

Stars Out in the Morning as ESPN Radio 98.7 FM Visits BC

October 12 – Oradell, NJ – Mike Quick, Matt Simms and their crew visited BC on a crisp, beautiful Saturday morning. The special 2-hour broadcast focused on the afternoon game between BC and SJR.

Mike welcomed a number of guests, beginning with BC's dynamic President, Dr. Brian Mahoney. In front of some of the staunchest Crusader Crazy Members, Dr. Mahoney spoke about our school and its mission. He was followed by Head Coaches, Augie Hofman (SJR) and Vito Campanile (BC) and had a special phone-in guest straight from Houston, Tx: Brian Cushing '05.

It is fifteen years from what Quick describes as the "single most impressive effort" in a high school football game. Cushing scored 5 touchdowns, knocked out two linebackers and a kick return specialist. He had a number of tackles, while accounting for over 300 yards in offense on his own. It was a game with 6 NFL players including BC's Jimmy Dray, Isaiah Williams and most notably from SJR, Devon and Jason McCourty who now play DB for the New England Patriots.



One of the highlights had to be when legendary football coaches, Fred Stengel and Greg Toal joined Mike together behind the mic. Quick asked each, what the other's greatest strength was. Stengel responded first. He said immediately, "tenacity," when describing Toal's greatest strength. That has been a hallmark of Toal since his HS playing days in Hasbrouck Heights when, as a kid, I would hear countless tales of the 30+ carry Friday nights, when Toal carried the Aviators on his back.

Toal was just as quick to respond about Stengel, describing "his attention to detail," as his greatest quality. As a person who coached with Coach Stengel for 20 years, Toal couldn't have been more right. Every drill, every play, every minute in practice was planned to the 't.'

Varsity Football Falls to SJR in a Tale of Two Punts

October 12 – Oradell, NJ – So many of these games have been determined in the kicking games, it is not surprising this adds another chapter.

Was it the punt down to the SJR 1 before half, with BC leading 10-7? Unfortunately, timing is everything. The Green Knights needed to run off just one play before halftime saved them from yielding good field position to the Crusaders.

Then, just three and a half minutes into the third quarter, SJR punted the ball to the BC 2. BC started with a pair of false start penalties, moving the ball to the 1 and .5 yard line. After three incomplete passes, BC punted from its own endzone. The punt was partially blocked and a heads up Green Knight returner fielded the ball at the 25, ultimately picking up 10 more yards and setting up a first and ten at the BC 15.

In a game where BC out-gained their opponent, 275-251 and earned more first downs 17-16, it was timing of two punts that ultimately played a key part in the 28-10 loss to New Jersey's #1 ranked team.
