FIVE CRUSADERS NAMED FIRST TEAM ALL-STATE FOOTBALL

December 9 - Hackensack, NJ - Five members of the Crusader Football Team were named to the USAToday Network NJ First-Team All-State in New Jersey. On offense, sophomore receiver Quincy Porter and senior running back Saeed St.Fleur were named. On the defensive side of the ball it was all seniors: linebacker Malachi Mercer and defensive linemen Sydir Mitchell and DJ Samuels.



QUINCY PORTER: First-team. All-State. Sophomore. That is rarified air for those who are not all that familiar with NJ HS Football. It's hard to under-estimate the impact this sophomore had In helping BC to its first back-to-back state championship seasons since 1998-1999. He set BC Sophomore records with 35 receptions, six-hundred eighty-six yards and eleven touchdowns this season, all-of which place him in Top-10 single-season performances. Quincy showed he was a big play threat as well, averaging 19.6 yards per reception, quite likely a sophomore record as well.

SAEED ST.FLEUR: Saeed's 1,436 yards rushing this season ranks as one of the greatest efforts all-time in BC history. His season ranks just behind Eric Lane, Tom Kearney and Wolfver

Jean-Pierre in single-season efforts and his 231 is second behind only Kearney. Saeed was the ground-and-pound man for the Crusaders and his three TD performance in the state final will not soon be forgotten.

MALACHI MERCER: The Crusaders' top tackler for the past two seasons brought down 118 ball-carriers this season. In two years, make it 221 in total. Add to that his ability to defend the pass and you'd have to say MM is one of the greatest Mike linebackers in school history. Mercer intercepted 4 passes this year and defended 10 over the past two. If that was not enough, Malachi may very well have set a school records in week five of the season when he recorded 21 tackles vs. Don Bosco Prep.

SYDIR MITCHELL: The Big Man set the tone for 2022 with his fumble-return for a TD in the opening game vs. Cardinal Gibbons. He absolutely dominated the line of scrimmage and had the opportunity for the spotlight in the state finals when he (Texas-bound) had the opportunity to meet up with the Ironmen's Aggie-bound offensive tackle. I think Bosco can come up with ZERO reasons to suggest they got the better of the big man that evening!

DJ SAMUELS: Not too many players can block a kick, let alone three. Let alone three in ONE game! DJ could. Certainly, when DJ wanted to go, he was very difficult for any opponent to deal with. Despite a challenging senior year, DJ goes out a two-time state champion and BC's All-Time Sack Leader with 28 career sacks.




Friends 'til the end. Senior Justin Martin poses with two of his buddies from his hometown of Montville.

BIRD OF THE WEEK AMERICAN WOODCOCK

November 28 - Teaneck, NJ - As I enjoyed our Monday



off, courtesy of Coach Campanile and his football team, I visited Andreas Park on River Road in Teaneck hoping to encounter a Brown Creeper or Brown Thrasher. While neither bird was in the cards for me,

I got lucky! Bobbing around in the woods was an American Woodcock. The bird is also known by other interesting names like Timberdoodle, Labrador twister, night partridge and the bog sucker! I would include its name in Spanish, but frankly, it's a little too racy to put in print.



Woodcocks are peculiar little football-shaped birds with extraordinarily long bills. They are members of the *Scolopacidae* family, related to sandpipers and snipes. Wilson's snipe has a similar shape, but the woodcock's neck is not visible and the head seems attached directly to its body.

The woodcock is more of a woodland bird that uses its long bill to search our invertebrates in wooded areas. It has a peculiar, nasally "peent" call.

The photo is the bird I encountered last week. You can see their beautiful markings and buff-colored belly. They have extremely large eyes which allows them to watch for danger above and behind them as they are in search of food.



How to Pray the Rosary

- 1. Make the Sign of the Cross.
- 2. Holding the Crucifix, say the *Apostles' Creed*.
- 3. On the first bead, say an Our Father.
- 4. Say one *Hail Mary* on each of the next three beads.
- 5. Say the *Glory Be*
- 6. For each of the five decades, announce the Mystery (perhaps followed by a brief reading from Scripture) then say the *Our Father*.
- 7. While fingering each of the ten beads of the decade, next say ten Hail Marys while meditating on the Mystery. Then say a *Glory Be*. (After finishing each decade, some say the following prayer requested by the Blessed Virgin Mary at Fatima: *O my Jesus, forgive us our sins, save us from the fires of hell; lead all souls to Heaven, especially those who have most need of your mercy.*)
- 8. After saying the five decades, say the Hail, Holy Queen, followed by this dialogue and prayer:
 - V. Pray for us, O holy Mother of God. R. That we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ.

Let us pray: O God, whose Only Begotten Son, by his life, Death, and Resurrection, has purchased for us the rewards of eternal life, grant, we beseech thee, that while meditating on these mysteries of the most holy Rosary of the Blessed Virgin Mary, we may imitate what they contain and obtain what they promise, through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.
