CRUSADERS HAMMER SETON HALL PREP ON THE ROAD TO REGAIN #1 RANKING

SEPTEMBER 16 - WEST ORANGE, NJ - Quincy Porter and Dominic Campanile are a problem. Together, the two are becoming the most prolific QB-R passing combination in 65



year of Bergen Catholic Football. Their skills were on display on Saturday as BC continued in-state dominance, defeating Seton Hall Prep 38-0 at the Monsignor Kelly Athletic Complex.

Linebacker Anthony Morales made a pair of tackles including a sack to terminate the Pirates' first drive, which put the ball in BC's hands at their own 29 yard line. After a 1 yard completion from Campanile to Porter, the former hit sophomore Jordan Thomas for a 65-yard big gainer down the left sideline. Thomas' attitude and performance seem to be earning him greater responsibilities and he continues to make the most of them.

One play later, Porter pulled in his first of three TDs from his QB and after a Guy Bartolomeo PAT, BC led 7-0.

Jaden Kirby-Mason recorded a tackle on the next kickoff and made a tackel during the next series before Thomas interecepted a Pirate forward pass.



Enter Anthony Perrotti and Mu Russell. Perrotti ran for 8 yards, followed by an 11-yard gallop by Russell, followed by

a 21 yard pass from Campanile to Perrotti. After a couple of runs by Kaj Sanders (6 and 7 yards) and short run by Russell, Campanile hit Porter for a 4-yard TD and an eventual 14-0 lead.

Five plays into the next Pirate drive, Christian Gonzalez intercepted, setting up yet anotehr short field for BC.



The BC offense was actually held-up by a determined Pirate defense. Coach Campanile had an opportunity to give Bartolomeo a chance for a challenging field goal from 37 yards out. The distance was not an issue, but there was a significant cross-wind from left-to-right that the exceptional kicker would have to consider in his preparation. His kick was driven perfectly through the uprights and BC had a 17-0 lead.



On the ensuing kick off, Brandon Gomez forced a fumble and CJ Edwards recovered putting BC in business one more time.

One play. Twenty-eight yards. TOUCHDOWN! Once again, the Campanile to Porter show was on stage. Bartolomeo...perfect and BC led 24-0.

BC would get one more opportunity to score before half and another first in BC history occurred. It would be the first time two sons of BC Head Football Coaches would team up for a touchdown completion. Dominic Campanile (son of Coach Vito) found a wide open Michael Campanile (son of former Coach Nunzio) for a 9-yard score. Michael's route was well-executed as he started up the field and then outside, before whipping to the inside and securing the ball.



As the second half started, Kaj Sanders would put the game out of reach with a 10-yard sweep around left end for a score and a 38-0 lead. That set the clock to running and BC would shortly depart 3-1 and soon to be ranked #1 in NJ once again.

BIRD OF THE WEEK BROAD-WINGED HAWK



SEPTEMBER 16 - WEST ORANGE, NJ - This was cool. At halftime, I was enjoying halftime, sitting on the bench at the BC-Seton Hall Prep Varsity Football Game. We were cruising and I was thinking of something BC's new, outstanding history teacher, Mr. Giarusso was saying to me, "Hey Joe, no looking at birds this afternoon, heh?"

I laughed, but at that moment a turkey vulture swooped down about 10 feet over our heads and it was nearly impossible not to look up.

Now, that wasn't a hawk, so at this point, I had not disobeyed, but I continued to look toward the sky. As I did, I saw, high in the sky, a broad-winged hawk.

I laughed to myself and began to make my way over to Mr. G and as I peeked up again, I saw dozens of them. I always estimate on the conservative side, so I listed 60 in my e-bird account with one TV.

It wasn't until I got home (after the BC game and after the Mets game) that I saw it was actually 116 broad-winged hawks – counted from the photo above. About the picture: It is a compilation of two edited photos. Photo #1 is a cropped image of the largest concentration of broadwings I saw on Saturday.

Photo #2 is an individual bird that was MUCH lower. I removed the background.

Broad-wingeds are "Buteos, pronounced BEAUTY-oh. Buteos are stockier hawks such as Red-Tailed and Red-shouldered hawks. They typically are perched up high and pounce on small mammals when they spot them.

The word buteo actually translates to hawk and the term helps birders communicate to identify those types of birds.

Many Montclair State University students, home of the "Red Hawks," may have lived in a dorm named Buteo. There is another dormitory on campus named Accipiter. Accipiters are typically smaller, more slender hawks that hunt in wooded lands. Two common accipiters in our area are Cooper's Hawks and Sharp-shinned hawks.

If you keep a bird feeder, don't be utterly surprised if a Cooper's sees it as its own kind of "bird feeder" as accipiters are quick enough to hunt birds as a part of their diets as well.

FALL MIGRATION

In the coming weeks, if you look to the sky, you may see large numbers of robins, blue jays, and other birds migrating south. They are followed by various falcons, eagles, buteos and accipiters.

If you decide to spend an afternoon at State Line Lookout in Alpine, NJ, you can often find a wide array of raptors moving through the areas as they travel south west. Falcons like: American Kestrel, Merlin and especially Peregrine Falcon (the world's fastest animal) as well as Eagles

(Bald and occasionally Golden), Turkey and
Black Vultures and of course buteos
(Broad-winged hawks, Red-tailed, Redshouldered), accipiters (Cooper's
and Sharp-shinned) as well
as Northern Harriers,
Ospreys and assorted
other migrating
species.
