BC Advances to County Final with MLK Day Win Over SJR

January 20 – Wayne, NJ – Monday night's BCCA Hockey Semi-final faced off with BC in the home whites vs. St. Joseph Regional.



Whether it was mid-term exam lag, or the result of playing at the end of a long weekend, both teams came out testing one another, but not producing on the offensive end through the first quarter. It did not take BC long to open up the second, however as Nicholas Wallace scored a power-play goal just 59 seconds into the second period off a Mick Thompson assist to give BC a 1-0 lead. The green knights tied the score just 63 seconds later, but BC did not allow the lead to last.



Senior defenseman, Dan Scot found a red-hot Nick Stoebling just forty-five seconds later to give BC a 2-1 lead. Six minutes later, SJR would score and the second period would end with the teams knotted at two and just fifteen minutes to determine who would be playing for a county title.

The Green Knights, undefeated to this point in the season, would see that perfection scuffed up as Devon Kelly converted a pass from Jake Antonucci and Wallace, with the second assist at the 14:19 mark left in regulation. That gave Mrs. McCaskey nearly an entire period to watch her son, Brendan, play perfectly in the goal. Goalie's mom

has got to be the hardest position in hockey, but Brendan made it easy on mom, finishing with 19 saves in the victory.

Crusaders Win First County Championship in 39 Years!

January 23 – Wayne, NJ – It has been a while...thirty-nine years to be exact, since Bergen won a county championship. The School had a mini-county dynasty going on when the Islanders ruled the Hockey world and a USA team inspired the country through its Miracle! Yes! Add 2019 to the list of 1978, 1980 and 1981 as Antonio Arcaroli and crew made the dream a reality on Thursday Night.



Hockey is an interesting game. It's definitely a blink and you could miss something kind of a game, but even if you miss the "something," there is so much energy, you can't help but get caught up in it.



That's what happened for Crusader faithful when forechecking Tommy Olson, created a turnover and then found the back of the goal, unassisted at the 7:58 mark. It was the first goal BC had against the Ironmen in seventy-three minutes and forty-four seconds of play.

It reflected what Nick Stoebling said during a homeroom interview. "We had a different mentality this time. We were more confident in our systems. We saw them once before and were working hard. It's always important to score first, to take the lead and not chase. It just makes the game much easier.

To do this, Stoebling said the team needed to eliminate defensive zone mistakes. It worked. The Crusaders completed the first 15-minute period with a 1-0 lead and confidence.



As determined as the Crusaders may have been to extend the lead, the 8-time defending champions were in no way ready to relinquish their crown without a fight.

At the 5:15 mark remaining in the second, the Ironmen shot the puck past the goal line and the game was tied. It would remain that way until the third period.

When asked about the team's mindset following the second intermission, all tied up, Stoebling responded, "We know we have the skill to put shot in. Our signature is to play strong defensive hockey.

Before you settled in for the ultimate period, Stoebling found tournament MVP Antonio Arcaroli breaking toward the goal. Arcaroli ripped a shot and BC was just 12:38 away from shocking the New Jersey Hockey world.

Two minutes and one second later, Stoebling was left alone at the blue line, just in front of the Ironmen bench. He got his stick on a tremendous pass from Nick Chiurazzi and skated toward the goal. Stoebling beat the keeper 5-hole (between his legs). Now, the finish line was REALLY IN SIGHT.

Still, with the experience of 28 consecutive wins in Bergen County, the Ironmen would not go away. With just 1:26 remaining Bosco pulled their goalie and scored a power-point goal.
