

After two weather postponements that necessitated combining several conference divisions, the Crusaders competed on a very crowded Darlington County Park course, and came away with one first place and two second place team performances.

In the varsity race, the Crusaders took second to Don Bosco, despite the tremendous efforts of junior Owen McCarthy (2nd), sophomore Alex Shaia (3rd), and senior Nick Martinez (4th).

The freshmen also took second in their division, behind Don Bosco, despite a terrific performance by James Hughes (3rd overall and 1st in our division), as well as Joseph Griffith and Aidan O'Malley.

The Junior Varsity were the only divisional winners on the day, led by sophomore Miles Suitt (10th overall and 3rd in our division), and chased home by sophomores Nick Pesanello and Matthew Marques.

BIRD OF THE WEEK: Bald Eagle

Fall & Winter - Bergen County, NJ – While there are at least four active nests for pairs of Bald Eagles, the fall and winter months are terrific times to view them. They move south because as you may or may not know, they LOVE FISH! And in order to catch fish, there must be running water. There is plenty of opportunities around us generally and here are some of my favorites. (Note, theses are not nestin locations, rather areas you may find bald eagles fishing or flying.)

- 1. **Oradell Avenue Train Station.** The falls at the Oradell Reservoir are a terrific place for waters to flow and fish to search out oxygenated water. A friend once told me he counted 47 bald eagles on a winter day.
- 2. **Woodcliff Lake.** Oftentimes numbers of bald eagles (I've seen 7 at once) can be seen soaring and fishing the reservoir in WCL.



- 3. **State Line Lookout.** Off the Palisades Interstate Parkway (either in Rockleigh or Alpine) there are often Bald Eagles soaring along the Hudson River in search of food or in the fall, migrating along the river.
- 4. **Overpeck** Park Ridgefield Park Eagles love the river and can be seen in the trees along the riverside.
- 5. Pascack Valley NJTransit Line Want a treat? Check out the eagles on the eastern side of the river as you take a morning trip to the city by train. Best spots seem to be through Oradell, New Milford and River Edge.
