team to -6 yards rushing on the day, while racking up 223



yards on the ground. Ryan Butler led the Crusaders with 120 years on 19 carries for a 6.3 yards per carry average.



The offensive line of Bryan Felter, Jack Syslo, Joe Matone, Pat Collichio, Ethan Lang and Joe Aniello helped to open holes and create enough room for BC's four different rushers to find pay dirt.

Sophomore QB, Steven Angeli opened the scoring with an 8 yard TD run. The PAT failed. After Imhotep tied the score in the first, Felter blocked the PAT.

All the scoring would be done by the Crusaders from that point forward. John Rust score on a twenty-yard score in the

second quarter and a 12-6 lead BC would never relinquish.

Esquire Boyce scored a five yard TD on a well-designed counter play that had the entire Imhotep defense going right, while Boyce slashed outside the left end all alone into the end zone. Andrew Boel put the finishing touches on the game as he punched in a fourth quarter score from the 1.





But that was really only half the story. Defensively, BC was nothing short of awesome. Jeremiah Grant and DJ Samuels were ferocious on the defensive line, as was Gabriel Mendez who finished with 1 solo tackle for a loss (TFL) and two assisted TFLs.



On this night, however, THE GUY was Tywone Malone. Malone was spectacular with 1 solo TFL, 2 assisted TFLs and 2 solo sacks.



Javon Cruz, AJ Longo and Equire Boyce shot things down from their linebacker positions and Jed DeNobile, Sincere Watkins, Ben Manuelian Devon Vernon and Jordan Morant helped to shut the door on Imhotep.



This was BC's first meeting with Imhotep, but its sixth meeting with a Pennsylvania HS. The Crusaders are now 8-1 vs. schools from the state of brotherly love.



BC has a bye next week and will open their home season on Saturday, September 21 vs. St. Peter's Prep.
