CRUSADERS DELAYED THEN ADVANCE TO STATE SEMIS

November 13-14 - Oradell, NJ - The Crusaders took



another step in the NJSIAA Non-Public "A" State Tournament on Saturday and Sunday in a weatherdelayed game against

Donovan Catholic, winning by a score of 35-7.

For the first time since November 2-3, 1997, the Crusaders had an opportunity to start a game and "sleep on it" before completing it the next day. That game started at BC as they took apart Teaneck High School 47-6, but interestingly enough, the game was finished at Teaneck High School as the old Crusader Stadium was a quagmire, unplayable even in those days.

The Crusader sword was sharp to start as BC drove down the field and scored in just 3:00 to open the game.



The big play of the drive was a fabulous scramble and pass by QB, Steve Angeli and incredible reception by Saeed St.Fleur.





Saeed's twisting, diving effort took him into the end-zone, but somehow, the referee (fortunately called it a catch) but unfortunately missed the fact that he scored a TD. The ball was spotted at the one-yard line and two plays later, Angeli took a QB sneak over the goal line for the game's first score. Giancarlo Carbonaro drove his first of five points-after-touchdown and the Crusaders were moving.

SACK CHAMPION

The Griffins held the ball for a little, putting together a small drive that ended up with a punt that started BC at their own 20-yard line with 3:01 remaining in the quarter. DJ Samuels recorded his 21st Career Sack for the Crusaders which led to a 3rd and 20 for the Griffins. That sack broke a 17-year school record, previously held by BC linebacker Brad Dussault '05, a captain of the Crusaders 2004 State Championship Team.

That was just enough time for BC to punch in another score before the quarter would end.

BUTLER SCORES 1ST OF 4 TDs

After a pass interference call against DC on first down, Angeli found Ryan Butler and completed a pass to him for 30-yard gain. Butler would take another pass from Angeli into the endzone for an 8-yard touchdown reception and BC was in business.

The second quarter was not necessarily the type of quarter BC strives to play. Donovan Catholic moved the ball and scored on a well-executed 48-yard touchdown pass that moved them within a score of the top-seed.

LIGHTNING STRIKES

With 2:22 remaining in the half, the Crusaders punted, pinning the Griffins inside their 10 yard-line at the nine. Just then lightning struck as multiple cold fronts changed a relatively comfortable November afternoon into a mess. After waiting for approximately an hour, it was clear there would not be another opportunity to finish the game on Saturday. DC hopped on their buses to go back to Toms River and BC closed up for the night to get ready for a 1:30pm Sunday start.



The game picked up with under 2:22 in the half and DC trying to move the ball to escape precarious field position. They were able to do so and the teams went to halftime. Neither team went to the locker room. Rather, they stayed at their sides of the field for a 10-minute (required by rule) break.



Donovan received the second half kickoff, but had to wait to start from the 20-yard line as Carmelo Vellardo drove the ball into the endzone for a touchback. After a three and out, sophomore special team specialist, Chris Mimmo fielded a punt at the 45-yard line and returned it 16 yards to give BC first-and-ten at the 29.



One play was all that was needed as Steve Angeli put the ball in the strong hands of Ryan Butler who found a hole off right tackle and sprinted 29-yards for his second touchdown of the day.



Butler would go on to score another touchdown in the third and one more in the fourth to finish off DC

EXTRA POINTS: UNDEFEATED – 2021 marks the 7th time, BC went undefeated and untied (10-0) during the regular season and into the first round of the playoffs (82, 91, 92, 94, 97 and 98). The 2021 Crusaders are pursuing a championship season and the eighth undefeated and untied season in school history. The last perfect season was under the direction of Coach Fred Stengel in 1998.



The Crusaders finished 12-0 and #1 in the state of New Jersey. Coach Stengel's Crusaders were undefeated twice before as well in 1991 and 1992, putting a 23-game win streak together that ended during the 1993 season.

Coach Tony Karcich led BC to one undefeated season in 1982, his last season at the help of the Crusaders. He also led the Crusaders to an undefeated state championship in 1979 (10-0-1). Keith Krayer led Bergen to an undefeated, state-champion season in 1965 and Bob Norton led BC to an undefeated season in 1966.

INDIVIDUAL MILESTONES AND ACHEIVEMENTS

Ryan Butler's career statistics become more impressive historically every game. Butler's 475 career carries earn the #2 overall rank out of all BC rushers. His 2,833 yards place him #3 all time in Rushing Yards, just ahead of Wolver Jean-Pierre '05 and Justin Dunleavy '98 on the all-time list. Butler's three rushing touchdowns lifted ahead of Eric Lane '93 (former NY Giants FB) and now places him #3 all-time. Butler now has 36 rushing touchdowns in his career.



Ryan is in sole place of third all-time with 282 points and 47 TDs. He is currently 24 points behind Mike Morgan '84 and 44 points behind #1 Joe Sandberg '03. Ryan's 126 points this year, ties him for 10th overall with Nick Gerst during a single season. Ryan is tied for second with Morgan '84 with 41 career rushing touchdowns. He is 9th overall for single-season touchdowns, but just 5 away from the school record, held by Eric Lane '92 (24). Only one Crusader has carried the football more times than Butler (491) from scrimmage in his career...Joe Sandberg with 515 carries.

QB Steve Angeli added to his outstanding season, now

passing for 1,227 through 9 games (he's played in 8). Angeli's 2,441 total passing yards moves him into 9th All-Time ahead of former Seattle Seahawk, Tanner McEvoy '11. Steve is 6th All-Time in



completions (177) and is now 7th overall with pass attempts in a career (275).

Steve has completed over three-quarters of his passes this year (72.1%) and averages 15.4 yards per completion. His current completion percentage would rank him #2 all-time behind Brad Hartung '05 and just ahead of legendary passers Mark DeRosa '93 and Matt Lovecchio '00.

Placekicker, Giancarlo Carbonaro is currently working his way up the charts with kicking points. The senior has 58 points on the season, placing him seventh just behind Chris Hanley '03 (63 pts in 2001 and 59 pts in 2002). He is also tied for seventh all-time in Career Kicking Points with 98 behind Buck Elsey '96. In addition, Giancarlo is currently tied with Mike Halligan '10 for fifth overall, with 7 career field goals.



Defensive Lineman, DJ Samuels, broke the school's All-Time Sack Record on Saturday with his 22nd, a solo sack of the quarterback in the first quarter of the game on Saturday. DJ set the new standard, breaking the 17-year-old record of 21 held by Brad Dussault '05. Congratulations DJ!





History: With their win over Donovan Catholic, the Crusaders playoff record improved to 59-29 overall record (.670 winning percentage) in the NJSIAA Tournaments since BC's first appearance in 1975.

The Crusaders have won 14 state championships since the tournaments began, (17 overall) with the most recent coming in 2017 and BC's 44-7 victory over St. Peter's Prep.

Semifinals: The Crusaders have been very tough in the semifinals, posting a 27-9 record (.750 winning percentage) in 36 appearances in the penultimate game. In that time, the Crusaders have won. Bergen is even tougher when those games are played at home, posting a 15-2 record (.882 winning percentage).

Overall, the Crusaders and Marauders have matched up 28 times since 1972. The Crusaders won the last two meetings between the two schools in 2020 and 2021. The last time SPP won, was in 2019 at Caven Point. BC holds a 15-13 overall advantage in the series.

BIRD OF THE WEEK: YELLOW-BELLIED SAPSUCKER

November 13 – Rockleigh, NJ – How lucky was I to find one of my favorite birds on Saturday! No other bird, in my experience, brings a more joyful reaction when you utter its name. Here's a little more from Cornell University's allaboutbirds.org website:


If you spot rows of shallow holes in tree bark in the East, this is the work of the Yellow-bellied Sapsucker, an enterprising woodpecker that laps up the leaking sap and any trapped insects with its specialized, brush-tipped tongue. Attired sharply in barred black-and-white, with a red cap and (in males) throat, they sit still on tree trunks for long intervals while feeding. To find one, listen for their loud mewing calls or stuttered drumming.

The Yellow-bellied Sapsucker makes two kinds of holes in trees to harvest sap. Round holes extend deep in the tree and are not enlarged. The sapsucker inserts its bill into the hole to probe for sap. Rectangular holes are shallower, and must be maintained continually for the sap to flow. The sapsucker licks the sap from these holes, and eats the cambium of the tree too. New holes usually are made in a line with old holes, or in a new line above the old.

The sap wells made by Yellow-bellied Sapsuckers attract humming birds, which also feed off the sap flowing from the tree.

The Yellow-bellied Sapsucker frequently uses human-produced materials to help in its territorial drumming. Street signs and metal chimney flashing amplify the irregular tapping of a territorial sapsucker. The sapsucker seems to suffer no ill effects of whacking its bill on metal, and a bird will return to a favorite sign day after day to pound out its Morse code-like message.
