

The home team enjoyed its second opportunity to host the Crusaders this year, at least through the first half. But it was BC who rose to the second half challenge, scoring two goals to one. Andrew Remias and Ryan Langberg each recorded a save in the victory.



JV Football Completes Sweep of Don Bosco Prep

September 30 – Oradell, NJ – The JV team hosted Don Bosco Prep on Monday and BC ensured they would complete a clean sweep of their longest played rival with a 21-14 victory.

Sophomore QB, Dean DeNobile threw three touchdowns

to lead the Crusaders, who improved their record to 3-0 on Monday.

Crusader Football Works Over Blue Knights as They Prepare for Green Knights

October 4 – Irvington, NJ - After an opening three and out, BC drove for touchdowns on each of their next four drives, opening a gap, Irvington would never be able to close.

Ryan Butler continued to find his home in the end zone,

Langan and Campanile Reunited on the Field at Rutgers


October 5 – Piscataway, NJ – The Scarlet Knights had an infusion of Scarlet and Gold blood at the Head Coach and QB positions on Saturday vs. Maryland.

In a peculiar week, the head coach was fired and replaced on an interim basis by former BC head coach, Nunzio Campanile. Coach Campanile turned to his state champion QB, Johnny Langan as his starter and in the first quarter, the two worked the same kind of magic they had at BC.



With Maryland ahead of Rutgers and the ball at mid-field, Campanile called one of his patented plays, a double reverse flea-flicker pass (diagramed below) which went for a 40+ yard completion and gave The Scarlet Knights life and a first and goal at the 4 yard line. This was the same play that set the Crusaders on a course for victory vs. Archbishop Wood (PA) on opening night and a number of other significant playoff games.

Langan seemed quite familiar with what to do with the ball on the play as he delivered a perfect strike to his team mate down the field.




That set up a Langan plunge from four yards off on a double-option play. Johnny received the snap from center and as he extended the ball to the running back.

As he was extending the ball, his eyes were fixed on the defensive end (**E**) who was his key. If the end ran up the

field toward Johnny, he would hand off the ball to the running back.

As it turned out the **E** was a bender, squeezing down the line of scrimmage and pursuing the running back. This opened a running lane for Langan who made a perfect read on the play and punched the ball in the end-zone.




