Hockey Starts Season with Emphatic Victory

November 29 – Hackensack, NJ – Coach Keough and his Crusaders have been looking forward to this evening since last March. It was an opportunity to make a statement. This was not simply for a moral victory with a close loss. This was an opportunity to show that moral victory was actually the sign of the growth of the Crusader Hockey Program.

As one might expect, the game, livestreamed on Facebook, started out with two heavyweights feeling each other out for the first period. But after a scoreless 18 minutes, the Crusaders started to get something going.

Nick Stoebling used his speed to create offense and unsettle a normally composed Green Wave defense. As the Crusaders moved the puck, it wound up at the top left point where junior defenseman, Brenden Kelly let a hard wrist shot go toward the net. Stoebling redirected the puck into the top right corner and BC grabbed a lead it would never relinquish at the 11:15 mark.

Later in the period, BC found themselves with a power play and senior defenseman, Jake Antonucci skated backward across the top of the offensive end. The Green Wave chose not to respect his shooting ability and Nooch made them pay with a laser at the 4:13 mark in the second, extending BC's lead to 2-0.



Prayer of Thanks for Blessed Edmund Rice


