2023 BERGEN CATHOLIC CRUSADERS AT A GLANCE

The Crusaders enter today's game under the direction of Head Coach, Vito Campanile, the eleventh coach in program history. Coach Campanile has done nothing but polish an apple, leading the Crusaders to three consecutive #1 state rankings and two straight Non-Public

"A" State Championship with a top 25 rankings in the USA Today and MaxPreps in 2021 (#3)and 2022 (#20).

BC was recognized by MaxPreps as the top high school football team in the state of New Jersey as we enter the season.

Coach Campanile took the helm at Bergen Catholic in 2018, succeeding brother, Nunzio, who led BC to a state championship in 2017. Coach Vito immediately found success during the 2018 season, leading BC to the state final before the Crusaders were upset by St. Joseph Regional at MetLife Stadium.

Following a five-and-four 2019 campaign, Covid-19 prevented Campanile's #1-ranked Crusaders from pursuing a state championship as the state tournament was cancelled for the season.

In 2021, Coach Campanile led BC to its 18th state championship and second-ever 12-0 record. The Crusaders were the class of the state of New

Jersey and earned the school's highest ever ranking to date of #3 in the country. Last year, the Crusaders defeated Don Bosco Prep in the State Final 45-0 to clinch the school's 19th State Championship.

In recognition of his commitment to excellence and leadership, Coach Campanile was recognized by the *USAToday* as the Nation's High School Boys Coach of the Year.

In five years at the helm of BC, Coach Campanile has a record of 43-8 (.843 winning percentage), two state championships and three-straight #1 rankings in NJ and two league titles. In his 16-year head coaching career, Coach Campanile has a record of 126-58 (a .685 winning percentage).

BERGEN CATHOLIC ON OFFENSE

Unquestionably, this version of the BC Offense starts with its air raid offense. Junior **QB Dominic Campanile** (#17) is an athletic southpaw slinger who has completed 62.8 percent of his passes for 988 yards. In just over two years, Campanile has completed 155 passes for 2,169 yards. His 14 touchdown passes this year already equals his entire total from 2022, raising his career total to 28.

Campanile's top target would be anyone's top target in NJ and beyond. **Quincy Porter (#0)** is a junior wide receiver who is already shattering all of BC's career records. He took down Aaron Martin's career TD reception record vs. Seton Hall Prep and currently stands at 21 for his career and 10 in 2023. Porter has 57 career receptions for 1,117 yards. This season his 22 catches for 454 yards (20.6 yards per carry) represents almost a touchdown for every other reception he's made. **Luca Cutitta (#6)** is developing into a big-play threat, especially after his exceptional performance against Don Bosco Prep last week. The senior receiver has 7 receptions for 164 yards (23.4 ypc) and a touchdown. Junior slot **Anthony Perrotti (#2)** is the team's second leading receiver with 18 catches and 151 yards and a touchdown. Junior slotback **Michael Camapnile (#4)** and sophomore running back **Dante Cain (#20)** also have touchdown receptions this season.

Four-star Rutgers-commit, **Kaj Sanders (#1)** currently leads the Crusader ground game with 236 yards on 39 carries (6.1 YPC). Sanders has five touchdowns on the season and is currently the team's second leading scorer. Junior running back, **Mu Russell (#23)** has 33 carries for 167 yards and one rushing touchdown. Cain is just one carry and one yard behind Russell with 166 yards on 32 carries.

The offensive line has been dealing with some injuries and in the past two weeks, has relied on a number of younger players to pitch in to support the cause. That said, the team is averaging 31.8 points per game and has gained over 1604 yards (320.8 yards per game). From left-to-right, expect to see LT Nyier Daniels (#79), LG Owen Fernandez (#64), C Marcus Linder (#50), RG Ben Shue (#72) and RT Chris Vigna (#56). Do not be surprised if sophomores Rocco Costello (#71) and Mikey McMahon (#77) will contribute at times.

BERGEN CATHOLIC ON DEFENSE

Aside from an extraordinary challenge vs. Chaminade-Madonna (FL), the nation's #3 ranked team, the Crusader defense has been sound, yielding only 7 points per game in those contests.

Senior linebacker **Christian Gonzalez (#10)** leads all Crusader tacklers with 31 on the season. Junior linebacker **Kaden Irby-Mason (#14)** is right on his heels with 28. BC is happy to see the return of junior linebacker, David Matesic (#9) who has now recorded 14 tackles in 3 games.

On the defensive line, senior West Virginia commit, **Elijah Kinsler** (#8) leads the group with 26 tackles, 2 sacks and 3 tackles for a loss. Junior DT **Delaney Flood** (#99) has a sack, a TFL and AN INTERCEPTION! He picked off a DBP off a tipped pass by Gonzalez and returned the ball to the Ironman 18, setting up a Guy Bartolomeo FG. At DE, junior **Ben Carey** (#97) with 19 tackles and sophomore **Jermaine Kinsler** (#88) help to set an edge.

In the secondary, junior corner **Naiim Parrish** (**#5**) has added one pick to his interception total after setting a BC sophomore record for interceptions in a season as he led the 2022 Bergen squad with 5. Parrish leads the team with 18 solo tackles. His superior play has encouraged opposing coordinators to attack the sophomore corner, **Jordan Thomas** (**#23**). All Thomas has done is intercept three passes in the young season and is second on the team in solo tackles with 16, just two behind Parrish. Senior safety **Kaj Sanders** (**#1**) has 21 tackles on the season and provides senior leadership in an outstanding but dinged-up secondary. Freshman **Anthony Willis** (**#24**) will not play and senior **Chris Mimmo** (**#3**) who is out for the season, have left an opportunity at the safety position for **Ethan Cohalt** (**#7**) and **Russell** (**#23**) to make their marks.

BERGEN CATHOLIC SPECIAL TEAMS

Senior punter Brandon Arpacilar (#25) is showing what a valuable asset he is. The junior averages 37.2 yards per punt, a 33.5 yard net. He has a long of 57 yards and can help BC win the field position game in a tight game.

Junior place kicker **Guytano Bartolomeo (#37)**, BC's points man, picked up where he left off last season. He is currently 21 for 21 on XPAs and 2 for 2 on FGAs in 2023. His career scoring total are: 90 points on 6/7 Field Goals and 72/73 PATs.

Juniors **Perrotti (#2)** and **Parrish (#5)** each average around 35 yards per kickoff return.

DEPAUL OFFENSE AT A GLANCE

The Spartan offense is rolling, averaging 34.3 points per game. They are led by sophomore QB **Derek Zamit (#15)**, who has demonstrated some great skills, completing 50 of 66 passes (75.8 completion percentage) for 717 yards with 9 touchdowns and 3 interceptions. He has also rushed for 68 yards on 29 carries with four touchdowns.

His primary target has been junior WR **De'zie Jones (#8)** who has 17 receptions for 343 yards and 3 touchdowns. Junior WR **Elijah Burress (#17)** has a pair of touchdowns on 7 catches for 119 yards and sophomore **Mason James (#16)** has one touchdown on 6 receptions for 130 yards.

Nolan James, Jr. (#1) is an strong junior running back who has carried 92 times for 608 yards (6.6 per carry) and 5 touchdowns. James can also be effective coming out of the backfield as he has 8 catches for 38 and one touchdown.

DEPAUL DEFENSE

DePaul has given up 28 points per game (112 in four games). Their leading tackler is junior linebacker, **Anthony Nittoli (#27)** with 35 tackles, 14 solos, 1 sack and 2 TFLs. Junior linebacker **Yasire Howell (#0)** has recorded 29 tackles and senior **Jeremy Lopez (#19)** has 24 tackles with 2 sacks. **De'zie Jones (#1)** plays defense

as well and has the only interception on the team. Sophomore **Corey Davis**, **Jr. (#26)** leads the Spartans in takeaways with 2 fumble recoveries.

DEPAUL SPECIALS

The Spartans have a threat in sophomore **Ryhen Thomas (#3)** at the returner position. He has two returns for touchdowns this season, one punt return (31 yards) and one kickoff return, a 92 yarder.

Senior place kicker **Joey Cunningham (#18)** has made 14 of 17 extra point attempts and has not of yet attempted a field goal.

1958

The Bergen-DePaul rivalry goes all the way back to BC's first season when, in their fifth game, the Crusaders defeated the Spartans 25-0 on November 9, 1958. It was the first win in school history and marked a

number of firsts the teams would share over the course of time. Dan Connelly gave BC a 7-0 lead on a 37-yard run in the first quarter. After a scoreless second, Dan Hopkins scored for the Crusaders on a 30 yard run in the 3rd quarter. BC scored once again that quarter on a 53 yard pass play from Bob Fisher to Jim Lucie. Bob Murray finished off the scoring for the Crusaders in the fourth quarter with a run of his own.

In 1959, the Crusaders won again, defeating their hosts 32-0. Dan Hopkins rushed for three touchdowns and led a Bergen program that was making progress to become a winner, notching their fourth

win against two losses.

The two schools did not meet again until the formation of the NJSIAA's state playoff system in 1975 and what a game that was! Played at a neutral site, Paramus High School, the Crusaders and Spartans battled

to a 7-7 tie.

The Crusaders scored in the first half on what would become one of Head Coach Tony Karcich's staple trick plays, the hook and lateral. Jack McGovern's kick (yes the same Jack McGovern who BC's field is currently named after) gave the Crusaders a 7-0 lead going into the half. Tommy Vigorito scored the first touchdown ever for DePaul against BC and it was a big one in the fourth quarter. After the successful PAT, the teams went to the decision-making process.

While there were never overtimes in the past, the Parochial "A" State Championship game obviously required a way to break the tie. In 1975 the solution was that each team had four chances to gain as many yards as they possibly could. After each play, referees marked the distances for each gain with rulers (according to eye-witness accounts). Tommy Vigorito gained 19 yards, one foot in three running plays and a fourth down pass was incomplete. BC gained two yards, two feet and 11 inches before Mike Colacchio's bomb was intercepted by the future Miami Dolphin star Vigorito.

1979

December 2, 1979 would rematch the two schools in the Parochial "A" State Final but this time it would be at a little more prestigious site than a high school field...Giants Stadium. It was the first

parochial playoff game ever at Giants Stadium.

The '79 game would bring BC its first Parochial "A" State title in the state playoff era. After finishing second to DePaul in 1974 (a year before the playoffs) and losing the yardage battle in 1975 to the Spartans, BC fell to Seton Hall Prep in the state finals in 1977 and 1978.

Once again, a future NFLer, this time Joe Azelby for BC (Harvard -



Buffalo Bills) would make a number of the key plays including recovering a pair of fumbles and making a TD saving tackle on a 4th and Goal from the 1.

Ken Jagiello provided the scoring for the Crusaders. The future Syracuse star scored a pair of TDs, runs of 6 yards and 1 yard, both in the first half to give BC a 14-0 halftime lead. Dave Ficca actually helped with the two point conversion passing to the open quarterback for the score.

The two schools would match up again in the state playoffs, this time in the 1980 Parochial "A" North-Sectional Semifinals. For the second straight year, the Crusaders knocked off the undefeated Spartans, this




time as a result of a 7-0 nailbiter at Wayne Valley High School.

The key play of the game was a five yard punt from the Spartan 8, that set the ball up, just 13 yard from paydirt for the Crusaders. Crusader QB Billy McGovern punched in the difference maker from 1-yard out in the second quarter to ensure the win.




