Behind the scenes, Mrs. Corrado, Mr. Kurpick, Mr. Morano, Mr. Spiegel, Dave Polli '23, Mrs. Sorrentino, Mrs. Walter and members of the Sports Media Interns Program, Carter Pontone, Ronan Flynn, Andrew Skoufis, Grady White, Ian

Knab and Rocco Sebastiani contributed in very many ways to make the event a terrific success.

BASEBALL, by Rocco Sebastiani

Aidan Baglino will be furthering his education and baseball career at Fairfield University. Fairfield was founded in 1942 in Fairfield Ct and they are known as the stags. They are in the Metro Atlantic Athletc Conference that is affiliated with NCAA division 1, and are ranked #3 among north regional universities.

Michael Biskup will be attending Washington College to further his studies and compete in baseball. Washington College is located in Chestertown, MD and was first founded as a private liberal arts school in 1782. It is the 10th Oldest college in the U.S. and the first to be founded

after American Independence. They are known as the Shoremen, Their mascot is Gus the Goose and their colors are black and maroon.

Harrison Certo will continue to pursue his educdation and play baseball at Bates College. Located in Lewiston, ME Bates college was founded in 1855, with the motto "With Ardor and Devotion". In 2017 they were #1 on the Fulbright Rankings and also had a grade rating of an A on Forbes Financial rankings.

Christian Charalambous will be furthering his studies and baseball career at Presbyterian College. Founded in 1880 in Clinton, SC their motto is "While we live, we serve". Their colors are garnet and blue and they are known as the Blue Hose. The name is based upon a nineteenth century newspaper article that described the team wearing Blue Hose (socks), defeating their opponent. They play Division I baseball in the big south.

Braden Connors will be furthering his education and playing baseball at The College of the Holy Cross. Located in Worcester, MA Holy Cross was founded in 1843 by the society of Jesuits. The Crusaders have participated in the NCAA Tournament 11 times and have advanced to the College World Series on four occasions, capturing the title in 1952. **Luca Reyes** will be attending the University of Miami to gain an outstanding education and further his abilities in baseball. The University opened in 1925 in Miami, FL and their Motto is "Great is the Truth". Their Mascot is Sebastian the Ibis and their Colors are Orange and green. Since 1973, the Hurricanes program has been one of college baseball's elite. Within 25 College World Series appearances they have one four national championships and advanced to the NCAA regionals for a record of 44 consecutive years.

LACROSSE by, Ian Knab and Zade Crego

Patrick Cece will be attending Merrimack College to further his academic and athletic career. Patrick will be playing Division 1 Lacrosse for the Warriors. Merrimack College was founded in 1947 by the order of St. Augustine. It was the second order of St. Augustine after Villanova. The Merrimack College mascot is Mack the Warrior. In 2020 Merrimack was moved up from Division 2 Lacrosse to Division 1 after winning back-to-back national titles in 2018 and 2019. From 2017-2019 they had a combined record of 50-8.

Anthony Liggio will be attending Johnson and Wales to further his academic and athletic career. Anthony will be playing lacrosse for the Wildcats. Johnson and Wales was founded by Gertrude Johnson and Mary Wales in 1914. They are known as the Johnson and Wales Wildcats. Johnson and Wales is a prestigious culinary school being one of the best in the country. It is highly regarded as one of the top notch culinary arts colleges. It is home to 16,000 students.

Ryan Loughlin will be attending Oberlin College to further his education and continue his lacrosse career. The school was founded in 1833 by a Presbyterian Missionary. They are known as the Yeomen and Yeowomen and their mascot is a Squirrel. They have notable alumni such as John Heisman and Ed Helms.

Richie Reid will be playing continuing his education and playing Division 1 Lacrosse at St. John's University. They are a Christian College that was founded in 1870. The team name is the Red Storm. Wesleyan University ranked 18th in national liberal arts colleges and is home to 3,224 students.

Mark Ruggerio will be attending Cabrini University to further pursue his academic and athletic career. Mark will be playing lacrosse for the Cabrini Cavaliers. Cabrini University is located in Radnor Pennsylvania and was founded in 1957 by Saint Frances Xavier Cabrini. THOUGHTS ON TRY-OUTS

November 8 - Oradell, NJ - We are on the eve of tryout season at BC. Here are some thoughts on making it a successful one. The best players generally are best controlling things they can control. The better you demonstrate you can do that, the better your chances of successfully navigating tryouts.

- Be in school. Keeping your academic life in good working order should be your top priority. You have only one chance to develop this facet of your adolescent life, make the most of it.
- 2. **Be on time.** Whether it is to school, to class, to tryouts, to practice, to games OR to shoot, to catch, to slide timing is important.
- 3. Be prepared. Get your tryout equipment together the night before you go to sleep. You don't want to wake up scrambling to find sneakers or skates. And think about not having them when you open your bag for tryouts? NOO!!! Be good to yourself and get organized.
- 4. **Show confidence.** Don't slump. Don't put your palms up. If you make a bad play, recover immediately and find the opportunity in the next play it created. Watch your language. Play with a swagger. It is your job to get yourself noticed. No coach has to take you. You have to prove you deserve to be on the team. Step up when a coach asks for a player. Step to the front of a line. Go for it!
- 5. Take care of yourself. You need to be well-rested and well-fed during tryouts and throughout the season. Manage your time well to get schoolwork done so you can get to sleep at a reasonable time. Eliminate your phone/iPad/MacBook in bed. Get a good night sleep. Get into good, healthy eating habits so you are well-nourished and have enough energy to get you through. Be well-hydrated. Eliminate sodas, energy drinks etc. and focus more on water, Gatorade, etc.



BIRD OF THE WEEK BROWN BOOBIE



November 13 - Elizabeth, NJ - Well, they're back. On the left an adult Brown Booby. Juvenile is on the right. For size comparison purposes, the world's largest gull specie, Great Black-backed Gull is above. I had to work this weekend and decided to stop by Veterans Memorial Waterfront Park in Elizabeth, where the boobies had been spotted in the previous few days. Abcbirds.org did a really nice job describing the BB, so I am just sharing their text in the following paragraphs.

- Scientific Name: Sula leucogaster
- Population 200,000 (decreasing)
- Habitat: Nests on rocky islands or coral atolls, otherwise at sea

The Brown Booby is the most common and wide-ranging member of its oceangoing family. It's also one of the more eye-catching, with chocolate-brown upperparts that contrast with a white belly, and bright yellow legs and feet. The Brown Booby's species name leucogaster is from Ancient Greek leuko for "white" and gaster for "belly."

This distinctive seabird shares its tropical range with the Red-footed Booby and other pelagic birds, such as the Laysan Albatross and White-tailed Tropicbird.

Origin of a Silly Name

The name "booby" comes from the Spanish word bobo, meaning stupid or daft. Like all species in its family, the Brown Booby is a strong and graceful flier. However, it's clumsy when on land, especially during takeoffs and landings. This apparent clumsiness, combined with a fearlessness that comes from little human contact, gave early explorers the impression that these big seabirds had small brains.

Wandering Widely

Brown Boobies are found across tropical regions of the Atlantic, Pacific, and Indian Oceans. In the Americas, they breed on islands off the Pacific Coast, in the Gulf of Mexico, and in the Caribbean. Outside of their breeding season, they wander widely, turning up along the Pacific or Atlantic coasts and sometimes straying as far inland as California's Salton Sea.

Off-season locations are not well studied for this species: The Brown Booby does not need to roost on land. When it needs to rest, it can simply set down on the surface of the ocean.

Diving for Dinner

Brown Boobies tend to feed on inshore waters, where they prey on small fish and squid. Powered by long, pointed wings, these agile seabirds hunt by plunging into the sea from heights of 30 to 50 feet. Torpedo-shaped bodies and air sacs under their skin cushion their impact with the water. They plunge into the water like darts, then can swim underwater to feed. Or they snatch prey directly from the water's surface.



How to Pray the Rosary

- 1. Make the Sign of the Cross.
- 2. Holding the Crucifix, say the *Apostles' Creed*.
- 3. On the first bead, say an Our Father.
- 4. Say one *Hail Mary* on each of the next three beads.
- 5. Say the *Glory Be*
- 6. For each of the five decades, announce the Mystery (perhaps followed by a brief reading from Scripture) then say the *Our Father*.
- 7. While fingering each of the ten beads of the decade, next say ten Hail Marys while meditating on the Mystery. Then say a *Glory Be*. (After finishing each decade, some say the following prayer requested by the Blessed Virgin Mary at Fatima: *O my Jesus, forgive us our sins, save us from the fires of hell; lead all souls to Heaven, especially those who have most need of your mercy.*)
- 8. After saying the five decades, say the Hail, Holy Queen, followed by this dialogue and prayer:
 - V. Pray for us, O holy Mother of God. R. That we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ.

Let us pray: O God, whose Only Begotten Son, by his life, Death, and Resurrection, has purchased for us the rewards of eternal life, grant, we beseech thee, that while meditating on these mysteries of the most holy Rosary of the Blessed Virgin Mary, we may imitate what they contain and obtain what they promise, through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.
