CRUSADER COLLEGE COUNSELING EXPERIENCE Bergen Catholic's Roadmap to College



Bergen Catholic's interactive and comprehensive approach to college counseling begins in grade 9. Grade level meetings with students are held by experienced counselors to assist students in getting an early start in the college planning process. All students upon entering grade 9 will be assigned both a college counselor and a guidance counselor who will guide them socially, emotionally and educationally through their time as a Bergen Catholic student.

GRADE 9

Activity & Academic resumes are created with the college counseling office to include an interactive document on Naviance that student, parent and counselor can all access. Students begin developing goals to participate in each areas of concentration: academic, athletic or extracurricular activities, community service based experiences and attending a summer program. Counselors will meet with freshman multiple times throughout grade 9 to ensure all college preparation goals are met.

GRADE 10

Sophomores will continue building an outstanding academic profile that reflects all of their student accolades. Sophomores will be encouraged to start attending college fairs and college campus visits, take PSATs, learn with a BC teacher in an SAT/ACT prep course, participate in City as a Classroom cultural experience, attend a Crusader Mission-based summer trip, and volunteer locally in the community.

GRADE 11

Juniors will take PSAT/ ACT practice tests, take the SAT/ ACT/SAT II, receive counsel on scores, attend Junior parent/student meetings to develop individualized list of schools to apply, participate in AP testing program, attend college open houses, attend the JET tour at BC, College Panel and organized College Fairs.

GRADE 12

Seniors will receive assistance with the college application process: creating, preparing and sending a common and coalition application, assisting with teacher recommendation letter procurement, resume building and essay and supplement completion.

The Crusader College Counseling Experience helps alleviate the stress associated with the college process for all Bergen Catholic students and parents, and helps guide Crusaders to their exciting futures.

WATROS BUSINESS CENTER BC's New Center for Excellence

For over six decades, Bergen Catholic has helped mentor and launch successful careers for their students and alumni in a plethora of fields including education, law, medicine, athletics, performing arts and business. While over the years Crusaders have been prepared to cultivate future careers in business and finance by taking a business law class, or participating in extracurriculars such as the Stock Market Club, there weren't as many hands-on opportunities for BC students to develop and cultivate business mentorship and networking relationships during their time as students in Oradell. But that all changed in the 2022-2023 school year, with the creation of the state-of-the art Watros Business Center and the founding of the Finance & Investment Club at Bergen Catholic.







hanks in part to the generous donations made by Bergen Catholic Class of 2023 alumni parents Donald Watros and his wife Benedetta Casamento, Bergen Catholic has a new home for students interested in pursuing a potential career in business. The beautiful Watros Business Center is located near the McKenna-Lawrence Chapel, closest to the Forest Avenue side of campus. The center accommodates large classroom space, a comfortable lounge area, and a state-of-the art financial stock ticker which is elevated above the students in the middle of the classroom with updated stock prices and even sports scores.

"We are grateful for the generosity of Benedetta and Don Watros, who were instrumental in helping our vision for a business center for excellence become a reality. We are excited about the state-of-the-art center with modern furniture, breakout areas, and real-time stock ticker," said Bergen Catholic president Dr. Brian Mahoney. "The Watros Business Center will allow students to excel in business, finance, and entrepreneurship and use the skills they learn to gain admission to top business schools throughout the county."

The Watros Business Center has quickly emerged as a favorite destination for BC students, not only because of its elite amenities, but because of the designed environment that it was intended to promote. "I would hope that it's a club and a room where when the students are in it, they feel a sense of excitement studying and being interested in business, and that the environment stimulates them. And that was the goal: the environment, to be different and not just your average classroom," said co-founder Benedetta Casamento AP '23.

In conjunction with the creation of the Watros Business Center, the new Finance & Investment Club was established by DJ Watros '23 at the beginning of the 2022-2023 academic year. The club had interest from over 30 students in its inaugural year of existence, and the Crusaders were visited by a steady stream of guest speakers from the business world, many of which were successful Bergen Catholic alumni, who wanted to give back to their alma mater by helping the next generation of businesscentric Crusaders.

"I feel kids may not understand all the networking opportunities that this BC Brotherhood has, and I definitely think a Finance & Investments club expands on it," said DJ Watros '23, who served on the club's founding board

alongside Jack Staff '23, Andrew Mosco '23 and Luke Macejka '23.

Recent Bergen Catholic Hall of Fame inductee Brian Tramontozzi '90 served as the club's mentor and helped to set-up guest speakers from the business world in order to help foster networking and mentorship possibilities for the BC students.

"Most of my responsibility has been helping arrange presenters in the financial services space as well as host what will become an annual event for the club - 'a day on Wall Street,' which last year involved about a dozen presenters from different disciplines within commercial and investment banking, as well as their first power lunch at Bobby Vans Steakhouse," said Tramontozzi, who serves as Head of North American Leveraged Finance Capital Markets with JPMorgan Securities Inc.

Each of these additions have helped lay the groundwork for burgeoning business opportunities and academic concentrations at the school. Beginning in the current 2023-2024 school year, Bergen Catholic freshmen have the option to take an "Intro to Business" course throughout the academic trimester, while courses such as AP Economics and Entrepreneurship are offered to seniors.

"I see this center as a competitive advantage for our boys for getting into college, making decisions in college, and then onto their careers by creating a network," said Casamento. "It allows our boys, the students at Bergen Catholic, to then turn around while they are in college, and give back to BC by participating in the programs that this business center provides."

Now as a young alum studying business at the University of Miami, DJ Watros reflects back on what these new business additions to Bergen Catholic meant not only to himself and his classmates, but what they may also mean for future Crusaders who will benefit from the school's enhanced commitment to business.

"There are so many successful people who graduated from Bergen Catholic, but they had to find their own way by going to college and getting their internships. But if BC students could get one step closer, one step earlier, then they can find their success and find what they like to do."

Thanks to the Watros Family, business is booming at BC.

A Long Chat With BROTHER BEN MCDONOUGH, CFC

ergen Catholic's rich tradition and history is built upon the shoulders of the Edmund Rice Christian Brothers, the religious order that founded and staffed Bergen Catholic since 1955. We honor our past in the present, by taking time to introduce to the Crusader community Brother Ben McDonough, cfc, the Campus Minister at BC:

Tell us about yourself, where you grew up, where you went to school, and do you come from a big family?

I was born in Brooklyn, New York and we moved to Staten Island, New York when I was in first grade. I am the third child of four. I went to Our Lady Star of the Sea School and Monsignor Farrell High School both in Staten Island.

What inspired you to join the Edmund Rice Christian Brothers?

While I was a student at Farrell, I was intrigued by the different personalities of the 15 Brothers who were on staff. Somehow God tugged at my heart and I wanted to do what they were doing. I entered the Christian Brothers with 16 other young men when I graduated in 1974.


What are the blessings and challenges involved in working in an all-boys school environment?

Over the years I have taught grades 6-12 in various schools. I have been Dean of a high school and Principal of an elementary school and a high school. My last teaching experience, other than a brief return here last spring, was in Roxbury, MA sixteen years ago.

One of the hardest things to do was to leave school ministry and do something different. I was asked to work with migrants in Southwest Florida. After nine amazing years there, I returned to NYC to do outreach to the poor and those who minister to them in East Harlem.

As the school's campus minister, how do you help to educate and spread the Good News, while also welcoming others of different faiths at BC?

I have been here at Bergen for a year and involved with Father Sam Monaco in Campus Ministry. We've developed a retreat program for each year and all students have the opportunity to spend a day examining their relationships with God, themselves and others. It has been wonderful to hear from students how they see Edmund Rice and his charism lived out in the faculty, students, staff and









administration here. All of us are called to grow in our relationship with the God we know and understand. I am impressed at the faith I've seen in some of our non-Catholic students. We also help to make our liturgical celebrations prayerful. We work with the Senior Eucharistic Ministers, the lectors and the servers at mass.

So now having been at Bergen Catholic for over a year, what are your thoughts about being a part of this unique BC community?

Being in such an active school has made my head spin. I am not used to all of the activity. I am in awe of the dedicated people who tirelessly mentor and guide these young men. Bergen is an amazing place with such great outreach! May God and Blessed Edmund continue to bless us and our ministry here.









THE EDMUND RICE **MEDALLION**

BC's Visual Prayer of Art


Bergen Catholic High School has a brand-new piece of artwork that will captivate the Crusader community for generations to come. The work of art is entitled, Edmund Rice Medallion, a tribute to the founder of the Edmund Rice Christian Brothers, the religious order that founded Bergen Catholic. The medallion is located inside the main office entrance to the school and was created by Bergen Catholic art teacher Nedko Bucev, with assistance from his BC AP art students as well.

he medallion is made of brushed gold Aluminum Composite Material (ACM), the same material used on the current facades of the Manhattan skyscrapers. It was cut with a water laser following a computer-generated line. The background is also ACM fabricated and colored with Bergen Catholic's scarlet and red colors. The three crosses on the top and bottom of the backdrop, in addition to their air ducting function, represent two arrows pointing to Blessed Edmund Rice. One from the sky, meant to symbolize following Blessed Edmund Rice's example through our Christian faith, and the lower arrows symbolizing the Earth, and our following Blessed Edmund Rice in our everyday life.

"It is important to mention that this medallion celebrates Edmund Rice and his example of how students pray his name every morning," said Nedko Bucev. "It should be seen as a visual prayer. For this reason, the medallion vision is ethereal and delicate."

"The Edmund Rice Medallion shares with our school community the values of the life of Blessed Edmund Rice, the gifts that he's given to us, and the teachings he has instilled in us. It's an inspiration for all of us to see this medallion and remember what Blessed Edmund Rice has given, as we share our gifts with others," said Bergen Catholic President Dr. Brian Mahoney.

Jim Jacobsen '66 A Crusader Coaching Legend



Spanning a career of over 40 years, Coach Jake Jacobsen has achieved the epitome of success as the winningest coach in the state of New Jersey with 1,203 wins. Coach Jacobsen was honored recently at the Baccalaureate Mass for the Class of 2023. Following is the speech given by Mr. Timothy McElhinney, Principal of Bergen Catholic, discussing all of Coach Jacobsen's accomplishments.

oach Jim 'Jake' Jacobsen was born and raised in Bergenfield, NJ. As a child, he and his family were parishioners at St. John The Evangelist Parish also located in Bergenfield. Coach Jake is a proud 1966 graduate of Bergen Catholic High School. During his time at Bergen Catholic, he was a four-year member of the varsity track team, a member of the Debate Club as well as a member of the Chess Club. Please note that Coach Jake entered Bergen Catholic in September 1962. At that point, Bergen Catholic was only beginning its eighth year of existence and its oldest graduate was just 21 years old. In 1970, Coach Jake graduated from St. Leo's University. During his time at St. Leo's, he was a member of the school's soccer team, which was an impressive feat since he did not play soccer while a student at Bergen Catholic High School. Coach Jake was voted Class President and Athlete of the Year while a student at

St. Leo's. He later earned a Master's Degree in Language Arts from William Paterson University.

Coach Jake has had a varied and interesting professional career. He helped build the World Trade Center in New York City – working high in the sky on the buildings. Since heights clearly didn't phase him, his next career choice was that of a Sky Marshall, flying on planes to ensure the safety of the passengers. For those who don't know – the Sky Marshall program was created in 1970 by President Richard Nixon in reaction to a series of coordinated 'skyjackings' of planes, which occurred on September 6, 1970. The mission of the Sky Marshall program was to prevent on-flight piracy. Pretty brave stuff on the part of Coach Jake. Coach Jake then taught in a Catholic elementary school for two years, which was no doubt more dangerous than his previous two professions. Shortly after leaving the rough and tumble world of teaching, he began his professional life's work as an Insurance Claims Investigator. Initially, Coach Jake worked in big companies such as Ohio Casualty Insurance Company. However, he eventually opened his own extremely successful company in the insurance world.

Coach Jake began his term as the head coach of the Bergen Catholic High School varsity golf team in 1983 and he continues in that role today. So, Coach Jake has been the Bergen Catholic varsity golf coach for 41 consecutive years. During those 41 years, his teams have amassed an astonishing record of 1,203 wins, 37 losses and one tie. That means his teams have averaged just over 29 wins every season that he has coached — but more impressively his teams have four less total losses (37) than he has years served as the head coach (41).

During his coaching career, his teams have won:

- 39 League Championships
- 14 Non Public A North State Championships
- 6 Non Public A State Championships
- 8 New Jersey State Tournament of Champions victories and
- 33 times the Bergen County Coaches Association has named the Bergen Catholic High School Varsity Golf Team as the 'Team of the Year'

Additionally, just this past season, Coach Jake became the all-time winningest high school coach in the State of New Jersey. Meaning, Coach Jacobsen has more career victories in a single sport than any other coach who has ever coached high school sports in the state of New Jersey. Yes, he passed Coach Bobby Hurley this past season.

Due to his team's great successes, Coach Jake has won numerous Coach of the Year Awards — however, and most impressively — in 2013, Coach Jake was named the Boys Golf National Coach of the Year by the National High School Coaches Association. Certainly, a most deserving honor.

Coach Jake's players enjoy playing for him. Annually, they play the toughest schedule in North Jersey, on the finest courses and he provides detailed reports about every fairway and green of each course they play on. Coach Jake has also been a leader within the Bergen County Coaches Association ensuring that golf receives the appropriate recognition that it deserves.

While tonight we recognize Coach Jacobsen for his years of service as our golf coach, I would be remiss not to recognize his dedication and commitment as an alum of Bergen Catholic High School. He has been an officer in the Bergen Catholic High School Alumni Association, has served on the Bergen Catholic Golf Outing Committee and was the driving force in creating the Bergen Catholic Hall of Fame. And he can be regularly found in the stands and fields supporting our teams, players and coaches.

Coach Jacobsen is married to his lovely wife Linda and is the proud father of his son Derek.

- A 2007 Bergen Catholic High School Founder's Award Recipient
- A Corona Laurea Award Recipient for 20 years of Service as a Coach at Bergen Catholic High School

And now for the first time in the history of Bergen Catholic High School, Coach Jim Jacobsen is being presented with the Corona Olivae Award for 40 plus years of service to Bergen Catholic High School as a coach.

Ladies and Gentlemen, a true Bergen Catholic High School legend — Coach Jim 'Jake' Jacobsen."



Billy Armstrong, Bergen Catholic class of '94 and the school's current head varsity basketball coach, says that growing up he always considered himself to be "normal and average." Today, with successful high school, college and professional playing careers behind him, a thriving basketball-focused business, and a coaching career that has seen Bergen Catholic basketball emerge as one of the state's powerhouse programs, the "normal and average" description no longer applies.

rmstrong's playing career began when he tried out, along with 120 classmates, for BC's freshman team. He made the team, but as the "8th man", and believed he wasn't anything special. Dedication and hard work – sometimes up until 2 a.m. doing drills in his driveway – brought marked improvement, and by his junior year he had made the BC varsity team. In his senior season, Armstrong helped lead the Crusaders to league, county and state championships, and was named to All-League, All-County and 1990s Bergen County All-Decade teams.

Trust, Care, and Commitment

As senior year captain of his Davidson College team, Armstrong led the Wildcats to the Southern Conference Championship and the school's first NCAA tournament berth in 12 years. After graduating from Davidson, he enjoyed a six-year professional career in Europe, as well as with the United States Basketball League and the American Basketball Association.

Armstrong lives in Westwood with his wife, Lauren, and his three children: April, Summer Rae and Trey William. They live within walking distance of BC — a nice convenience, given Billy's busy work schedule which also includes his position in the Bergen Catholic Advancement Office. In addition to leading BC's basketball program to incredible success in his coaching tenure: (2 state championships, 3 sectional crowns & 3 Bergen County Jamboree titles), Billy and Lauren operate "Hoop Dreamz", (hoopdreamz.org) and together run a number of camps, academies, and additional training initiatives.

Starting about 19 years ago with one young man in his backyard in Oradell, Armstrong said they now have, "probably 2,000 kids come through the door every year, so we've been very fortunate." In addition to the camps and clinics, they operate AAU club teams and have 10 teams for boys in grades 3-9, as well as four teams for girls in grades 5-8. Add to this the after-school programs they call the "Dream Academy," and Armstrong's semi-private and private training sessions, and it's clear basketball truly is his life. And he says he wouldn't have it any other way.

When asked how attending, and playing for, Bergen Catholic changed him and impacted his life, Armstrong said that first of all, it took him out of his comfort level. "I saw there were a lot of really smart kids and some really high-level athletes. I wanted to be like those guys. By getting out of my comfort

zone and being 'pushed and stretched' it really impacted me," he said. "I also learned it wasn't just about me. At BC I learned when you help somebody, you help yourself."

And how about the people at BC who had the greatest influence on Armstrong's life and career? "Brother Jensen, for sure," Armstrong replied. "He taught me toughness and compassion. He was on dialysis and would still coach us between going back and forth for treatment. He'd sweep the floor, carry the balls, drive the van. He never complained or made excuses. Even after I graduated and went on to Davidson, he helped me get through the calculus requirement. He tutored me, free of charge, for six weeks. I guess he just thought it was the right thing to do."

Another major influence on Armstrong was Chris Donfield, the longtime Bergen Catholic varsity coach. "The number one way he impacted me was in terms of service. He showed me that the first part of being a leader is through service to others. He showed it through the day-to-day caring for his players. He would do anything for us and was always there for us, on and off the court," Armstrong said.

And the "Trust, Care, and Commitment" motto? Armstrong said those are his core values and how he tries to live his life, both inside and outside of coaching. "Nothing works without trust, I don't believe there's enough caring in our society and I always ask my kids to make a commitment to something bigger than themselves," he added.

"When my players play for me and they go on to graduate, it doesn't end there. They don't just come to Bergen Catholic, help us win some basketball games and that's it. Hopefully, it's a relationship I'll have with them forever."

Sounds a little like Brother Jensen, doesn't it?









A Conversation With JAMES ROGERS '16

ergen Catholic has long been a fertile ground for cultivating the leaders of tomorrow, and setting their students on a pathway to success. This crusade for excellence is seen in so many unique BC alumni stories, and we are always extremely proud to share time with our fellow Crusaders, and hear how Bergen Catholic helped make a difference in their lives.

We had the chance to catch up with an exceptional Bergen Catholic alum, James Rogers '16, who shared with us how his personal crusade to help others grew from his time in Oradell:

What year did you graduate from Bergen Catholic?

I graduated Bergen Catholic in 2016.

What schools have you attended? What degrees do you have?

I obtained my Bachelor of Science in Neuroscience and Psychology (conferred with Departmental Honors) from Tulane University in New Orleans, LA, graduating summa cum laude, Phi Beta Kappa, and in the top 1% of my undergraduate class. During my undergraduate studies, I also completed study abroad experiences at the University of Edinburgh (Scotland) and University of Zürich (Switzerland).

How did Bergen Catholic prepare you for college? How did Bergen help with your career choice?

Bergen Catholic provided me with foundational training to become a Catholic gentleman leader. Influential teachers like Mr. Gerald Goldee and Mr. John G. Pawlyk taught me not only rigorous course content in mathematics and foreign language, but also life lessons about what it means to act with character, respect, and humility. Two teachers had a particular impact on my career trajectory and nascent success in academic medicine: Mrs. Diane Trunfio and Mrs. Eileen Holt. Mrs. Trunfio, my senior Advanced Placement Biology teacher, was an inspiring educator who pushed me to my academic limits and encouraged me to pursue a career in medicine. Mrs. Holt, my sophomore English teacher, instilled in me strong reading and writing skills, powerful tools that have shaped my academic career and enabled me to publish twelve peer-reviewed scientific manuscripts in medical journals. Additionally, as a member of the Bergen Catholic Baseball program for four years, I learned valuable lessons in leadership, determination, and grit that have transcended sports and influenced my college studies and career choice.

Where are you currently working/studying?

I am currently completing a two-year Cancer Research Training Award postbaccalaureate research fellowship in the Neuro-Oncology Branch, Center for Cancer Research, National Cancer Institute, National Institutes of Health, US Department of Health and Human Services under the mentorship of Drs. Terri Armstrong and Mark Gilbert. I have been working with this same clinical research group for the past five years, as a summer intern, special volunteer, and fellow. This July, I will begin pursuing my MD at Vanderbilt University School of Medicine in Nashville, TN.

What is your ultimate goal?

My ultimate goal on completion of medical school is to become a neurosurgeon, more specifically an academic neurosurgical oncologist. Therefore, I aspire to become a physician who surgically removes brain tumors, engages in clinical research, and teaches residents and trainees. I seek to join the fight against brain cancer, improving and prolonging the lives of those with this debilitating disease.

Why have you started volunteering at Bergen Catholic events with the Alumni Association?

I have started volunteering with the Bergen Catholic Alumni Association because I want to see more students graduate and pursue careers in medicine. I am currently serving in a two-year position on the Alumni Association Board as an elected decade representative for 2011-2020. Additionally, I am an Alumni Chair for the Class of 2016 and a member of the Bergen Catholic Hall of Fame nomination committee. I am excited to volunteer for events to give back to a school with such a noble mission of preparing young men to become dynamic global leaders by deepening religious faith, developing academic excellence, and strengthening social consciousness and responsibility. It has been fulfilling to Bergen Catholic graduates see matched with job and networking opportunities. To date, I have organized my Class of 2016 5-year reunion and volunteered at Open Houses and the Careers4Crusaders networking event as a panelist.

Pair of ACL Injuries Crystalize Plan A For Former Princeton Chapter Leader KURT HOLUBA '14

ix years ago former Princeton Tigers football All-American Kurt Holuba had a clear vision of his future. Coming off the best season of his life in 2016, Kurt was locked in on taking his shot at the NFL.

That was his Plan A. Although he would graduate with a degree in Psychology from Princeton, he admits that at that time, Plan B was much less clear.

It was the NFL or bust for the former standout defensive lineman.

Kurt had his own Plan A, but it turns out life had an alternate Plan A for Kurt that wasn't anywhere on his radar.

Looking back, though, where Kurt is headed today – he starts medical school at Columbia University this month – isn't a reach. If you travel back a decade or so there are several examples of Kurt choosing the road less traveled and carving out his own path.

Going to medical school to become a doctor and serve others is just the latest.

The catalyst for the former Princeton Chapter of Uplifting Athletes President to find his lane in life centers around suffering ACL tears to the same knee in back-to-back years. Those soul-crushing injuries quickly erased his Plan A dreams and forced Kurt to dig deep and to explore alternative options to find his true passion and purpose.

"I think (medical school) was definitely NOT on my radar. It was really that final two years at Princeton with my injuries that forced me to really think about my life. I evaluated my

passions and I took stock and evaluated several options. I knew this was it," Kurt said. "Everything happens for a reason. Those injuries were tough but had they not happened to me I would not be on this path.

"I would never have found this passion and purpose aligning had I not suffered those injuries."

The first knee injury came halfway through Kurt's senior year in 2017 against Harvard. All major injuries to athletes are laced with peril and question marks, and Kurt was no different. He had a medical redshirt he could use and he quickly returned to his Plan A and "worked his tail off" that spring and summer with a goal to return to the field of play in 2018.

It was the second ACL tear of the same knee eight days before the first game of his fifth year in 2018 that shook Kurt to his core. And it wasn't just physical. This time it also took a major mental and emotional toll on him.

"It was an extremely dark place. I was going through sessions with a sports psychologist, my fiance, Kelly, had graduated and was visiting almost every weekend for support. It was extremely difficult. Yeah I was struggling," Kurt said. "Losing football stripped a part of my identity. It's been a process over the past three years to grow and find my way."

In many ways Kurt was suddenly like every other college student who earns a degree and isn't exactly sure what the next best steps are. He had already laid some groundwork over the years that served him well. He sought answers to questions he wasn't even sure were exactly the right ones to be asking.













Before he moved forward too fast, Kurt had to figure out how to take care of himself. He knew staying close to the game, his teammates and friends was vital. He couldn't contribute on the field, but somehow he had to do something as a leader and team captain. So, he started working in practice with the younger defensive lineman to teach them what he had learned. It served others and himself well.

"I'm not gonna lie, in many ways it was pure torture watching those guys go 10-0 and win an Ivy League title on the sidelines. But I was doing all I could do and I was proud of that," Kurt said. "The other captains of that team were part of my support network that really helped me. John Lovett, Mark Fossati and Tom Johnson... Those guys were everything.

"Especially a guy like John. We both had great success on the field and had NFL dreams. And I get shot down right at the goal line. He felt my pain and I could feel that. To this day all of us are close and talk to each other. They brought me along for the ride and it's a bond that will never be broken. The hardship and difficulty of that time made a difference for all of us."

Once football was done, the "what's next" question needed an answer. The injuries afforded Kurt an opportunity to dive deeper into his classwork. Without football dominating his daily schedule, Kurt's academic interests felt re-ignited. That was one part of the equation. Helping and serving others was still a top priority for him, though. And Kurt had a plethora of experiences to use as a guide in making his decision.

Kurt graduated from a faith-based Catholic High School in New Jersey where giving back was mandatory. It was the first glimpse for Kurt into one of his true passions — giving back and helping others. But he needed it to be more personal for it to have real meaning and purpose for him. Simply putting in the time and checking the box didn't work for Kurt.

He became the Princeton Chapter of Uplifting Athletes President his sophomore year in 2015. He formed a connection with the Rare Disease Community and discovered the correlation between what the Tigers program was doing annually and how it was impacting people with rare diseases resonated with him.

His final year of college he contacted a Princeton alumnus, Martin Johnson, who founded the nonprofit Isles in Trenton, New Jersey. Kurt was offered an internship and learned more about how important serving and helping others is when it came to figuring out what he wanted to do with his life.

Kurt had previously explored selling commercial real estate. It's what his father and brothers do. He spent two summer internships during college in commercial real estate, but realized that wasn't an option he was interested in. The true giving back and helping others element was missing for him.

"There was this continuous growing sense that above all else I wanted to do something in the service of others," Kurt said. "Working with people one-on-one at Isles was amazing, working with Uplifting Athletes and actually seeing that the work I was doing was actually helping people opened my eyes. I could actually see that for the first time. I just couldn't imagine myself doing something where I wasn't giving back."

By the time Kurt graduated from Princeton in the spring of 2019, his decision was made. Everything pointed to the road that most wouldn't choose to travel but was perfect for him a 10-year commitment and something he never imagined himself doing until life and circumstances stepped in.

When the second knee injury robbed Kurt of his Plan A, it put him at another crossroads. He stayed true to the passion that fuels him. Similar to choosing Princeton coming out of high school, where he chose the Ivy League school calling it a '40-year decision not a four-year decision' despite offers from more than a dozen FBS programs, Kurt knew medicine would check all the boxes he was looking for in making another 40-year decision.

"I jumped into the postbac premed classes right after I graduated and was curious how my newfound academic self would handle that. I wasn't the football guy on campus or team captain anymore. I was just a guy there to study," Kurt said. "It was exactly what I had hoped for. Medicine will provide me the opportunity to not only heal personally, but also to help and serve others.

"I'm obviously nervous and anxious about medical school because this wasn't something that was anywhere on my passion radar at first. But since deciding to embark on this journey, I couldn't imagine myself doing anything else. I'm excited and know all this hard work will pay off in the name of helping people."

uhlenberg football players often refer to their team as a "brotherhood" because of the strong bonds and sense of togetherness team members enjoy. For three outstanding players in the last decade, it was an actual brotherhood.

When Michael Feaster '22 walked across the field to pick up his plaque as MVP of the Mules' bowl win against Lebanon Valley last November, it ended the "Feaster Era" of Muhlenberg football that began with John Feaster '17 and continued with Frankie Feaster '20.

The three Feaster brothers combined for 11 All-Centennial Conference selections and three All-America nods as Mules. More importantly, they led Muhlenberg to a sparkling 84-22 record, three Centennial Conference (CC) championships, nine postseason berths and nine postseason wins in nine seasons.

"The Feaster family impact has been immense on our program and College," says Mule head coach Nate Milne.

It all began in late 2012 when John was a senior at Bergen Catholic High School in northern New Jersey. College coaches cycled through the school regularly, and one day Tom Perkovich, then the Mules' offensive coordinator, stopped by and introduced John to Muhlenberg.

"The overnight visit was the key," recalls John, who currently works in the fashion industry. "After visiting a bunch of different campuses, Muhlenberg felt the most right. You know, you just get that gut feeling that this is the place that you're meant to go and meant to grow at."

John entered preseason camp as a wide receiver but on the second day was converted to cornerback, a position at which he flourished. A four-year starter, he is the only Mule football player ever named to the All-CC team four straight seasons, finishing his career in the top five in program history in both interceptions (15) and pass breakups (22).

When it came time for Frankie to select a college, his experience attending games to watch his brother play was a big factor. "The Muhlenberg atmosphere engulfed you when you were there," he says. "I fell in love with the culture, and it was the only school that I really visited."

The culture, and the opportunity to play two sports, were the big selling points for Frankie. He set numerous school records as a faceoff specialist in lacrosse and reached incredible heights in football after switching from tight end to defensive end late in his freshman season. A twotime All-American and two-time CC defensive player of the year, he set a school record with 34 sacks.

"I guess you can say I didn't have a choice, right?" jokes Michael about his college decision. "No, I always had the opportunity to go wherever I wanted, but at the end of the day, I really didn't have a choice just because of what I'd seen [attending his brothers' games] and what these two guys did for me."

Michael, who recently accepted a job in capital markets with Vitreous Loan Group, earned All-America honors as a wide receiver in 2021 and finished his career with 176 receptions, the third-most in program history, including a school-record 104 in one season.

Three brothers, three all-stars at three different positions.

Had COVID not canceled his senior season, Frankie — a physical education teacher and assistant football coach at Bergen Catholic and head boys lacrosse coach at Cedar Grove High School — would have played all four of his college years with a brother as a teammate.

"It's something I definitely don't take for granted," he says. "I cherish those moments every single day. I wish I could go back and play with both of them at the same time."

As much as the brothers enjoyed playing with each other, there was the inevitable sibling rivalry. When Frankie played tight end, he would on occasion be covered by John in practice.

"It was always a spectacle when it would happen, and everyone's eyes kind of gravitated there, especially if they knew that Frankie was going out for a pass," says John. "I'll be honest, he caught a few on me, but I also knocked most of them down."

And although Frankie, as a defensive end, never covered Michael downfield, there were times when Michael was in motion and had to try to block Frankie at the line of scrimmage. "It didn't end well for him, but he let me have it," says Frankie. "He definitely gave it his all."

But beyond the sibling rivalry is an incredible sense of pride the Feasters feel about each other, and about a Muhlenberg football program they helped elevate to national stature.

"If I had to do it all over again, I'd do it the exact same way because I truly think Muhlenberg shaped me to who I am today," says John. "Having my brothers follow in those footsteps is just a really cool experience to know that we share so many of those memories together and we will always have that to fall back on.

"But now I think I'm known as Frankie and Michael's brother instead of as John."

"I've always just focused on having the opportunity to pursue a good and safe education wherever that may be. All of the teachers who came across his path had a profound impact on him in one way or another. The overall thing he learned from them was how to help others. He acknowledges how teachers work for the common goal of the students and he, too, hopes to one day work to help others. He cites his work with

Mr. Rendine's Honors Research course as an example of how faculty mentor individual students, pushing them academically and inspiring them to grow as productive members of society, all while looking towards their near future goals.

He acknowledges how the entire school — faculty and staff, coaches and teammates, and classmates — gave him the tools that allowed him to be successful and it was his choice to use them to find success. His advice for families considering a Bergen Catholic education is that they will have a community that will support them without hesitation, and their sons will be given all of the tools they need to succeed there and beyond, if he wants to do so. Divangel says that he learned how to be a respectful, disciplined and selfless individual who could lead others. "Simply put, this school helped me achieve my dreams by giving me the tools I needed. Whether it was the academic knowledge, the mentorship, the overall support, or the guidance with the college process I had it all. In reality, they set me up for success. It was just a question of whether or not I wanted to take advantage of those opportunities, or let them go to waste." And he did not let them go to waste. Applying to Harvard, getting in, and getting a full scholarship Divangel will continue to follow his dreams. We wish him much success.

im recalled the inherent joy he experienced while first learning to play on a baseball diamond in Little League, and later felt that same sensation after giving back to his local community as a volunteer youth coach. 


2023 Hall of Fame Honorees



Michael Bowe '84

Mike is a go-to trial lawyer in major litigations across the country. His landmark RICO cases against several powerful hedge funds have been credited with sparking the largest insider trading investigation and conviction in history and have been featured on "60

Minutes," in documentaries and in bestselling books, and in business school classes. Mike relishes representing the less powerful against the most powerful and is particularly proud of his civil rights case against New Jersey and the world's largest asset manager on behalf of New Jersey's only African-American founded and run asset manager, his successful pro bono representation of United States Marine Major Jason Brezler, and his regular and varied pro bono representations of single and expectant mothers in the Bronx. Mike is a long-time supporter of Bergen Catholic and other organizations that laid the essential foundation for his life; his local parish, where he has served as Trustee; the Tunnel to Towers Foundation; and the selfless work of the Sisters of Charity and Sisters of Life. Mike could have done none of this without the unconditional love and support of his parents, Mary and Jim Bowe, his amazing wife, Stacy, and his impressive son and great friend, Patrick, an NYU freshman who always inspires Mike to be the best person he can be.



John Crowley '85

John is the Executive Chairman & Founder of Amicus Therapeutics, a global biotechnology company. John's involvement with biotechnology stems from the 1998 diagnosis of two of his children with Pompe disease — a severe and often fatal neuromuscular disorder.

John and his family have been profiled numerous times on the front page of *The Wall Street Journal*. The major motion picture, "Extraordinary Measures," starring Brendan Fraser and Harrison Ford, is inspired by the Crowley family journey. John is the author of a personal memoir: "Chasing Miracles: The Crowley Family Journey of

Strength, Hope, and Joy." After attending the United States Naval Academy, he graduated with a B.S. in Foreign Service from Georgetown University and earned a J.D. from the University of Notre Dame Law School and an M.B.A. from the Harvard Business School. John served as a commissioned intelligence officer in the U.S. Navy Reserve from 2005-2016, assigned to the Joint Special Operations Command (JSOC), and is a veteran of the global war on terrorism. In 2011, he served as the Deputy J-2 (Deputy Chief of Intelligence) for an elite special operations task force in Afghanistan.

The Crowley family was the recipient of the 2011 Family Exemplar Award from the University of Notre Dame. He is the former National Chairman of the Make-A-Wish Foundation of America. He was awarded a Doctor of Laws Degree (Honoris Causa) from the University of Notre Dame, where he delivered the commencement address to the Class of 2020. He serves as a member of the Board of Directors of the United States Naval Academy Foundation. John and his wife Aileen have been married for 32 years and their children are John, Jr. (28), Megan (26) and Patrick (24). They have one grandchild, Stella Aileen.




Anthony DeBellis '85

Tony is a 1985 graduate of Bergen Catholic. Subsequently, he completed studies at Pace University, Lubin School of Business, in just three years. Upon graduation from college, Tony began his career in the insurance industry. At the same

time, he began coaching football at BC at the

age of 20 years old. As a player and a coach, Tony has been a part of over 300 varsity football victories with the Crusaders. He has also been part of 13 State Championships and eight #1 ranked football teams in NI (and counting). Tony was the offensive coordinator in the 1990's where for the decade the program went 99 and 10, highlighted by the 1998 Crusaders which went 12-0, scored a school record of 599 points, and was named the Team of the Century by the Bergen Record. Moving through the 2000's, Coach DeBellis helped on both sides of the ball before settling in as the defensive coordinator in 2014. As the head of this unit he led the Bergen Catholic defense to a 12-0 record in 2021. Tony started his own insurance agency in 1999. His office is in Hackensack, NJ. Tony and his wife Tracy (maiden name Campanile, his high school sweetheart), have been active supporters of BC for over 40 years. Tony and Tracy started the NJ Freedom AAU girls club basketball organization in 2001. Tony had the honor and privilege of coaching his three daughters, Dakota, Hunter, and Colby, throughout their basketball careers.



Thomas Kearney

Tom was a proud member of the 1986 Parochial A North State Championship football team. In his senior year, Tom set then existing school records for most yards rushing in a single game (281 yards) and in a single season (1.517)

backer. That year, Tom earned 1st Team All-County, 1st Team All-Groups All-State and Honorable Mention All-American recognition as a running back and participated in the New Jersey North/South football game. Tom also earned four varsity letters as a sprinter on the B.C. track team and competed in the New Jersey State Meet of Champions in both his junior (200 meter dash) and senior (100 meter dash) years. Tom was awarded the Br. Eugene McKenna alumni scholarship as the "graduating senior who best typifies the Bergen Catholic man." Although his collegiate football career was curtailed by injury, Tom played for the 1989 Ivy League championship football team at Yale. A career public servant, Tom has worked as an Assistant Prosecutor in Bergen County and as an Assistant U.S. Attorney in the District of New Jersey. He and his wife Christy currently reside in Bergen County with their four children.



Daniel Lawrence Kurpick

Dan is number five of seven children and was raised in Prospect Park, NJ. Dan graduated from Manchester Regional High School in 1983 and he was already working with family members in the construction field. He knew at an early age

turned down a trade school scholarship to continue working with Passaic Valley Construction. Dan became the foreman

for VWV Construction and worked for them for four years before joining the Bergen Catholic maintenance team in 1990. He quickly joined in on many projects for Bergen Catholic and was promoted to the Director of Facilities in 1998. As the Director of Facilities, he has worked with four Bergen Catholic Presidents and five Bergen Catholic Principals, making Bergen Catholic the place it is today. Football Championship. As a senior, he helped lead the Crusaders to the NNJIL League Championship and a return trip to the Parochial A State Finals. Mike completed his senior season holding the career records for passing yards, passing touchdowns, pass completions and rushing touchdowns by a quarterback. In 1987, he was named 1st Team All-State Parochial, 1st Team All-League, and 3rd Team All-County. In golf, BC won the 1988 New Jersey State Tournament of Champions in Mike's senior season. BC also won the BCGL Championship, the NNJIL Championship and the NJ District I Championship all four years that he played. Mike was selected 1st Team All-Bergen County as a senior and 2nd Team All-Bergen County as a junior. He went on to play Division I golf at Lehigh University.





Brian Tramontozzi

Brian's path to Bergen Catholic started ten years before his birth when his father Anthony was a freshman at Villanova University. Anthony was so impressed by the maturity and preparedness of his roommate, a BC graduate, he decided if

he had sons that they would attend Bergen Catholic. Brian entered BC in 1986 and embraced his time as a Crusader. His senior year, despite his 5'7" frame and 160 lb. weight, Brian was starting center for Bergen Catholic's varsity football team and never once played against anyone his size. He was head of the school's peer tutoring program and was also named "Volunteer of the Year" at Spectrum for Living in Closter. Brian graduated Georgetown University in 1994. He played for Georgetown's nationally-ranked Division I rugby team and was a member of both the Potomac Rugby Union and Eastern Collegiate Division all-star teams. Brian has spent his entire career with JPMorgan Securities Inc. and is presently Head of North American Leveraged Finance Capital Markets. He has remained active with Bergen Catholic since graduation as he has always felt an obligation to give back to the school that made him into the person he is today. He is a Class Chair, an Alumni Advisor to the Bergen Catholic Finance and Investment Club, and an annual presenter at Careers4Crusaders. He is an active member of the Crusader Touchdown Club and is a fixture at BC athletic events. He also serves as an advisor to numerous Bergen Catholic graduates looking for career paths in investment banking. Brian resides in Harrison, NY and Fly Creek, NY. He is the proud husband of Kathleen and father of Luke, Jack, Ava and William.





1991 National Champion Mock Trial Team

The student leaders of Bergen Catholic's 1991 Mock Trial Team were Glen McGorty, Attorney Captain; Chris DeCarlo, Attorney; and Michael Olivo, Attorney. The team also included six student witnesses as it initially competed in the Bergen County, Northern Regional and New Jersey State Competitions, all of which were won by Bergen Catholic. All team preparation occurred under the motivation and guidance of the Attorney Coach, Dominick Preziosi '67, and the Teacher Coach, Babetta Ferris. Preparations began in September with team tryouts, intense analysis of a legal case created by the New Jersey State Bar Foundation, lawyer and witness role assignment followed by the team lawyers developing prosecution and defense lines of questioning, as well as witnesses interpreting their story, their character and strategy development. Initially meeting a few times a week to prepare for the Bergen County and Northern Regional Competitions, the team later met seven days a week as it prepared for the New Jersey State Competition. This was followed by a six-week "full court press" on a complex civil case for the National Mock Trial Competition in New Orleans. At the National Mock Trial Competition, the team won four trials against other state champions over the course of two days. In the fifth and final trial of the competition, Bergen Catholic dominated the Texas state champions to win the National Mock Trial Championship, delivering Bergen Catholic its first national title in any competitive endeavor.
