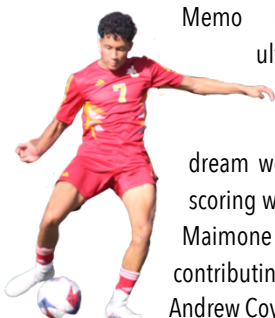
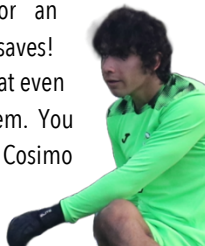

OCTOBER 5 - ORADELL, NJ - The 2023 Bergen County Coaches



Association Tournament begins for the Crusaders on Thursday as they take on 17th seed Bergenfield Bears who defeated 16th seeded Mahwah earlier this week. The Crusaders have won three previous tournaments since its inception in 1972. Coach Hugh Beattie's 1985 County Champions made

history at the school behind the play of Princeton-bound Christian Unger and Boston College-bound Greg Schwake. The 1999 County Champion team was directed by Coach Andrew McGirr and his star player Alecko Eskandarian. In 2019 Coach Pete Berkanish led BC to a thrilling victory over Ridgewood and once again a Schwake was involved in a key goal during the tournament. This time it was Greg's son, Nick.

Here we are in 2023 and BC has the top seed. Here's a look at some fun facts about the tournament.

- All three BC County Champion Coaches (Beattie, McGirr and Berkanish) are BC alumni soccer players.
- This is the 50th Year of the Tournament as the 2020 tournament was not played due to Covid-19.
- Despite this being the 50th year, there are already 50 team champions (only in soccer!) - Ramapo and Paramus tied in 2006 and were named co-champs.

OUTWIT - OUTPLAY - OUTLAST TOP SEEDED BC ADVANCES IN BERGEN COUNTY TOURNAMENT

OCTOBER 5 - ORADELL, NJ - In their first time as the top seed in the BCCA Tournament, the Crusaders did not seem completely accustomed to the position. The visiting #8 seeded Bears of Bergenfield HS took an early opportunity to score on a 1 on 3 situation in the

games 8th minute.



As the first half minutes were slipping away, it seemed the goal was becoming more difficult to breach until Sebastian Ortega received a pass in front of the goal. Unable to get off a shot and as the ball encroached the endline, right of the net, he sent a cross-cage pass to senior Ken Hoang who buried the shot at the 21st minute.



Luca Nazor was then fouled in the box and had an opportunity for a penalty shot. His kick was rocketed toward the right corner when the Bergenfield goalie fully extended to his left, making a diving save and kept the score knotted at one.

The visiting Bears had an opportunity late in the half to get on the board with a corner kick and just 17 seconds remaining, but they were unable to convert on a centering pass and the teams went into the half tied at one.



Twenty minutes into the second half, the Crusaders saw the visitors press their goal a number of times. Andrew Blodgett was strong in the goal, keeping the Bears at bay. A foul against Bergen gave the Bears a direct kick from the sideline, 10 yards above the goal. The ball was passed to the midfield and a lobbed feed to the crease area was headed, Blodgett making a dynamic save at the crossbar.

Luca Nazor and Joe Lee worked relentlessly on the defensive side of the field and the midfield.

The Bears had a second opportunity that Blodgett booted to the midfield, giving BC an opportunity to press the goal. Two injured players stopped play and the Bears started with the ball just outside their goal.

Ryan Chong had a great opportunity for his second goal of the game but the Bergenfield goalie once again made a save diving to his left. Action quickly swung to the south side of the field and a header from 5 yards in front of the net went just high, over the crossbar.

A direct kick got everyone's heart racing when the Bergenfield striker cut toward an open net. He had cut just an instant too soon, however and was called for off-sides as BC dodged another bullet with just under 10 minutes to go.

Finally, with 6:55, BC took its first lead of the game when Antonio



Mamsaang found Daniel Dictenberg on the backside pipe for the score.

With just under 5 minutes, the Crusaders were fouled along the western sideline. With a wall in front and the goalie looking into the sun, Chong sprinted toward the ball. The deception helped, but the force

Sebastian Ortega drove the ball to the top shelf with, would have been almost impossible for any high school goalie to stop. The Crusaders had a commanding 3-1 lead.



BC ran out the remainder of the time for the 3-1 victory. They advance to the quarterfinals of the County Tournament on Sunday at Ramapo HS vs. Pascack Valley, the number eight seed.

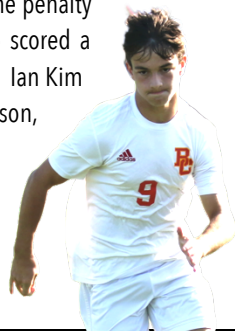

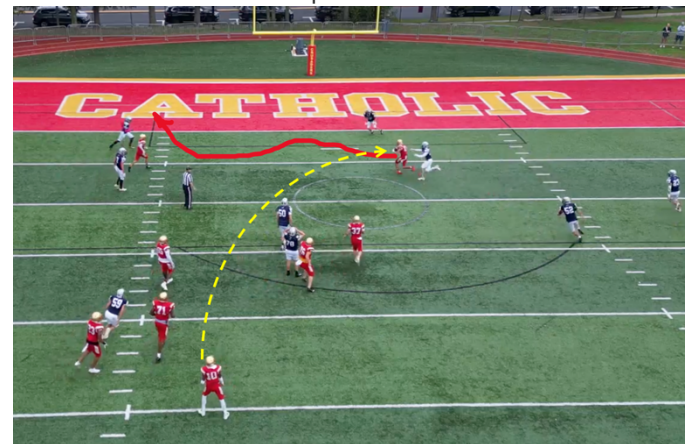
Defenses got the best of the offenses through much of the second quarter until quarterback Aiden Talley found Tristan
