

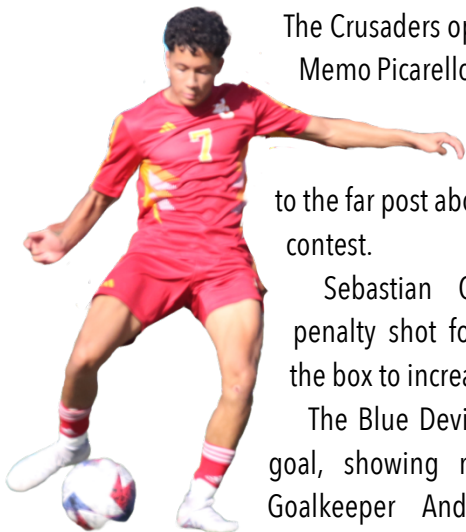

#14 SOCCER DUELS WITH #16 WESTFIELD



SEPTEMBER 19 - ORADELL, NJ - The Crusaders faced an outstanding opponent on Tuesday afternoon at the Jack as Westfield's Blue Devils came to town in a battle of Top 20 Teams.



The Crusaders opened the scoring with Memo Picarello who drilled a beautiful shot from the right wing from 15 yards to the far post about 23 minutes into the contest.

Sebastian Ortega scored on a penalty shot following a handball in the box to increase BC's lead to 2-0.

The Blue Devils put pressure on the goal, showing no signs of yielding. Goalkeeper Andrew Blodgett was excellent under duress, but ultimately

gave up a goal on a direct kick that bent around the wall the Crusaders set.

Late in the half, BC's Ryan Chong had an opportunity for a corner kick. He passed the ball to Danny DeBono who returned it to him and he centered the ball where Antonio Mamsang headed the ball into the net, giving BC a 3-1 halftime lead.

As the teams switched sides of the field, Westfield opened the scoring early in the second half to cut the lead in half with 37 minutes remaining.

Cosimo Tristani hit a cutting Sebastian Ortega down the center of the field who lifted the ball past the Westfield goalie who was competing to beat him to the ball. The ball dribbled over the keeper and into the goal, extending BC's lead back to two.

Sophomore Aiden Waterman was stellar on defense in the second half. He and Joe Lee, Danny DeBono and Joe Maimone were nearly impenetrable.

The Crusaders also got a great boost in the second half by midfielder J'Niles Simpson, whose presence in the center impacted the effectiveness of Westfield's offense.

BERGEN-BOSCO 79TH MEETING

SEPTEMBER 22 - RAMSEY, NJ - There is nothing more



exciting than a Bergen-Bosco Football Game! The crowd is electric and regardless of what the teams' records are,

there is sure to be a great effort on both sides of the football. This year's contest was no different and it required five different players to score touchdowns and two goal line stands to produce the result, a 38-15 victory for New Jersey's #1 ranked team, the Crusaders.

The opening drive was an inauspicious one at best. Three and out and a minus-seven net yardage set up fourth and 17 from the BC 16 yard line. The home Ironmen started with the ball at the BC 41 following a 46-yard Brandon Arpacilar punt and a 19-yard Ironman return.



On first down, DBP completed a 21 yard pass to the Crusader 20. Two plays later, BC linebacker Kaden Irby-Mason came up big with a TFL on a second-and-nine play that set up 3rd and long for Bosco. BC forced an incomplete pass which led to 4th down and a DBP missed field goal attempt.

UNLEASH THE MONSTER

It is at this point when the Crusader Offense returned to its normal identity. On first and ten from the Crusaders own 20 yard line, Dominic Campanile threw a quick pass to Kaj

Sanders which translated into a Crusader FIRST DOWN! After a short gain on the ground by Sanders, Mu Russell ran inside for 9 yards and another Crusader FIRST DOWN! Sanders picked up four yards on first down and the first of 24 penalties was called (this time against the Ironmen).

It actually became a theme for the evening as referees made unsportsmanlike and personal foul calls to the tune of 183 yards on the evening.

After Russell hit on an 8 yard first down run, a perfect play design moved Quincy Porter (who was double-covered all night) to an inside position and after Campanile delivered a perfect ball: a 33-yard touchdown to QP marked #10 on the season and his continued assault on the record books.



Guy Bartolomeo drilled the PAT through the uprights and BC was about to roll with 5:59 remaining in the first quarter.

Jordan Thomas intercepted his third pass in the last two games and BC was quickly back in business at the Ironman 48.

Dante Kain was now on display. The sophomore running back carried for 3 yards on first down. He would finish the night with 58 yards on 9 carries. He is one of those fine inside zone running backs whose patience allows him to let



the holed develop, and once it does, he can certainly do something about it. Second and seven turned out to be a play call to his number again. This time it was a pass and Dante translated another Campanile gem into a 40 yard TD pass and 13-0 BC score. Enter Bartolomeo. Exit with an extra point. Make that 14-0 BC.

Ethan Cohall, Dominic Matesic, Ben Carey and Anthony Morales tackled DBP ball carriers to hold them to 6 yards on the next three plays and force a punt.

With 3:30 remining in the first quarter BC went back to work. Anthony Perrotti carried for 4 yards follow up with an Ironman personal foul. Sanders ran for 11 yards and after a 29-yard completion to GARS Academic Scholaship Winner Luca Cuttita, Campanile was roughed leading to an additional 8 yards (half the distance to the goal line).



Mu Russell ran for his first TD of the season and Guy remained perfect on PATs and the Crusaders were up 21-0 at the quarter.

HARD FOUGHT SECOND QUARTER

The Ironmen put their best drive of the game together thus far. It was a 13-play, 73 yard drive that started from the Crusader 26. While there were a number of key plays by Sanders, Delaney Fludd, David Matesic, Thomas, Naiim Parrish, Jermaine Kinsler and Christian Gonzalez, the best was yet to come on goal line defense.

Third and goal from the one was a critical down and Anthony Morales and Kirby-Mason came up huge with a two-yard tackle for a loss, setting up fourth and goal from the three. Elijah Kinsler and Morales made the big stop at the

one yard-line and the Crusaders got off the field, shutout in tact.

On second down, BC was forced to take a safety and subsequently kicked off to the Ironmen. Following the kickoff, DBP had a short field and the defense faced a significant challenge. Mac Fitzgerald, Parrish and Irby-Mason made a number of tackles, but the hosts reached paydirt after an eight play, 54-yard drive.



With the lead now only 12, the Crusaders were challenged to answer and answer they did with a 10-play, 80-yard drive capped off by a Campanile to Cuttita 31-yard touchdown pass.

FLUDD GATES

The Ironmen, desperate to get going in the second half saw Guy Bartolomeo's kickoff pin them deep as they initiated their return. A holding call made the starting point, the DBP 9 yard line.



Five plays in, junior defensive lineman, Delaney Fludd made a solo tackle and on second and eight from the 28 YL, Christian Gonzalez tipped a pass and Fludd intercepted, returning the ball 10 yards to the 18 yard line.

The offense was held on three straight downs and Guy Bartolomeo drilled a 27-yard field goal perfectly down the middle of the up-rights, increasing BC's lead to 31-9.



The third quarter saw no other scoring, but a considerable number of penalties and announcements of such.

ENTER SANDMAN

In the fourth quarter, running back Kaj Sanders put the icing on the cake with a beautiful 38-yard sweep to the right side. Outstanding blocking from Chris Vigna, Ben Shue, Marcus Linder, Owen Fernandez, Rocco Constello and Mikey McMahon were crucial to BC's success. Their outstanding play on the line, helped BC to its 150 yards and two TDs on the ground and 363 total yards.

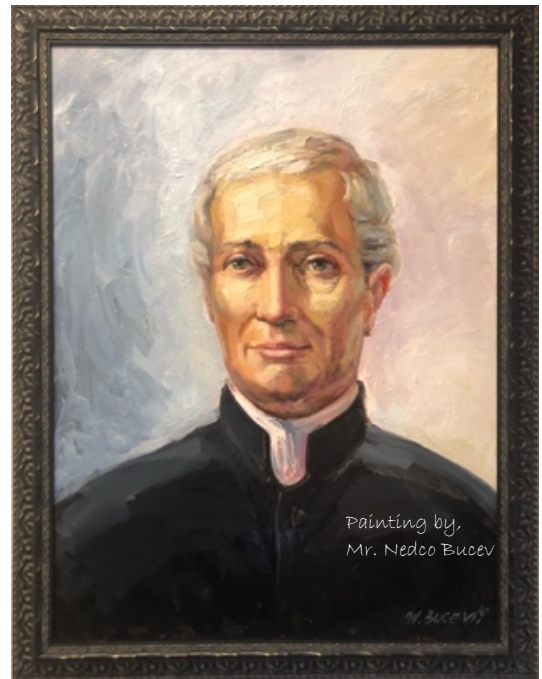
