SEPTEMBER 8-10 - SOUTH FLORIDA including HOLLYWOOD, FL on SEPTEMBER 8

The varsity football team lost to an exceptional team from south Florida, Chaminade-Madonna 61-21 on Friday night. The hosts boasted the #1 national recruit, a WR who will be attending Ohio State, as well as WR - Umiami commit, 6'6" QB - North Carolina State, RB - North Carolina and CB - UMiami.

Quincy Porter scored on TD passes of 12 and 81 yards (the longest TD of the season and BC) and Dominic Campaline (2TD passes and 1 run for a TD) took care of 85.7% of the scoring while Guytano Bartolomeo remained perfect with his execution of Point after Touchdown tries with three.

Punter Brandon Arpacilar arguably had the best game of the day with two punts of 51 and 49 yards, yielding only one -2 yard return.

[Mr. McElhinney and I were able to see the place kicker kick the team's 61st point as we entered the field with 10 minutes remaining to play. We left BC around 11 am in order to make our 1:00pm flight from EWR to Fort Lauderdale. We parked the car, made it through security and boarded on-time.

FROSH CRUSADERS CALM THE SEAS

September 9 - Morristown, NJ - The Green Wave was a



mere ripple after being calmed by the Frosh Crusader Football Team on Saturday morning.

Austin Busso once again made some big plays that ignited the Frosh machine. After KJ Hackney recorded a couple of tackles for losses, Busso returned a punt 41 yards to the Delbarton 30. On the next play, QB Aiden Talley threw a perfect screen pass to Busso who weaved and sprinted down the middle of the field for a Crusader TD. After a missed PAT, the Crusaders led 6-0.

On the subsequent drive, the Wave tried to beat the Crusader outside and knew they needed to block Nick Mauro. Despite putting two blockers on him, Nick defeated them both blocks and recorded a tackle for a loss for himself. That was followed by a sack by Che Patrick, setting up another chance for Busso.

Retreating for a quality punt, Busso made a one-handed over the shoulder catch on the punt and then turned up-field taking it back 24 yards.

Two-way star Tristin Herring ran the sweep play to his right and found paydirt, increasing BC's lead to two scores. Talley hit Busso for the screen pass and BC had a 2-point play and 14-0.

The defense was really clicking at this point a Connor Long and Marlon Williams were dominating the middle of the defensive line, creating pressure on the QB and stuffing inside runs.

Time for THE BOMB. Fifty-nine yards from Talley to Busso down the left sideline made the score 20-0.

After a short possession, Mauro took a short flat pass from Talley to the left. He ducked under a would-be tackler and beat two other Waves, sprinting 49 yards to the endzone. Talley hit Herring on a perfectly-designed inside seam route, and BC was up 28-0 at half.

In the third quarter, Amare Newell took a handoff and sprinted six yards for a touchdown. The Crusader running backs excelled all day with great efforts from Faheem Ausbon (also strong on defense at linebacker) and Jonah Flournoy, whose Billy-Sims-like cuts helped him carve up the Delbarton D.

Jack Woods entered the game in the fourth quarter at QB and sliced and diced the Green Wave defense, completing passes to Joe Adamek, Ausbon and Liam Erickson before time expired.

"Mr. Haemmerle!" a voice calls over. "Do you remember me?"

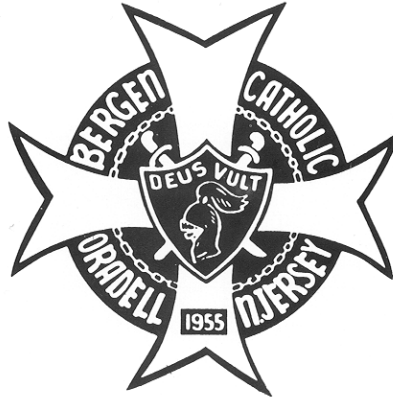
