Last week's ranking: No. 10

Why: Early in the season, Bergen Catholic has quickly proven to have some of the strongest field event athletes in the entire state. While Benjamin Shue made headlines across the state for his shot put toss of 63-5.50 at Arcadia Invitational in California, which was the highest throw by a sophomore

April 6 - Hasbrouck Heights, NJ - Last Thursday, the Track Team competed at the Penn Relays Qualifier 2023 and won 5 out of the 6 events entered.

- Sean Coll Won the javelin with a huge personal record (PR) and state lead 175-9 also qualifying for the national championship. Nick Barra took 2nd with a PR of 156-4.
- Benji Shue won the shot put and discus casually.
- Tristan Oliver won the high jump with a mark of 5'10"
- Jason Lessieu won the triple jump with a mark of 42'10" and also took home 2nd on the long jump with a big PR of 21-5.75

BC leads the state in all throwing events: javelin, shot put and discus. The Crusaders have not run the sprints yet at an official meet.

SHUE SLAYS IT IN ARCADIA

April 8 - Arcadia, CA - Benji Shue competed at one of the most competitive meets in the country called the Arcadia Invitational out in California.



The Bergen Catholic star sent the 12-pound ball a US. No. 4 63-5.50 on his final attempt, which is No. 11 in U.S. history for a sophomore.

He took home 3rd in the discus with a NJ state lead mark of 187-2 and WON the Arcadia Invitational in the shot put with a MASSIVE personal record (PR) and another NJ state lead of 63' 5.5". Both throws qualify Ben for the national championship and both are US Top-10 marks!

Logan Casey won the 200m with a time of 22.24 but he was not the Crusaders only victor. The 4x100m Relay Team won their event with a time of 42.21, Tristan Oliver won the high jump with a jump of 5'10" and Ben Shue won the Discus and the Shot Put with throws of 176' 4" and 60' 2.5" respectively.

April 10 - Oradell, NJ - On Monday, the Crusaders hosted Columbia High School in an independent lacrosse contest. The game was BC's 500th Varsity Lacrosse Game and the first time, Bergen matched up with the Cougars. The home team emerged victorious with a 14-6 victory over their Essex County opponents.

Bergen erased a first quarter 2-1 deficit, erupting for 5 goals in each of the middle two quarters and holding their opponents to just 1 in that twenty-four minute span.



Jake Taromina led BC with 4 goals while Richie Reid and Jack Tenaglia joined Taromina's 4 points by scoring 2 goals and assisting twice each. Joe Marinaccio recorded a goal and a pair of assists while Matt Reilly, Anderson Chiang and face-off specialist Dan Sheppard each pitched in a goal.

Sheppard and Pat Cece dominated the face-off X, winning 18 of 23 draws and Parker Day had a terrific day in the cage, saving 16 shots on goal while allowing only 6 goals against.

CRUSADERS PUT UP BIG NUMBERS AT THE HUN!

April 13 - Princeton, NJ - The Crusaders crossed home plate 23 times against HSOP on Thursday en-route to a 23-7 victory. Eighteen of Bergen's twenty-three runs crossed home in the first two innings as the Crusaders knocked out 20 hits.



Luca Reyes went three-for-three with three runs scored and a pair of RBIs. Braedon Nichols' three-for-three belted in 3 RBIs as he scored twice. Dhruv Vengulekar was also stellar at the plate: 3-for-4, 3 runs and 2 RBIs and Mike Delpome went two-for-three, with two runs and 2 RBIs.

BC's twenty-three runs, ties for the second-most runs scored by a Crusader Baseball Team and fell just three shy of the school record (26) set on April 8, 2011 vs. Paterson Kennedy (26-0). That was a big week for BC in 2011, as the 23-run explosion came just 3 days later on April 11, 2011 vs. Hackensack (23-16). The game was the 10th twenty-run + game in the over 1,500 years of school history.

Jack Duffy went three innings, giving up four runs, none earned, striking out two. Drew Giacomini came in to pitch a six outs of scoreless baseball, striking out two, to close out the victory.

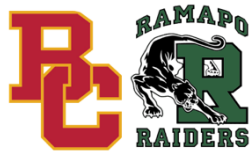

BIRD OF THE WEEK: YELLOW-THROATED WARBLER

April 11 - Bergen County, NJ - It was a nice surprise to have a Yellow-throated Warbler pop up on the Rare-Bird Alert for Bergen County last week. For the second year in a row, the species was located in the same spot at the Celery Farm in Allendale. I wonder if it is the same bird.



A couple of years ago, I made a special journey to track these down in a forest where they breed. It's so nice not to have to do that this year.

Warblers are the "jewels" of the birding world. Generally speaking, they are 4.5 - 6 inches in length, but their melodious warbles help birders to identify them through the months of April and May, when migration occurs. It is also best to identify them now as they are in breeding plumage, as opposed to in the fall, when they move south and can be very difficult to identify.

First, they do not sing in the fall...no one is trying to impress the females. Secondly, they don't want to attract the attention of some of the larger species that are following close behind in search of a meal for the ride.

I have not seen a report of this yellow-throated warbler since last week, but plenty more species of warblers (perhaps 30 or so) will be passing through or nesting in Bergen County.

Interested in attracting hummingbirds? In the next week or so, get some red out and put a feeder out. They

traditionally pass through right around the first of the month. The more prepared you are, the better chance you have of attracting them and having a fun visitor around in your yard this summer.
