**100 Breaststroke** - Sam Hughes took 1st place.



## Swimmers Qualify for NJ MOC, Sectionals and National Events

to a fast team start locally but also recently had several swimmers qualify for individual state,

sectional and national championship events with new best times. In December, Tim Anderson, Julian Chun, Thomas Haemmerle, Sam Hughes, Alex Rose, and Ben Rose qualified for the NJ High School State Meet of Champs (MOC) which will be held on February 29 and March 1. With 6 swimmers already qualifying and several others on the cusp, BC is closing in on matching a school record of 7 different swimmers competing at the NJ MOC in individual events.

Going beyond state level competitions, sophomore Andrew Mazzacano recently qualified for the 2020 USA Swimming Sectional Championships to be held later this spring with a new best time in the 200-yard breast stroke. Andrew was swimming at MIT last weekend for the Condors Swim Club while achieving these new time standards.

Junior Thomas Haemmerle qualified for the YMCA National Championships to be held in Greensboro, North Carolina in April with a new best time in the 500-yard freestyle event while swimming at the Nassau Aquatic center last weekend.

Finally, Senior captain Julian Chun improved upon his previous times in both the 100 and 200-yard breaststroke events and qualified for USA Swimming Jr. National Championships which are held at Georgia Tech. Julian also achieved at Futures cut in the 200 IM while swimming for Scarlet Aquatics at Rutgers University last weekend.


## BOTW: Northern Pintail

**December 22 – Lyndhurst, NJ –** This week's bird of the week is the Northern Pintail, an attractive dabbling duck that frequents ponds in this area during the winter months (as water in its liquid state is available).



Dabbling ducks are the kind that tilt over to feed on vegetation below the surface of the water. This is how they differ from diving or sea ducks that can pursue prey below the surface after diving.

Northern pintails, as their name would suggest, have a pin-shaped tail that is especially conspicuous when they are upside dabbling down in the water for food, and the tail is pointed skyward. They are slightly smaller than a mallard and have a beautiful chestnut brown head, light grey-blue bill and white stripe which works up the backside of its neck into its head.
