go wrong in the first quarter of Thursday night's BC – SJR basketball game. In the schools' 101st meeting


on the hardcourt, the Green Knights seemed unable to miss a shot and the Crusaders struggled to make any.





BIRD OF THE WEEK THE BLUE GOOSE

look at these geese, generally in Brigantine and ponds near the Jersey shore in Ocean and Monmouth counties, we estimated 1 in 6 were often snow geese.



February 5 - Oradell, NJ - While at the freshman basketball game on Sunday, we were discussing what the bird of the week should be. It was recommended that the groundhog bird be declared the BOTW, but that's not real so we couldn't do that.

Next, an eagle was suggested. Now I'm no Empire State Building. I just feel I need to go on the record about that and if something like that were to happen next week, heaven forbid, it would be in honor of my colleagues and not some green and white fish eating bird.

So I started thinking back to the idea of something not real and I thought of the blue goose. Not that they're not real. They are. But not really. Blue geese are morphs of Snow Geese and they are not so much as rare as they are in the minority. Some flocks may have 50% being made up of snow and blue geese. Others may have just about 10-15% of the snow geese appearing blue. As Brother Fagan and I would

How to Pray the Rosary

- 1. Make the Sign of the Cross.
- 2. Holding the Crucifix, say the Apostles' Creed.
- 3. On the first bead, say an Our Father.
- 4. Say one *Hail Mary* on each of the next three beads.
- 5. Say the Glory Be
- 6. For each of the five decades, announce the Mystery (perhaps followed by a brief reading from Scripture) then say the *Our Father*.
- 7. While fingering each of the ten beads of the decade, next say ten Hail Marys while meditating on the Mystery. Then say a *Glory Be*. (After finishing each decade, some say the following prayer requested by the Blessed Virgin Mary at Fatima: O my Jesus, forgive us our sins, save us from the fires of hell; lead all souls to Heaven, especially those who have most need of your mercy.)
- 8. After saying the five decades, say the Hail, Holy Queen, followed by this dialogue and prayer:V. Pray for us, O holy Mother of God.R. That we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ.

Let us pray: O God, whose Only Begotten Son, by his life, Death, and Resurrection, has purchased for us the rewards of eternal life, grant, we beseech thee, that while meditating on these mysteries of the most holy Rosary of the Blessed Virgin Mary, we may imitate what they contain and obtain what they promise, through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.
