2023 BERGEN CATHOLIC CRUSADERS AT A GLANCE

The Crusaders enter today's game under the direction of Head Coach, Vito Campanile, the eleventh coach in program history. Coach Campanile has done nothing but polish an apple, leading the Crusaders to three consecutive #1 state rankings and two straight Non-Public

"A" State Championship with a top 25 rankings in the USA Today and MaxPreps in 2021 (#3)and 2022 (#20).

BC was recognized by MaxPreps as the top high school football team in the state of New Jersey as we enter the season.

Coach Campanile took the helm at Bergen Catholic in 2018, succeeding brother, Nunzio, who led BC to a state championship in 2017. Coach Vito immediately found success during the 2018 season, leading BC to the state final before the Crusaders were upset by St. Joseph Regional at MetLife Stadium.

Following a five-and-four 2019 campaign, Covid-19 prevented Campanile's #1-ranked Crusaders from pursuing a state championship as the state tournament was cancelled for the season.

In 2021, Coach Campanile led BC to its 18th state championship and second-ever 12-0 record. The Crusaders were the class of the state of New Jersey and earned the school's highest ever ranking to date of #3 in the country. Last year, the Crusaders defeated Don Bosco Prep in the State Final 45-0 to clinch the school's 19th State Championship.

In recognition of his commitment to excellence and leadership, Coach Campanile was recognized by the **USA Today** as the Nation's High School Boys Coach of the Year.


In five years at the helm of BC, Coach Campanile has a record of 43-8 (.843 winning percentage), two state championships and three-straight #1 rankings in NJ and two league titles. In his 16-year head coaching career, Coach Campanile has a record of 126-58 (a .685 winning percentage).

BERGEN CATHOLIC ON OFFENSE

The Crusader Offense starts with its air raid offense. Junior **QB Dominic Campanile (#17)** is an athletic southpaw slinger who has completed 62.8 percent of his passes for 1,126 yards. In just over two years, Campanile has completed 155 passes for 2,307 yards. He has 16 touchdown passes this year, raising his career total to 30.



Campanile's top target would be anyone's top target in NJ and beyond. **Quincy Porter (#0)** is a junior wide receiver who is already shattering all of BC's career records. He took down Aaron Martin's career TD reception record vs. Seton Hall Prep and currently stands at 22 for his career and 11 in 2023. Porter has 61 career receptions for 1,200 yards. This season his 26 catches for 537 yards (20.7 yards per carry) represents almost a touchdown for every other reception he's made. **Luca Cutitta (#6)** is developing into a big-play threat, especially after his exceptional performance against Don Bosco Prep at the end of September. The senior receiver has 8 receptions for 169 yards (21.2 ypc) and two touchdowns. Junior slot **Anthony Perrotti (#2)** is the team's second leading receiver with 21 catches and 162 yards and a touchdown. Junior slotback

Michael Campanile (#4) and sophomore running back Dante Kain (#20) also have touchdown receptions this season.

Four-star Rutgers-commit, **Kaj Sanders (#1)** currently leads the Crusader ground game with 361 yards on 49 carries (8.7 YPC). Sanders has six touchdowns on the season and is currently the team's second leading scorer. Junior running back, **Mu Russell (#23)** has 43 carries for 210 yards and one rushing touchdown. Kain has 215 yards on 38 carries, a 6.3 yards per carry average.

The offensive line has been dealing with some injuries and in the past two weeks, has relied on several younger players to pitch in to support the cause. That said, the team is averaging 31.8 points per game and has gained over 1604 yards (320.8 yards per game). From left-to-right, expect to see LT Nyier Daniels (#79), LG Owen Fernandez (#64), C Marcus Linder (#50), RG Ben Shue (#72) and RT Chris Vigna (#56). Do not be surprised if sophomores Rocco Costello (#71) and Mikey McMahon (#77) will contribute at times.

BERGEN CATHOLIC ON DEFENSE

The Crusader defense has been sound, yielding only 7 points per game in those contests.

Senior linebacker **Christian Gonzalez (#10)** leads all Crusader tacklers with 38 on the season. Junior linebacker **Kaden Irby-Mason (#14)** is right on his heels with 36. BC is happy to see the return of junior linebacker, David Matesic (#9) who has now recorded 18 tackles in 4 games.

On the defensive line, senior West Virginia commit, **Elijah Kinsler** (#8) leads the group with 31 tackles, 3.5 sacks and 4.5 tackles for a loss. Junior DT **Delaney Flood** (#99) has two sack equivalents, a TFL and AN INTERCEPTION! At DE, junior **Ben Carey** (#97) with 23 tackles and sophomore **Jermaine Kinsler** (#88) six tackles, help to set an edge.

In the secondary, junior corner **Naiim Parrish** (#5) has two interceptions on the year, after setting a BC sophomore record for interceptions in a season as he led the 2022 Bergen squad with 5. Parrish has 19 solo tackles. His superior play has encouraged opposing coordinators to attack the sophomore corner, **Jordan Thomas** (#23). All Thomas has done is intercept three passes in the young season and leads the team in solo tackles with 20. Senior safety **Kaj Sanders** (#1) has 26 tackles on the season and provides senior leadership in an outstanding but dinged-up secondary. Freshman **Anthony Willis** (#24) is on the mend, but senior **Chris Mimmo** (#3) who is out for the season, have left an opportunity at the safety position for **Ethan Cohalt** (#7) and **Russell** (#23) to make their marks.

BERGEN CATHOLIC SPECIAL TEAMS

Senior punter Brandon Arpacilar (#25) is showing what an asset he is. The junior averages 37.9 yards per punt, a 34.8-yard net. He has a long of 57 yards and can help BC win the field position game in a tight game, pinning the opponent inside the 20 (so far 6 times this season).

Junior place kicker **Guytano Bartolomeo (#37)**, BC's points man, picked up where he left off last season. He is currently 25 for 25 on XPAs

and 5 for 5 on FGAs in 2023. His career scoring total are: 97 points on 7/8 Field Goals and 76/77 PATs.

Juniors **Perrotti (#2)** and **Parrish (#5)** each average around 35 yards per kickoff return with Perrotti getting most of the attempts.

GREEN KNIGHT OFFENSE AT A GLANCE

Patrick Grusser (#8) pulls the trigger for the greenest show on earth. The senior 6'2-190 lb. signal caller has thrown for 1,266 yards (211 per game) and 9 touchdowns with only two passes intercepted. He has completed 88 of 125 passes, an excellent 71.5 completion percentage. Grusser is closing in on 200 career completions and currently has over 2,500 career passing yards. He is a threat to run as well, picking up 278 yards and scoring 5 rushing touchdowns. Junior **Monti Krkuti (#5)** has completed 5 of 6 passes for 154 yards and two touchdowns. That is a whopping 30.8 yards per completion!

The Green Knights have a solid running game to say the least. Combined, SJR rushers have run for 1,378 yards and 23 touchdowns. Senior Pitt commit **Yasin Willis (#6)** leads a talented stable of rushers with 33 career TDs and 2,624 career yards. He is the team leader this season with 486 yards on 89 carries (5.5 YPC) and reaching the endzone seven times. Classmate **Terrance Sumter (#0)** has 373 yards on 46 carries (8.1 YPC) and six touchdowns. Junior John Forster

(#4) can add some pop coming out of the backfield as well. He has 961 career yards from scrimmage and 11 TDs.

Junior **Jovon Williams (#1)** and sophomore **Nathan Bailey (#7)** are the two leading receivers for the Green Knights. Williams has a pair of touchdowns on 27 receptions for 367 yards (13.6 YPR). Bailey also has two TDs and even a bigger play threat with 410 yards on 26 catches (15.8 YPR). **Jimmy Montesano (#12)** and **Mekhi Rossignol (#2)** each have three touchdowns.

GREEN KNIGHT DEFENSE

The heart of the Joe's defense is linebacker **Ricky Anastasi (#44).** The Senior leads the team with 30 tackles and has 74 career tackles entering today's game. Junior **Will Barbieri (#9)** has 28 tackles including 13 solos. Junior CB **Jahmir Joseph (#3)** is the top recruit in his grade in NJ according to 247 Sports. He is second on the team in tackles with 20. He has 2 interceptions and 4 forced fumbles.

ST. JOE'S SPECIALS

Salvatore Salafia (#45) started out the season but missed a couple of games before coming back against Donovan Catholic. He 7 for 7 in that game with a 27-yard field goal. Salafia has been perfect in his four games this year 24/24 extra points and 1/1 on field goals. Junior CB Jahmir Joseph is capable doubling as a place kicker at times. Watch out for Junior **John Forster (#4)** who has a kickoff return for a TD in his career.

The Crusader-Green Knight Rivalry began in 1965 with the Crusaders travelling to Montvale with a state championship team. It wasn't pretty. Bergen defeated their newest rival 76-0 and from that day forward the game became a RIVALRY!



The two schools matched up again in 1966, BC in the midst of an 18-game winning streak that would produce back-to-back state championships. This time, the Green Knights, in just their

second year, showed the type of fight one would expect of a great rival. BC defeated SJR 20-13 and after the game, the schools decided it best to take a year off to re-evaluate a rivalry that became exceptionally passionate.

We will pick it up in 1968, the third meeting of the two Bergen County foes as they resume their rivalry, BC still in its home gold uniforms.

1968

Coach Bob Norton's Crusaders were 2-2 entering the 1968 contest and these two teams were scrapping through the first half of this Northern New Jersey Catholic Federation game to a 0-0 tie.



Larry Molloy carried for a 30-yard touchdown run to open the scoring in the third quarter with right tackle, Tom Price's efforts recognized for leading the opening second-half drive. Ron Sabatelli scored on a ten-yard run on the final play of the third to give BC a commanding lead entering

the fourth quarter. The Green Knight defense, which was stout through quarters 1, 2 and 4, allowing only 39 yards and one first down in those quarters.

Molloy put additional insurance points up on the board with a 34-yard interception return.



1973

But remember. This was the Mike Morgan era and the Hall of Fame runner, and his Crusaders showed great heard in coming back and ultimately pulling away. Terry Hoey hit stellar Bob Buehler for a 27-yard



touchdown pass to get BC on the board in the first quarter. The two teamed up again in the second quarter to keep BC close, trailing 20-12 at intermission.

Mike Morgan scored from ten-yards out and the Hoey-to-Buehler connection tied the game at 20s in the third quarter.

The Green Knights regained the lead on a 1-yard plunge, making the score 26-20 for the home team. Morgan exploded for a 53-yard touchdown run followed by Hoey run for the


ranked SJR at Giants Stadium on December 4th.

Simply put, **THE BRIAN CUSHING GAME**. According to some sources, this MSG Varsity broadcast out-drew a Knicks game viewership. HS stars were out in

force. Cush, Jimmy Dray, and Isaiah Williams for BC, two McCourty brothers for SJR, all of whom would go on to NFL careers including two first-round draft choices and multiple Super Bowl winners. Throw in SJR kicker Andrew Giuliani and we still haven't touched on all of them. This would go down as one of the great games in BC football history.

The visiting Green Knights scored first as Jason McCourty went 31 yards for a touchdown. Cushing answered back as Brad Hartung found him for a 34-yard strike. Dave Kuncio (a future Country Music Award winner) drilled his first of 8 extra-points and BC was even at seven. Jason McCourty then caught a pass for a 79-yard touchdown and SJR started to gain momentum after stopping BC and scoring again, taking a 21-7 lead.

BC needed a hero. Enter Cushing. The Green Knights used a pooch kickoff to prevent a big return, but mistakenly kicked the ball to #10 who took it 78 yards to the endzone for a touchdown.

That started BC's engines. Jean-Pierre scored on a three-yard run and as SJR kicked off, Cushing laid a devastating tackle on the Green Knight returner. After stopping the Green Knights, Cush would run for a four-yard carry for six and BC led 28-21.

This was a game of stars and Devin McCourty showed his talent, scoring on a 39-yard pass and taking the two teams tied at 28 into the endzone at half.

Brad Hartung hit Isaiah Williams for a 38-yard score to give BC a 35-28 lead and he found Cushing from six yards out to increase the lead to a more comfortable 42-28.

Any comfort the Crusaders may have felt was short-lived as the Green Knights responded and cut the lead to 42-35 as the third quarter ended.

The brainchild of Miami Dolphins Special teams Coordinator, Darren Rizzi (BC '88), BC Special Teams Coordinator, Ben Tonon (BC '93) and QB Coach Zeke Rodgers (BC '91). Once again, Coach Stengel okayed the big play, as BC ran a fake punt. Punter Kevin Mollema (also a back-up QB) threw the ball high and long down the left sideline to a wide-open Cushing, whom the SJR punt team thought was just covering a bad kick. Cush grabbed the ball and sprinted the remaining yards for a 48-yard touchdown and another two-touchdown cushion. Adam Watson scored BC's final TD to ensure victory in the fourth quarter.
