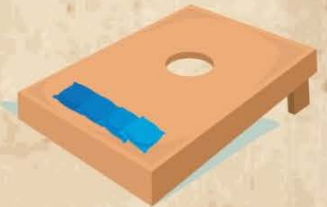

VARSITY FINISHES UNBEATEN IN BNC UNITED AFTER A-NAZ'IN WIN

OCTOBER 19 - ORADELL, NJ – Luca Nazor scored with 3.1 seconds remaining in regulation to lift BC over DePaul Catholic on Thursday at the Jack.



In one of the great see-saw battles of the season, the Crusaders took a 1-0 lead in the first half on a penalty kick by Sebastian Ortega. Ortega approached the ball and drove his right foot through it, launching a rocket to the upper left corner to beat the Spartan keeper.



With 14:04 remaining in the second half, the Spartans finally got on the scoreboard with a 15-yard shot that beat keeper, Andrew Blodgett on the ground to his right hand side.

The Crusaders answered just 30 seconds later to retake their lead. After sending the ball back, deep to its own defensive end, the Crusaders made a long pass up along the right side. It travelled upfield and ultimately Luca Nazor fed it across the box where Andrew Coyne was waiting. He redirected the ball into the goal and BC was just 13:34 from securing the undefeated league title.

The Spartans had played an exceptionally physical and gritty style, however and they still had more left in the tank. Unable to put enough pressure on the dribbler, he had room to feed the box where a striker stood open, ready to finish the ball and once again knot the game, this time at two.

After both teams made runs at each others' goals, Bergen made one last push with 15 seconds remaining. The ball moved up the right side and then to the center midfield area where Ortega was positioned. He fed the ball forward to Nazor who dinked it over an approaching goal keeper with 3.1 seconds remaining on the clock and after the required kick off, time expired and BC secured the victory.

Fortunately players make plays! The center snapped. The blockers blocked. The thrower threw and the catcher caught and ran for the touchdown. It was a terrific play design, but the Prep was well-coached and Talley, throwing to Tristan Herring had the smallest of windows to fit the ball into.



Fortunately he did fit it in and after Herring secured the catch, he kept his feet in bounds and turned upfield to the endzone, sprinting the rest of the way for a 41 yard score.

BC closed out the game and earned a hard-fought 12-7 victory. Other notable memories:

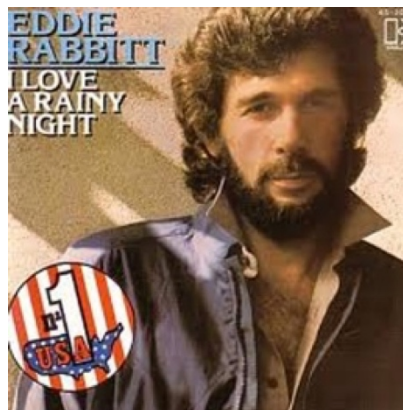

and quite a good deal of it came down on Friday at Caven Point as the Crusaders kicked it off against St. Peter's Prep. While they got off to a slow start, things started to kick into high gear and BC blasted the Marauders 37-7

The 30-point margin of victory was the 4th largest over the prep in the schools' 51-year rivalry. Only the 2017 state championship (44-7), the 1986 state championship (33-0), and the 2015 regular season victory (47-14) were greater point differentials.

The Crusaders got on the board in the first quarter as Kaj Sanders exploded for a 42 yard run. Guy Bartolomeo kicked the PAT and BC had a 7-0 lead. Unfortunately, the Marauders took out Bartolomeo with a roughing the kicker. Bartolomeo left the game and Brandon Apacillar took over kicking duties.

Dominic Campanile and Quincy Porter continued climbing the school leader ladders, connecting in the second quarter for a 72-yard touchdown. The two point conversion was no good and BC led 13-0.

Dante Kain was next to find the endzone, sprinting 34 yards for a score. The Crusaders opted to run the ball for the two point attempt, putting the pigskin in the hands of Mu Russell who added two points to his resume. BC took that 21-0 lead into halftime.

It was back to the lightning fast Sander for the first score in the second half. Kaj ran 39 yards to paydirt and after a Campanile to Porter conversion, the Crusaders led 29-0.

Campanile would come right back to Porter on the next drive, who scored from nine yards out. Russell punched it in for his second conversion of the night and the clock started running as the lead extended to 37-0.

BIRD OF THE WEEK

AMERICAN KESTREL

OCTOBER 22 - LYNDHURST, NJ - Admit it. It's a cute bird. The American Kestrel is the smallest of the falcon family. Other falcons you will find in our area include Peregrine Falcons and Merlins. I must say, I took advantage of an extremely windy day one January, though, and I saw a Gyrfalcon at Stateline Lookout on the Palisades. Not sure if one of those will be back in the near future. It was a great day. Bad pictures, though.

So what about our Kestrel? Here are some fun facts from **ALLABOUTBIRDS.ORG**

- The oldest American Kestrel was a male and at least 14 years, 8 months old when he was found in Utah in 2001. He was banded in the same state in 1987.
- Unlike humans, birds can see ultraviolet light. This enables kestrels to make out the trails of urine that voles, a common prey mammal, leave as they run along the ground. Like neon diner signs, these bright



paths may highlight the way to a meal—as has been observed in the Eurasian Kestrel, a close relative.

- It can be tough being one of the smallest birds of prey. Despite their fierce lifestyle, American Kestrels end up as prey for larger birds such as Northern Goshawks, Red-tailed Hawks, Barn Owls, American Crows, and Sharp-shinned and Cooper's Hawks, as well as rat snakes, corn snakes, and even fire ants.
- **COLORING:** This is a female kestrel. Unlike the male, whose striking slate-blue head and wings, she is mostly rusty with black barring.
- **SIZE:** Kestrels are mourning-dove size (between 8.5 and 12 inches long) A key identifier to separate the two when sitting on a wire is the size of the kestrel's head is far larger than the dove.
- **BEHAVIOR:** American Kestrels usually snatch their victims from the ground, though some catch quarry on the wing. They are gracefully buoyant in flight, and are small enough to get tossed around in the wind. When perched, kestrels often pump their tails as if they are trying to balance.
- **HABITAT:** American Kestrels occupy habitats ranging from deserts and grasslands to alpine meadows. You're most likely to see them perching on telephone wires along roadsides, in open country with short vegetation and few trees.

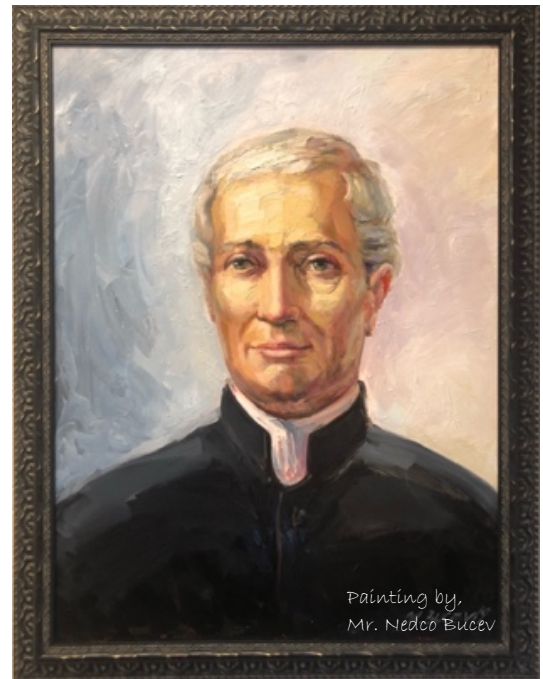
