TWENTY EIGHT UNANSWERED POINTS LIFT CRUSADERS IN PURSUIT OF REPEAT

November 19 - Oradell, NJ - The Bergen Catholic Crusaders overcame an early deficit to steamroll and fly over Delbarton in the NJSIAA Non-Public "A" Semi-Finals at the Jack on a cold and windy Saturday 28-7.

The two teams seemed to be feeling each other out in the early part of the contest, with Delbarton winning the field position battle in part due to a high snap in which punter Brandon Arpacilar fielded a high snap and was able to salvage a very bad situation and turn it into a not-so-bad, 5-yard loss.

The Crusaders held the Green Wave who then punted, putting BC deep in the own part of the field at the 20. The field position battle was at this point being won by the visitor

who forced a punt. This snap was good, but a tsunami hit young Brandon, blocking his punt, which was returned for a touchdown. After a PAT, the Wave led 7-0 in sunny Oradell.

BC needed to answer. That is just what the offense did. The Crusaders relentlessly bullied Delbarton down the field: seventeen plays, eighty yards and six minutes, closing out the first quarter and going a minute into the second when senior QB, Jack Duffy scored his first touchdown of the afternoon on a four-yard keeper.



Guytano Bartolomeo drove the ball through the uprights and the score was tied at 7.



Carmelo Velardo kicked off, putting the ball nice and high, allowing the Crusader coverage to get downfield and stop the Wave inside their 20.

BC defense held Delbarton three and out and the Crusaders took possession of the ball at their own 41. This time, eleven plays were all it took for the Crusaders to find paydirt. Once again it was Duffy taking it in on the keeper off the left side for the score and BC had a lead it would never relinquish.

After a three and out, Delbarton punted to BC and Bergen took over with 53 seconds remaining in the half. Saeed St.Fleur carried for 6 yards and was tripped by the Wave



defender. A personal foul for tripping was assessed, giving BC a first down.

On the next play, Dominic Campanile dropped back and found a wide open Quincy Porter who reached around and made an incredible pass. He eluded one defender, picked up a block from Logan Casey and ran the ball in for a 44-yard touchdown reception. Bartolomeo's PAT was good and BC was up 21-7 going into the half.



The Crusader offense overpowered the Wave defensive front helping Saeed St.Fleur to 158 yards on the afternoon. It is the sixth time the senior has rushed for over 100 yards in a game this season. He currently has 1,279 yards rushing on the season and over 1,500 yards from scrimmage.

BC pounded out 262 yards on the ground due as Kaj Sanders (33 yards), Dominic Campanile (23 yards) and Duffy (23 yards, 2 TDs) all pitched in a bunch.

The Crusaders were highly effective in the air as well with Campanile delivering a pair of touchdown passes: one to Porter and another to TE Jack Comeau who showed how a senior can fly on his last game at The Jack.

While the offense generated 22 first downs and 362 yards, the defense stifled the Wave, holding them to just 88 yards rushing and 25 passing. Delbarton managed only seven first downs as four of their eight drives resulted in three-and-outs.

Not shockingly, Malachi Mercer led the Crusaders in tackles with 10. He now has 106 on the season. Christian Gonzalez assisted on seven tackles and picked up one solo.

Kaden Irby-Mason was in on five tackles and Elijah Kinsler and Kaj Sanders each made four tackles. Sophomore defensive lineman and discus and shot-putting star Benji Shue got in on the action with a tackle as well.



Thanks to Mrs. Barone we are proud to announce the Nuthatch as our State Championship Bird of the Week. Now, nuthatch is still a little too general, and I really couldn't decide, so I picked the two

nuthatches we find in northern New Jersey.



The white-breasted nuthatch is far more common in the area and you can generally spot them

climbing on trees or eating at your feeders in the backyard. The often pop around with the black-capped chickadees, tufted titmice and northern juncos.

If you're lucky, you may also see, or attract to your feeder the slightly smaller, red-breasted nuthatch. They are also very attractive birds.

Unlike woodpeckers and brown creepers, they girdle tree trunks upside down. This skill allows them to find food the other upwardfacing birds cannot.

Why are these little guys the perfect choice for this week? I'd like to think it's because you can always feel at home when you see nuthatches. Familiar, warm, happy. Just like the feeling of beating Don Bosco at Metlife Stadium, without all that exhilaration and extasy and pride and accomplishment and tailgating and stuff.



How to Pray the Rosary

- 1. Make the Sign of the Cross.
- 2. Holding the Crucifix, say the *Apostles' Creed*.
- 3. On the first bead, say an Our Father.
- 4. Say one *Hail Mary* on each of the next three beads.
- 5. Say the *Glory Be*
- 6. For each of the five decades, announce the Mystery (perhaps followed by a brief reading from Scripture) then say the *Our Father*.
- 7. While fingering each of the ten beads of the decade, next say ten Hail Marys while meditating on the Mystery. Then say a *Glory Be*. (After finishing each decade, some say the following prayer requested by the Blessed Virgin Mary at Fatima: *O my Jesus, forgive us our sins, save us from the fires of hell; lead all souls to Heaven, especially those who have most need of your mercy.*)
- 8. After saying the five decades, say the Hail, Holy Queen, followed by this dialogue and prayer:
 - V. Pray for us, O holy Mother of God. R. That we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ.

Let us pray: O God, whose Only Begotten Son, by his life, Death, and Resurrection, has purchased for us the rewards of eternal life, grant, we beseech thee, that while meditating on these mysteries of the most holy Rosary of the Blessed Virgin Mary, we may imitate what they contain and obtain what they promise, through the same Christ our Lord.
