CONGRATULATIONS TO COACH PETE BERKANISH

October 22 - Ramsey, NJ - Head Soccer Coach reached a milestone following his last visit to Granatell Stadium. Not only did the Crusaders clinch the BNC United Championship, the sixth in Coach Pete's eight-year tenure, they helped him to reach the 100-career victory milestone. His team also won a county title, the school's third, in 2019.



Coach Berkanish's overall record as the Head Varsity Coach is 104-26-12. His .775 winning percentage is the highest of all nine head coaches in Crusader history. Coach Berkanish's win total is second among BC soccer coaches behind long-time coach, Hugh Beattie with approximately 177 victories.

BOAKYE, HANLON, JENNINGS & SHORTRIDGE STANDOUT IN CRUSADERS' BIG HALLOWEEN WIN

October 31 - Paramus, NJ - by, Will Dodds '25 - BC's JV Football Team defeated Paramus Catholic on Monday, 31-8. The Crusaders were led by Andrew Boakye and Ben Carey defensively. Shane Hanlon, Nigel Jennings, and Nick Shortridge led the way offensively. The JV squad improved to 5-2 to finish off the JV season.

Quarterback Nigel Jennings took the design run into the endzone to put the Crusaders on the board first. Shane Hanlon with the extra point right down the middle put the Crusaders up 7-0 at the end of the first.

Jennings found wideout Shane Hanlon for a 75 yard screen pass that put the Crusaders on the 5 yard line.

Running back Mujahid Russell finished the drive with a 5 yard touchdown run. The unsuccessful trick play on the PAT put the Crusaders up 13-0 through 2 quarters of play.

To start the second half quarterback Nigel Jennings connected with wideout Shane Hanlon once again for a huge 60 yard touchdown. The Crusaders continued to dominate offensively. Mujahid Russell's 48 yard run to the two yard line set up a Nick Shortridge 2 yard touchdown run. That wasn't the only time Nick Shortridge would reach the endzone. Later in the 4th quarter Nick Shortridge ran for a 76 yard touchdown, making it two touchdowns on the day. The Crusaders did not convert the extra point and finished the day with a strong 31-8 victory.



The Crusaders defense was strong all game. Cornerback Andrew Boakye finished the game with 3 interceptions. Teammate Michael Rinaldi added an interception himself at the safety position. These huge interceptions created great field position for the Crusaders offense who did not let it go to waste. Linebacker Will Dodds led the team in tackles, finishing with 6 total tackles. Defensive Lineman Ben Carey added 5 tackles himself and a sack. The defense was complete all game, only allowing one touchdown.

CRUSADER DEFENSE PUTS DEATH NEAL ON WAVE AS LODONO SCORES!!!

November 5 - Oradell, NJ - The Crusaders and Green Wave battled in front of a crowd of over 500 at The Jack on a picture perfect Saturday morning. In the middle of the field, Spencer Neal defended the scarlet and gold BC emblem as if everything depended upon it. And in soccer terms, it did.

Neal and his Crusaders went on to shut out Delbarton 1-0 using a suffocating defense that bent but never broke and

some opportunistic offense to advance to the Non-Public "A" North Title Game at Seton Hall Prep vs. the Pirates on Wednesday, November 9th at 2:00 pm.

The first half saw the ball in the Crusaders' end for a majority of the time, but the BC defense led by Conor Morrin and Luca Duardo, kept the Green Wave at bay. In the most dangerous attack on the BC goal, Kyle Tencza got his hand on a Delbarton blast ricocheted crossbar in the 39th minute.

Delbarton made another run with a header off the crossbar in the 45th minute and the scored remained knotted at 0.

Tyler Ferris was working the ball up the right wing as a good portion of the early second half. centering pass to wide open Sebastian Ortega in the 50th minute. Before he could get a foot on it, the ball was scooped away by the Blue Man Goalie.

Tencza came up large again for BC, turning away a direct kick from 24 yards out in the 57th minute of play. Not only were goals hard to come by, to this point in the contest, only one turkey vulture had flown over the game. With the warm air, one would think the thermals...(put this thought on hold. WE JUST SCORED!)

In the 61st minute, Graham Ewers made a pass to the left wing. Teammate, Sebastian Londono used a change of speed to drive by his man and create a 1v1 with the goalie. He stepped in from his left wing and drove the ball on the ground past the Delby keeper to the far corner to give BC a 1-0 lead.

As the game entered its 70th minute, emotion started racing at a frenzied pace. The Green Wave desperately and aggressively attacked the goal. Tencza came up big, time and time again. First on a save of a centered one-timer in the 73rd minute and then taking away angle to force an extreme angle shot off the crossbar in the 74th minute. He made another one in the 75th minute and then, a heart-stopping moment.

In the beginning of the 73rd minute a ball on the right wing was driven into the goal, but wait. There was a whistle. Offsides! Offsides! No Goal! No Goal! A waver received the game's first yellow card for expression of displeasure with an official.

As the game entered the final minutes, the Wave needed to push the ball up field. Within seconds of one another, a flying Londono fully laid out and blocked kicks with his body. Both were exemplary of the way he and all of his Crusader teammates gave all they had to earn this victory.

SPORTS ALUMNUS OF THE WEEK PROFILE

MR. JACK CHIMENTO '72

October 12 - Oradell, NJ - by, Carter Pontone '23 - This week's recipient of the Alumnus of the Week Award is Jack Chimento '72. Chimento was the BC basketball team captain in 1972.

He was an outstanding basketball player during his years at BC and went on to play college basketball. Chimento attended the University of Hartford for one year, then transferred to Iona College for his last three years.

He played two years of college basketball at Iona College and once he graduated from Iona, he decided to also get his MBA from there as well. He would go on later to have a very successful career on Wall Street.

Chimento worked at Bear Stearns, an Investment Banking Company on Wall street for over 20 years. He is in the Bergen Catholic Hall of Fame for his impressive career at BC and for his past position as Board Chairman of Bergen Catholic. I got the chance to talk to Chimento about his years at BC, his career, and some advice he has for students.

What was your biggest achievement at BC?

BC helped me obtain a good education in college and helped me meet a network of classmates and alumni and built connections that have lasted over 50 years. Sports wise, my biggest achievement was beating Hackensack in the semi-finals of the Bergen County jamboree in 1972. That was the highpoint of my high school career. I scored 31 points and I made the game winning basket with no time left on the clock. Hackensack was number one in the county at that time, so it was a big win against a tough opponent.

Who are some people at BC who influenced you in a positive way?

Some people who influenced me at BC were Dennis Rossi, the JV basketball coach and Coach Donfield's assistant. I had a great deal of respect for him and he was a great coach and motivator. Coach Chris Donfield was another guy who influenced me for his dedication to the basketball program and his ability to help kids get into great schools after BC. Another man who helped me was J.B

Walsh for being a great and caring teacher, and also being a person you could go to if you had a problem. Lastly, Tom Irwin was an excellent history teacher who made going into classes a challenge and a great learning experience.

How has participating in sports affected your career and life?

Sports have opened up a lot of doors for me. Over the years playing college basketball and participating in summer and winter basketball leagues, I have met many alumni and guys from rival schools and colleges who have helped develop my professional career. I also feel it is important, when the time is right, to give back to the school that helped you grow as a person. Giving back could either be financially or through your time.

What is some advice you have for any students regarding their futures?

Some advice I have is to learn and take advantage of all the courses and electives that school has to offer. It'll pay dividends later in life. My Father always told me "knowledge is power." The more information you can acquire, the more successful you will be. If you study hard, stay in good shape, and stay active, you'll be on the right track to a happy and successful life.

Is there anything else you'd like to share about your time at BC or what you think about BC today?

BC has come a long way since I graduated in 1972. Today I would be lucky to make the basketball team. I enjoyed my four years at BC and it gave me a good start to the future. The school continues to be at the forefront of education and values. There have been many improvements to the facilities in keeping with the times and needs of what students require in this day and age. Lastly, the sports programs are the standard that all other schools aspire to be. Billy has continued taking on challenging opponents like The Patrick School and Roselle Catholic. He has done a tremendous job and you gotta respect him for the work he is doing there.

I would like to thank Jack Chimento for the great interview and for everything he has done at BC. Jack's successful career in sports and business is what makes him such a well-respected alumnus. He was a board chairman for quite some time and is a Hall of Famer at BC for all the work he has done. He is the definition of what it means to be Crusader. We wish him and his family the best.

Back to the story. As I began to eat this magnificent Duck à l'Orange, I began thinking of the Mandarin Duck pictured above. Each bite I took of that moist, tender, gamey bird, became more and more of a labor. At that moment I knew, I could no longer have zee duck.

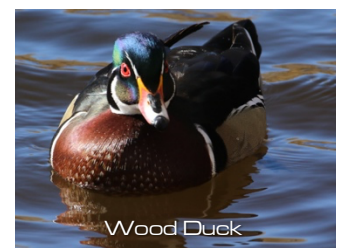
So what's a guy to do with a partially-eaten duck on his plate? Wait 'til your date is finished and order the flourless chocolate cake! It was the most memorable dessert I've ever eaten. The combination of chocolate, raspberry and freshly whipped cream helped me forget entirely about eating that duck.

So what's the story with the bird pictured above? Can you believe I took this photo at the Celery Farm in Allendale?

Occasionally, you may hear of these beauties showing up in Central Park or other places, before the snapping turtles or racoons (I'm now more civilized than both as I no longer eat duck) pick them off.

They are escapes from people who keep them as pets as they are certainly not indigenous to North America, nor do any escapees breed here. You may find them at the Hyatt Regency in Maui if you visit. That's the first place I encountered them.

They are beautiful ducks and tend not to be nearly as skittish as Wood Ducks, which are very attractive ducks that live in our area. Parson's Pond in Franklin Lakes is a good place for Wood Duck.

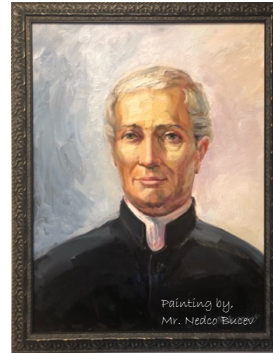

6. For each of the five decades, announce the Mystery (perhaps followed by a brief reading from Scripture) then say the *Our Father*.
7. While fingering each of the ten beads of the decade, next say ten Hail Marys while meditating on the Mystery. Then say a *Glory Be*. (After finishing each decade, some say the following prayer requested by the Blessed Virgin Mary at Fatima: *O my Jesus, forgive us our sins, save us from the fires of hell; lead all souls to Heaven, especially those who have most need of your mercy.*)
8. After saying the five decades, say the Hail, Holy Queen, followed by this dialogue and prayer:
V. Pray for us, O holy Mother of God.
R. That we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ.

Let us pray: O God, whose Only Begotten Son, by his life, Death, and Resurrection, has purchased for us the rewards of eternal life, grant, we beseech thee, that while meditating on these mysteries of the most holy Rosary of the Blessed Virgin Mary, we may imitate what they contain and obtain what they promise, through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.
