Crusaders Send Clear Message: This Is Not Sparta; or Paramus

January 13 – Oradell, NJ – The Crusaders defended their home mat against a sparse Spartan squad on Monday night. The visiting Paramus team forfeited 5 of 14 weight classes, helping BC to a lopsided 58-21 victory.

Crusaders who actually wrestled included Riley Halal, Eric Broadie and Alex Strashinsky was dominant in his defense of the home mat as well.

Hughes Hattie Helps Bergen Buck Rams

January 11 – Hackensack, NJ – Matt Hughes opened the scoring for BC on Saturday night and then tied the score in the second and gave BC a lead with his third goal. It was a lead the Crusaders would not relinquish.

JT Verdino assisted Hughes at the seven-minute mark of the first period to give BC a 1-0 lead. After Ramsey tied the score, Michael Spinelli was assisted by Zachary Cestero (who finished with one goal and two assists on the evening) to give BC a short-lived lead. The Rams would score two goals in the next sixty-three seconds to take a 3-2 lead into the second.

The second period was then the Hughes and Cestero show, and while the Rams added a late goal with under 20 seconds remaining, BC did not lose focus as it entered the third period.

Ethan Leja opened the goal scoring in the third, assisted by Steve Saxton and Max Baldomir and Joe Garcia was set up by Leonard Carlucci and Jake Barnes to extend BC's lead to 7-4. Charlie Borg started and finished the game in goal turning away 25 shots, giving him an 84% save percentage on the evening.

Crusaders Bowl Over Ghosts

January 13 – Hackensack, NJ – John DelJuidice led the bowlers with a 491 series as BC took 7 points away from Eastside in victory. Tommy Muir rolled a 185 which was the highest game of any bowler on the day. BC took all three games and total pins from Paterson Eastside 1774-1215.

As the Ghosts had no bowlers, their spots are represented as "Blind", with a score of 110 pins for each bowler each game. BC defeated them, winning both games and taking total pins, 1019-880 to earn all 5 points.

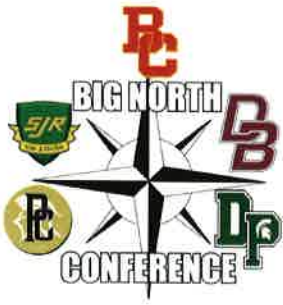

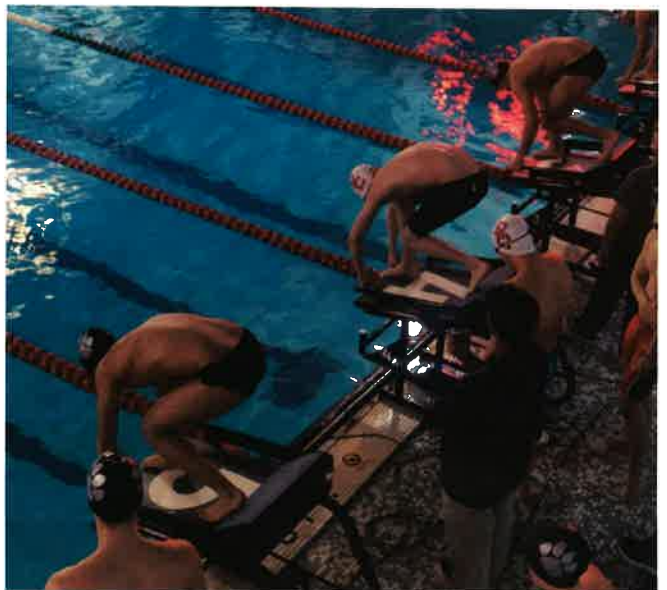

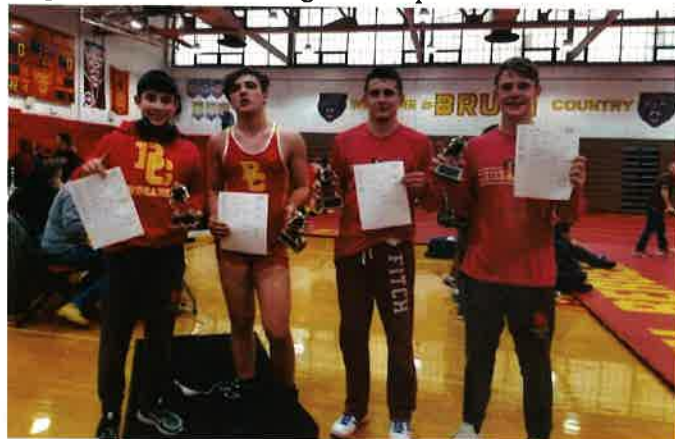

BOTW: Four Birds from a Mom

January 15 – All Over, Various Years – Well here we go. First, I would like to thank Maria Guglielmo Walsh, mom of Will Walsh '21 for providing us with this “Can you name this bird?” challenge.



So we will give it our best try starting with the gull to the top left side of the collage. It looks like a juvenile **Herring Gull**. While I can't see the size of the bird, it seems to have a large bill, which might rule out Ring-billed Gull (BOTW Week 18).

Clockwise, to the right, is one of the more aesthetically-challenged species, the **Black Vulture**. It shares certain similarity to Turkey Vultures, which are also large omnivores, but the black face suggests this bird is a different species. I did not see the coloration and size of the bird flying, which could change my mind, but for now, I stick with Black Vulture.

Continuing clockwise is a lovely **Cattle Egret**. You will see these as you travel through the south. As you may expect, these egrets, similar sized to our Snowy Egrets (which are all white) can be found more on grasslands as opposed to marshes.

Finally, this “black-headed” gull is NOT a Black-headed gull (Bonus BOTW Week 18). It is a species very common to the Jersey shore (and most eastern shores). They steal your popcorn and then laugh at you. It is an attractive gull known as a **Laughing Gull**.

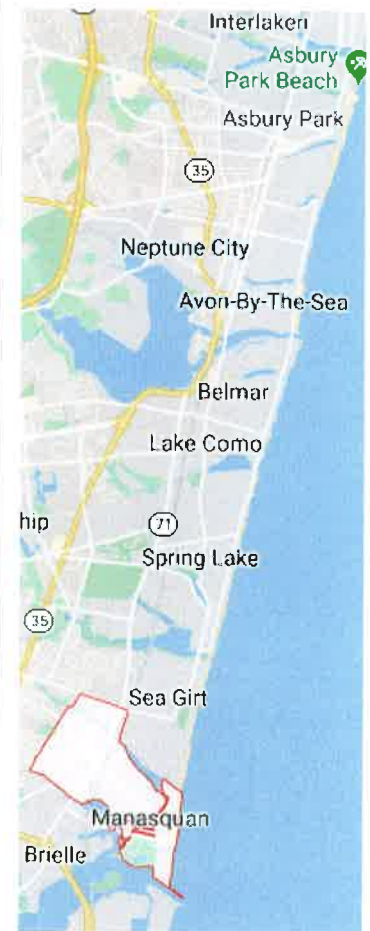
