

may have provided some special inspiration to the Crusader team following Monday's surprise upset at the hands of St. Augustine Prep. Right from the opening face-off, it was clear things would be different.

Aram Minnetian took the opening face-off and before the Pirates knew what his them, BC had its first goal of the afternoon on a Minnetian stick-side-high shot off a loose puck in the high slot.

While Seton Hall held BC in check for the remainder of the period, BC took care of business in the second. Nick Stoebling showed the value of forechecking as he intercepted a pass deep in the SHP zone and converted on a quick snap shot to give BC a 2-0 lead with 13:22 remaining in the period.

Just fifty-nine seconds later, Tommy Olson converted on a bouncing puck that was flipped over the goal from behind by Aram Minnetian.

Minnetian scored a power play goal with 2:06 left in the second to boost BC's lead to 4-0. It was the freshman's fifteenth goal of the season.

Seton Hall would have a strong third period, outscoring the Crusaders 2-0, but not enough to overcome BC's early lead. Final score: BC 4 - SHP 2.

# Swimmers Take Out NJ #5 St Peters Prep with Depth Charge

**January 9 – Jersey City, NJ** – In what was easily the most anticipated meet of the season so far, the Crusaders sank NJ's 5th ranked Saint Peters Prep 96-74 last Thursday evening. St Peters ranking is well deserved as they are led by several seasoned veterans including one who has already



qualified for this summer's 2020 US Olympic Trials. BC's depth and versatility were clear differences, especially when coupled with so many strong finishes into the wall by the Crusaders.



In each individual event, both schools entered the maximum 3 swimmers each. Despite St Peters winning 5 of the 8 individual events, they only outscored Bergen in 1 individual race as the 2nd and 3rd BC swimmers consistently outperformed their counterparts. In 5 of the 8 individual events, BC had 3 swimmers finish in the top 4 and no BC swimmer finished 6th in an event.

The Crusaders delivered a strong message to open the night, as junior Sam Hughes locked down a 1st place finish by swimming the anchor leg of the 200 Yard Medley Relay behind seniors Ben Rose, Julian Chun and Tim Anderson to take an early lead.



In the 2nd race, BC outscored the Marauders as they took home 2nd, 3rd and 4th in the 200 Yard Freestyle event with Julian Chun, Tim Anderson and junior Thomas Haemmerle, respectively. This trend continued in the Individual Medley as seniors Ian Liu, Ben Rose and sophomore Andrew Mazzacano finished 2nd, 3rd & 4th as the trio pulled away from the pack in the third leg with dominant breast stroke performances. Entering the 50 Yard Freestyle event, eyes were on the speedy Marauders, but the Crusaders were aggressive to the wall with just enough to finish 3-4-5 as Sam Hughes finished 3rd just ahead of

sophomores Alex Rose and Christian Skaff allowing the Crusaders to hold on to a narrow 32-30 lead.

The Crusaders then extended their lead in the next two races with 1st place finishes to go along with solid team performances. Alex Rose provided some outside smoke winning the heat from lane 6 as Tim Anderson and junior Alex Vester stepped up to finish 2nd and 4th. Then Julian Chun delivered the finish of the night out touching his St Peters opponent to win the 100 Yard Freestyle event followed by equally fantastic finishes from freshman Gavin Perez and Skaff who finished 3rd & 5th, respectively. These two races opened up a 54-40 BC lead.

The steady distance team of Haemmerle, Alex Vester and senior Chris LaBianco cruised to a 2-3-4 in the 500 Yard Freestyle event, leading into the 200 Yard Freestyle relay. In the relay Alex Rose, Ian Liu, Tim Anderson and Sam Hughes finished 2nd, while a strong closing leg from Haemmerle pulled ahead of St Peters' 2nd team enabling the Crusaders combination of Skaff, freshman Jayden Lee, LaBianco and Haemmerle to pull out a 3rd place finish which was helpful as there are no points for 4th place in relay events.



BC broke even in the 100 Yard Backstroke event with a 2-3-5 finish from Ben Rose, Sam Hughes and freshman Matt Semelsberger before the 100 Yard Breaststroke team of Liu, Mazzacano and Perez secured victory on the team race with a 1-2-3 finish putting the Crusaders up 90-66 with 1 relay event left. The balanced BC roster was not going to rest easy and secured both 2nd & 3rd in the 400 Yard Freestyle Relay event. The 2nd place team included Haemmerle, Chun and the Rose brothers, while 3rd place was locked up by Liu, Alex Vester, Mazzacano and Perez. This finished the scoring off as BC remained undefeated on the year with a 96-74 victory.

#### JV Hoops Overwhelms DePaul


**January 9 – Oradell, NJ** – The JV basketball team defeated DePaul Catholic 67-41 on Thursday evening, improving their record to 6-2.

January 10 – Paramus, NJ – While the Paramus Catholic wrestling program is making improvements, Friday night




showed that BC is still eons ahead of their neighbors to the west, taking eleven out of fourteen bouts.

# Two National Powers Spar as Grapplers Wrestle with Bears


January 11 - Oradell, NJ - Buchanan High School from

significant for the #7 ranked Crusaders in this match as Buchanan jumped out to a 3-0 lead.


Dylan Cedeño tied the score at three, with a 6-2 victory at 132. Following a major decision for the Bears, Joe

#### LuHi Outlasts Crusaders 75-61


January 11 - Bronx, NY - The Crusaders fought hard

# Crusaders Post Some Impressive Times at Paul Schwartz Invitational



# **BOTW: Rufous Hummingbird**

January 11 - Bergen County, NJ - Hummingbirds in

January are rare. Rufous hummingbirds in Bergen County in January? Well, that's really, really rare (not sure that's a scientific measurement, but I hope it will suffice).



Normally, Ruby-throated hummingbirds are the only species that occur in the eastern portion of the country. With winds and migration their clockwise migration pattern, however, these three-inch wonders can get blown off-course and in this part of the country. Their normal



migration flight moves from Alaska, 3,900 miles to Mexico. When they head back north, they will fly along the Pacific Ocean Coast.

I took these two photos and shared to compare the greenish coloration of its primaries (at feeder), but when in flight (wings moving 52-62 beats per second) its rufous sides become more conspicuous. This bird is a female. Males are primarily orange/rufous colored.
