2023 BERGEN CATHOLIC CRUSADERS AT A GLANCE

The Crusaders enter today's game under the direction of Head Coach, Vito Campanile, the eleventh coach in program history. Coach Campanile has done nothing but polish an apple, leading the Crusaders to three consecutive #1 state rankings and two straight Non-Public



"A" State Championship with a top 25 rankings in the USA Today and MaxPreps in 2021 (#3)and 2022 (#20).

BC was recognized by MaxPreps as the top high school football team in the state of New Jersey as we enter the season.

VITO VENI VICI

Coach Campanile has done nothing but enhance the quality of the Crusader Football brand in his time at the helm. Here's a look at the Vito Campanile Years:

Coach Campanile took the helm at Bergen Catholic in 2018, succeeding brother, Nunzio, who led BC to a state championship in 2017. Coach Vito immediately found success during the 2018 season, leading BC to the state final before the Crusaders were upset by St. Joseph Regional at MetLife Stadium.

Following a five-and-four 2019 campaign, Covid-19 prevented Campanile's #1-ranked Crusaders from pursuing a state championship as the state tournament was cancelled for the season.

In 2021, Coach Campanile led BC to its 18th state championship and second-ever 12-0 record. The Crusaders were the class of the state of New Jersey and earned the school's highest ever ranking to date of #3 in the country. Last year, the Crusaders defeated Don Bosco Prep in the State Final 45-0 to clinch the school's 19th State Championship.

In recognition of his commitment to excellence and leadership, Coach Campanile was recognized by the **USA Today** as the Nation's High School Boys Coach of the Year.

In his first five years at the helm of BC, Coach Campanile has a record of 43-8 (.843 winning percentage), two state championships and three-straight #1 rankings in NJ and two league titles. In his 16-year head coaching career, Coach Campanile has a record of 126-58 (a .685 winning percentage).

BERGEN CATHOLIC ON OFFENSE

The Crusader Offense starts with its explosive passing offense. Junior **QB Dominic Campanile (#17)** is an athletic southpaw slinger who has completed 58.8 percent of his passes for 1,884 yards. In just over two years, Campanile has completed 199 passes for 3,071 yards. He has 27 touchdown passes this year, raising his career total to 41.

Campanile's top target would be anyone's top target in NJ and beyond. Quincy Porter (#0) is a junior wide receiver who is already shattering all of BC's career records. He took down Aaron Martin's career TD reception record vs. Seton Hall Prep and currently stands at 30 for his career and 19 in 2023. Porter has 80 career receptions for 1,569 yards. This season his 45 catches for 1,007 yards (22.4 yards per catch). Luca Cuttita (#6) is a big-play threat. The senior receiver has 11 receptions for 226 yards (20.5 ypc) and four touchdowns. Junior slot Anthony Perrotti (#2) is the team's second leading receiver with 33 catches and 304 yards and three touchdowns. Junior slotbacks Michael Campanile (#4), Matt Daly (#48) and sophomore running back Dante Kain (#20) also have touchdown receptions this season.

Four-star Rutgers-commit, **Kaj Sanders (#1)** currently leads the Crusader ground game with 937 yards on 90 carries (8.3 YPC). Sanders has 15 touchdowns on the season and is currently the team's second leading scorer. The Crusaders also have a duo of solid younger runners. Junior **Mu Russell (#23)** has 60 carries for 302 yards and three rushing touchdowns TDs and sophomore **Dante Cain (#20)** with 69 carries 398 yards and 2 touchdowns.

The offensive line has been dealing with some injuries and in the past two weeks, has relied on several younger players to pitch in to support the cause. That said, the team is averaging 33.8 points per game and has gained over 1700 yards on the ground and 1900 yards through the air. Through eleven games, the quintet has allowed only 8 sacks all season and only 43 negative plays total in 543 plays. In comparison, Crusader defenders have sacked opposing quarterbacks 25 times to date. From left-to-right, expect to see LT Nyier Daniels (#79) and Rocco Costello (#71), LG



Owen Fernandez (#64), C Marcus Linder (#50), RG Ben Shue (#72) and RT Chris Vigna (#56). Do not be surprised to see sophomore Mikey McMahon (#77) contribute as well.

BERGEN CATHOLIC ON DEFENSE

The Crusader defense has been sound, yielding only 14.5 points per game this season and around 270 yards per game.

Senior linebacker **Christian Gonzalez (#10)** leads all Crusader tacklers with 70 on the season. Sophomore, **Mason Marck (#44)** is a very solid Mike linebacker and Junior **Kaden Irby-Mason (#14)**. The **Dave Matesic (#9)** got some reps and will certainly add some punch to the line-up. Like typical Crusader defenses, this one is stacked with talent!

On the defensive line, senior West Virginia commit, **Elijah Kinsler** (#8) leads the group with 58 tackles, 3.5 sacks and 9 tackles for a loss. Junior DT **Delaney Flood** (#99) made 8 tackles in last week's semi-final vs. Donovan Catholic. The Great Fludd has two sacks, a TFL and an interception on the year. At DE, junior **Ben Carey** (#97) has 42 tackles, and 4 sacks and sophomore **Jermaine Kinsler** (#88) has made ten tackles, five and a half for a loss and three sacks.

In the secondary, junior corner **Naiim Parrish (#5)** has five interceptions on the year, tying his sophomore year mark which was a single season sophomore record. It must have felt like de ja vu all over again for the Griffins last week as, for the second year in a row, Parrish had a 25-yard pick six against them in the playoffs. Naiim is also a sure tackler, recording 25 solo tackles this season. His superior play has encouraged opposing coordinators to attack the sophomore corner, **Jordan Thomas (#21).** All Thomas has done is intercept four passes this season and leads the team in solo tackles with 34. Senior safety **Kaj Sanders (#1)** has 34 tackles on the season and provides senior leadership in an outstanding but dinged-up secondary. **Ethan Cohall (#7)** had a solid semi-final, recording 6 tackles and one solo tackle for a loss from his safety position.

Freshman **Anthony Willis** (#24) is on the mend, but senior **Chris Mimmo** (#3) who is out for the season, have left an opportunity at the safety position for **Russell** (#23) and **Brandon Gomez** (#12) to make their marks.

BERGEN CATHOLIC SPECIAL TEAMS


Senior punter **Brandon Arpacilar (#25)** had another solid punting game, blasting four punts for 128 yards including a fifty-three yarder. The

junior averages 37.4 yards per punt, a 34.1-yard net. He has a long of 57 yards and can help BC win the field position game in a tight game, pinning the opponent inside the 20 (so far 9 times this season). Arpacilar has proven he can also serve as an effective place kicker, nailing all six of his XPAs this year.

Junior place kicker **Guytano Bartolomeo (#37)**, continues to maintain excellent focus and execution. His experience with the narrow goal posts of MetLife (5 feet narrower) should be an advantage tonight. He is currently 41 for 41 on XPAs and 5 for 5 on FGAs in 2023. His career scoring total are: 113 points on 7/8 Field Goals and 92/93 PATs.



DELBARTON ON OFFENSE



PISTOL OFFENSE

Delbarton's Pistol Offense is a Shotgun, with the **QB #15**, behind the center with the running back **#5** aligned behind him. This enables him to attack both flanks and the middle of the defense quickly running the ball. The offense puts pressure on the defense with four receivers near the line of scrimmage as well.


ALERTS

STOP #5 inside running and CONTAIN #1 as a receiving threat. Most of the Green Wave production comes on the ground. That is job #1 for the BC defense.

#9 is a TE/WR. He will align wide at times. #32 is a FB who can be a TE at times when Delbarton shifts or motions.

#79 is the right tackle. In goal line and short-yardage situations, keep an eye on him. If he aligns left, between **#76** and **#73**, you have a pretty good sense of where they want to go. **#60** is the most athletic lineman. Where he pulls, **#5** follows.

DELBARTON ON DEFENSE



3-4 DEFENSE

The Green Wave runs a "Field" 3-4 defense. Three-Four because there are 3 defensive linemen and 4 linebackers. We call it a "Field defense" because you will notice generally #s **11**, **3**, **32**, **4** and **81** align to the wide side of the field. Numbers **2**, **6**, **22**, **7**, **44** align to the short-side or boundary side of the field. Wide side players are typically faster and rangier. Boundary-side players are often more physical (they don't appreciate being called slower).

ALERTS

#81 is an issue. With a 6'7" frame and wingspan that echoes of the Andean Condor, he can impact a short and intermediate passing game. The Crusaders will need to get his hands down to help their air attack.

#22 is the team's leading tackler. We like to call his type of player a "heat seeker" as in heat-seeking missile. It's no surprise that three of the teams four leaders with interceptions are on the "field side" **#3, 4** and **11** with **7** on the boundary.



MULTIPLE OFFENSE

While nj.com suggested this starting line-up and you will see this personnel grouping in the game, the Crusaders have a number of people who can beat you and who they use. The base offense typically aligns in a shot gun and puts great pressure on defenses by spreading **Porter** and **Cuttita** wide. Do that and you could have issues with **Sanders** running for another 188 yards. Like we said, that's just the base. When push comes to shove, the Crusaders have no problem putting in the guys who do the shoving and heavy fronts will be used to relocate the Wave.

ALERTS

While a bend-and-don't-break defense awaits them, BC will most definitely look to get the ball to the two best players on the field **Sanders** and **Porter**. They are the kind of guys that can break it.

If you see two deep safeties from the Delbarton defense, expect **Kaj** to do some damage. When the Delbarton secondary is up, or if there is just one safety in the middle of the field, they may just be shaking the nitroglycerine bottle. **QP** could be off to the races.



4-3 DEFENSE

As my mom always said, "Speed kills." The 2023 Crusader D uses theirs violently from sideline to sideline. Expect **Parrish** and **Thomas** to lock down the corners and **Sanders** and **Cohall** to fill the front and ensure no big plays occur. The **Great Fludd** and **Elijah Kinsler** are going to be key to the unit's success as they free up the linebacker corps who expects to make the majority of the tackles.

ALERTS

Don't be surprised to see the Wave throw to their right, our left. While BC is strong straight across, **Parrish** has been too hot intercepting passes of late AND SCORING! Bergen is going to work to stuff the middle so **#5** has to run toward the sidelines. That's when the speed of the pursuit kicks in and is most effective.

2023 DELBARTON GREEN WAVE AT A GLANCE

Delbarton is coached by Brian Bowers. Coach Bowers is currently in his twenty-first season at the helm of the Green Wave. Under his leadership, the Morristown school has been close a number of times but have yet to bring home a title. The team was 6-0 in the shortened Covid-19 Season of 2020 with an opportunity to play

in the shortened Covid-19 Season of 2020 with an opportunity to play the #1-ranked Crusaders, but a Delbarton player tested positive for Covid, and the teams were notified just minutes before kickoff to learn they would not be able to play the game at Delbarton.

Coach Bowers' predecessor was Delbarton's legendary John Kowalik who led the Wave against BC in the 2001 State Final and finished his career after the 2002 season.

THE GREEN WAVE ON OFFENSE

The Green Wave are a ball-control, run-first type of team, but they have a capable passer in senior **Christian Zebroski (#15)**. He has completed 62.3% of his passes this year for 901 yards and seven touchdowns. The Wave relies upon ball-security on the offensive side and Zebroski has lived up to his responsibility, turning the ball over only twice through the air.

Senior RB **Ryan Trafford (#5)** leads the offense on the ground with 16 touchdowns and 861 yards (6.0 YPC). The senior back ran for 241 yards and four touchdowns in the Wave's 38-23 semi-final victory over Seton Hall Prep. Trafford is a multi-sport athlete who will be attending the United States Naval Academy to play Lacrosse. Expect the Crusader defense to focus quite a bit of attention on him this evening. Trafford is complimented **by Brock Dandridge** who has 78 carries this year for 456 yards and 6 touchdowns.

Junior WR **Philip Folmar (#1)** has 859 yards total offense (278 rushing and 579 receiving) and 10 touchdowns (6 rushing, 4 receiving). The multi-talented ball player is 1-1 passing as well, so expect him to be involved in the game plan.

THE GREEN WAVE ON DEFENSE

Big **Connor Martin (#81)** (UPenn commit) leads the Delbarton D up front. The son of former BC standout WR, Don Martin '90, has 3 sacks, 11 TFLs and 47 tackles on the season.

Kyle Checchio (#22) is the Wave's leading tackler with 75 tackles, 4 sacks and 9 TFLs.

Four Wave ball hawks have a pair of interceptions: Senior LBer Dallas Hurley (#4), Senior DB Will McGinty (#3), Senior DB Austin Quandt (#11) and Senior LBer Johnny Riley (#7).

THE GREEN WAVE SPECIAL TEAMS

Junior **Will Kramer (#46)** is having a strong year as Delbarton's place kicker. He is highly reliable on extra-point attempts, making 34 of 35 and has made four of six field goals, including a 41 yarder.

DELBARTON PLAYOFF HISTORY

The Green Wave seek their first state title in 25 years. Delbarton has made 34 playoff appearances and 14 appearances in the final with two Parochial III Championships (1993 and 1998). The Wave has a playoff record of 32-31, a .508 winning percentage. BC and Delbarton have met once before in the title game with the Crusaders coming away with a 10-9 victory at Rutgers Stadium in 2001.

The **Crusaders** are the #1 seed in this year's Non-Public "A" Tournament. With only 13 qualifiers, BC, second seeded Delbarton and third-seeded St. Joseph Regional earned byes into the quarterfinal round.

Bergen hammered Donovan Catholic 42-12 in last week's semi-final at the Jack to set up this evening's matchup with Delbarton. The Crusaders dismissed Paul VI of Haddonfield in the quarterfinal weekend 35-0 to advance following the bye round.

On the other side of the bracket, **Delbarton** defeated #11 seed Seton Hall Prep who shocked third-seeded St. Joseph Regional the week before. The Green Wave took care of business with a 38-23 victory which must have been quite satisfying to the folks in Morristown as Seton Hall earned wins in Lacrosse and Soccer recently

over the Wave. In the quarters, Delby held off a ferocious 10th seeded Don Bosco Prep 14-9.

CRUSADERS-GREEN WAVE HISTORY



The first football meeting of the two schools came in the 2001 State Championship Game at Rutgers Stadium. The Green Wave upset Don Bosco Prep 14-12 in the guarterfinals.

Don Bosco had beaten BC 14-13 on a blocked extra-point with 0:01 remaining in the game earlier in the season. Once again, an extrapoint would be the difference and BC would make it. Chris Handley's PAT and fourth-quarter 45-yard field goal lifted BC to a 10-9 victory in Non-Public IV that year.

Sixteen years would pass before the schools would meet again, though pre-season scrimmages were often part of the football relationship through the years. BC won big in the state quarterfinals. In 2021, BC and Delbarton met in the regular season after a Covid-scare forced the 2020 game to be cancelled, just minutes before in Morristown.

The Crusaders defeated a stingy Wave team, scoring a 21-0 victory a week after returning from 114 heat in Saguaro, AZ the week before. The point margin would remain the same for the 2022 state semi-final rematch, as BC extended its overall W-L record over the Wave to 5-0.

CRUSADERS WINNING STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS

The Bergen Catholic HS Football Program has a rich history of success, going back to their first championship teams in the early and mid 1960s, before the state playoff system began. We are going to take a look at the teams that won state championship games in these paragraphs to follow.

THE TONY KARCICH ERA

1979 – BC won its first tournament championship with legendary Coach,



Tony Karcich at the helm. The Crusaders defeated DePaul 14-6 at Giants Stadium in East Rutherford.

The victory was especially cherished because BC had been close for years before actually hoisting the

trophy. In 1974, prior to the playoff system, BC lost to DePaul in power points, which determined the championship during the regular season. In 1975, BC fell to DePaul once again, but in overtime in a game that actually ended in a tie. The deciding factor was to be most yards in 4 plays in OT which were measured with a tape-measurer. In 1977 and '78, BC fell to Seton Hall Prep, so defeating DePaul in '79 was especially meaningful.

QB Ken Jagiello (Syracuse) and LB Joe Azelby (Harvard, Buffalo Bills) played critical roles in helping the team to victory. Azelby recovered a



pair of fumbles and Jagiello ran for 81 yards and 2 touchdowns in the Crusaders option offense. In addition, he went 4 for 4 passing for 59 yards and a 2-point conversion.


1980 –Billy McGovern (Holy Cross) was a speedy safety/quarterback who helped shut out Seton Hall Prep and lead BC to its second-consecutive title 12-0 at Giants Stadium. Hasbrouck Heights born legend Timmy




Doherty (Delaware) starred at linebacker for the Crusaders and also dove into the endzone for a three-yard touchdown rush.

BC forced 6 Pony-Pirate turnovers including interceptions by McGovern and Guy Darienzo. Chuck Lester was all over the field for BC as was Joe Waters (Union College) who recovered a fumble.

1982 - Mike Morgan set the state scoring mark to beat in BC's Friday



points (including kicking PATs) to beat him out 179-178. No matter, QB Bob Murray (New Hampshire), who threw two touchdown passes on the evening at Montclair State University came out on top, leading BC to its 1st ever #1 ranking and Star Ledger Trophy. The Crusaders a perfect finished 11-0 for the first time in program history.



THE BILL ROCCA ERA


1986 – Tom Kearney (Yale) ran wild against his father's alma mater, St. Peter's Prep, leading BC to a 33-0 victory at Hinchliffe Stadium in Paterson. The senior fullback carried 25 times for 141 yards and two touchdowns behind offensive tackle Kevin Twomey (Rhode Island). QB Mike McGovern (Lehigh) connected for two touchdown passes with current New Orleans Saints Associate Head Coach, Darren Rizzi (Rhode Island). Tim Waters (USMA) solidified the defense along with All-State nose guard Anthony Matesic (Penn State). Mike and Joe Rinaldi were solid in the defensive secondary and Mike Rios provided speed at the WR position.

THE FRED STENGEL ERA

Buckle up. This is going to take a while!

1991 – In his fourth year, Coach Stengel's Crusaders won the first of ultimately 9 state championships. This is an unprecedented number at BC as are a number of accomplishments. Eric Lane (Tennessee, New York Giants), Zeke Rodgers (UConn) starred at QB and DB

as the Crusaders shut down St. Joseph Regional 14-0 on a muddy Crusader Stadium. Mark Fabish (UPenn) and Mike Bajakian (Williams) played exceptionally well in the secondary with Rodgers and Scott Robinson (Yale). The Crusader line dominated with Tom Foley (UPenn), Dom Piccinich (Williams) and John Matesic (VA Tech) opening holes for Lane.




1992 - "The Game of the Century" Current BC Head Coach Vito Campanile was coached by current freshman coach (and father) Mike Campanile at Paramus Catholic as the Paladins put a scare in the undefeated Crusaders. BC won its second consecutive championship 44-34 at

Harry Cooke Memorial Field at Union. The win was BC's 22nd consecutive victory.

Mark DeRosa (UPenn, Atlanta Braves and number of other MLB teams) starred at QB. He and Fabish were devastating a combination to opponents and were devastating to the Paladins on this day. Current freshman head coach, Dave Cavalluzzo (Trenton State), played the best game of his career, coming

up clutch as a




tight end and middle linebacker and running backs Joe DeFranco (Trenton State) and Billy Tierney (Fordham) churned out yards in the second half, keeping the ball away from the Paladins. After a late score, Ronnie DiBisceglie (USMA) recovered an onside kick to end the PC threat.

1993 – An "off" 9-2 season, following a pair of 11-0 seasons, still translated into a state championship for Coach Stengel's Bergen Eleven. The Crusaders knocked off their favorite foe, Don Bosco Prep for the first time in a state title game 7-0 in a soggy Crusader Stadium. Chuck Mazzarone (New Haven) scored on a Joe Piela (UPenn) pass for the Crusaders only touchdown. Jimmy Finn (UPenn, Colts, Giants) intercepted three passes. Ryan Carfley (North Carolina) played a significant role for BC on the line of scrimmage, despite being only a junior. Captain Billy Tierney led BC on both sides of the ball.



NOTE: To this point, BC had won its state championship games against unique opponents: DePaul ('79), Seton Hall Prep (80), Immaculata ('82), St. Peter's Prep ('86), St. Joseph Regional ('91), Paramus Catholic ('92), Don Bosco Prep ('93). Exception to the rule is the victories over Don Bosco Prep on Thanksgiving Day in 1963, 1965 and 1966.


1995 – BC earned a rematch with St. Peter's Prep after falling 26-24 to the Marauders in '94. With a healthy running duo of Greg Boyajian (Cornell) and Jon Piela (Fordham), BC pounded the JC team 19-7. Piela scored one touchdown and sophomore QB, Craig Pengitore (William and Mary) scored two. Linebackers Mike Higgins (Princeton) and Taylor Suman (Temple) and defensive linemen Jimmy Telesmanich (Stanford), Carmelo Rubano (UPenn) helped to stymie the Marauder offense, holding them to 29 yards on 27 carries.




1996 – On a rainy, windy night in East Rutherford, the Crusaders defeated Holy Cross High School's Lancers 42-28 at Giants Stadium. Craig Pengitore, now a junior, ran for 3 touchdowns and passed for 247 yards and 1 touchdown in the victory. Alex Fonti (Johns Hopkins) rushed for 180 yards and Matt Student (Pomona) ran for a 54-yard touchdown. Ben Martin (Rutgers) and Jon and Ed Galan (both UPenn) along with Matt Craffey (Georgetown) led a defense that was able to contain the Lancers just enough for the victory.



1998 – The Crusaders entered the game 11-0 and as the number 2 seed in the state tournament. That said, in their minds, they were the best team ever. Ultimately the Record would recognize them as the Team of the Century. No wonder. On a perfect 67° December evening, BC defeated nationally ranked St. Joseph Regional 35-9 in a game that was not nearly that close. Rich Scanlon (Syracuse, KC Chiefs), Jim Burt, Jr. (Miami-baseball), Mark Stokes (Union), Sean Pena (Dartmouth), Jeff Muller (Penn), Chris Andreano (Cornell), John Relay (Columbia), Dom Santoli (Delaware), Steve Lhotak (UPenn), Mario Matesic (Penn State), Rob Ferranti (Iona) and Greg Abramopaulus (Northeastern) made up an incredible defense.




On the offensive side of the ball, Scanlon (FB) aligned behind QB Matt Lovecchio (Notre Dame and Indiana) who could throw to Burt or Aaron Martin (Rutgers) or Muller. The team scored 599 points on the season, an average of 49.9 per game. Add in a deadly accurate kicker, Doug Kirschner (Richmond) and you had one of the best, smartest, toughest, scariest teams in school history.





Eric Dezelan scored the lone Crusader touchdown on a Brian Saverino (Johns Hopkins) pass to the left side. Hanley's PAT was the one point for which Delbarton could not account.




2004 – BC. Bergen Catholic. Brian Cushing. The Crusaders' most dominant football player of all time dominated the state final. 180 yards, two touchdowns. He outran one of the state's fastest sprinters for an 80-yard rushing touchdown. He got both toes down to score at the back of the endzone as he led BC to a 13-10 championship over Don Bosco Prep.



Cush became the school's second all-time leader QB sacker with 19. He was behind only teammate Brad Dussault (21) and just ahead of BC's # all-time leader Jimmy Dray (Stanford, AZ Cardinals) who had 16. Cushing was recognized as the National Two-Way Player of the Year, Parade All-American. He starred in the Senior All-American Game in San Antonio and went on to star at USC, where he became only the second player to ever start in four Rose Bowls (Archie Griffin, 2x Heisman Trophy winner from Ohio State had done it before). He was the defensive MVP of one of those Rose Bowls and went on as a first-round draft choice for the Houston Texans, NFL Defensive Rookie of the Year, Pro-Bowl and All-Pro.

THE NUNZIO CAMPANILE ERA

2017 - Mission 17 was accomplished as BC won its 17th State Championship in 2017 at MetLife Stadium. This was the Johnny "Football" Langan show, as Langan's will would not be stopped by St. Peter's Prep's Marauders. Langan (Rutgers) was the son of former BC standout Brian Langan who starred for the Crusaders as the fullback of their 1982 State Championship team.



Rhamir Johnson (Nebraska) provided some serious footspeed in the backfield and Josh McKenzie (Yale) was an exceptional runner for BC as well. A line solidified by BC's first ever four-year starting offensive lineman; Brian Felter (Rutgers) led the charge in the 44-7 victory. This was BC's largest ever margin of victory in a state final.

On the defensive side of the ball, Javonte Jean-Baptiste (Ohio State) and Jeremiah Grant would go on to ultimately tie for the school's single-season sack record (11.5).

THE VITO CAMPANILE ERA

2021 - Coach VITO Campanile led the Crusaders to the second 12-0

record in school history as Princeton-bound Running Back Ryan Butler, through grit and determination, broke nearly every rushing record in school history. The two led BC over Don Bosco Prep 28-7 at MetLife Stadium. This team was the first team to ever

complete an undefeated season since the Super Football Conference United Red Division was created. It meant that BC defeated Don Bosco,

St. Peters, St. Joseph Regional, Paramus Catholic, Seton Hall Prep and Delbarton all in the same season. No other team had run the gauntlet.

The 2021 Championship Game saw the Ironmen take a first quarter 7-0 lead. From that point, BC methodically scored a touchdown each quarter, rushing for 300 yards and passing for 101. Princeton-bound Ryan Butler ran for 140 yards and two touchdowns and Saeed St. Fleur rushed for 125 yards and DJ Samuels ran for a 6-yard score. Malachi Mercer recorded 10 tackles in the game, shutting down a strong Ironman offense.



2022 – The Crusaders manhandled their great adversary, Don Bosco Prep, in the most lop-sided championship game in BC football history 45-0. A suffocating defense combined with exceptional special teams and a devastating aerial assault led to the Crusaders 19th State Championship in school history. Running back Saeed St. Fleur scored three touchdowns and earned "Athlete of the Week" honors, the 14th Crusader gridder to earn that recognition and the third in three years.

The game was a culmination of a season of hard work, and extraordinary talent. All-American DL Sydir Mitchell (Texas) and All-State DE, DJ Samuels (Maryland) led a star-studded field of players whose playoff-careers at BC were still ahead of them.

The Crusaders will be home team today for the fourth time in seven outings. BC hopes to win its 5th game o and they hope to keep the good times rolling with a victory tonight at Metlife Stadium.

Frank Luciano recovered the fumbled ball at the 13, and BC was in business early. Fullback Bob Higgins punched it in from the one and Tom Scott hit on his first of four PATs to give BC a 7-0 lead. After a first quarter safety, Bill Higgins pulled in a 27-yard Terry Wolfe pass and BC would lead 14-8 at half. Paul McMeniman returned the second half kickoff back 86 yards for a score to extend a BC halftime lead to 21-8 as BC would defeat the Ironmen 28-21, snapping a fourgame losing streak to their rivals.

Crusaders, winning in the final 1:30 of the ball game with a late TD pass. The game was dramatic, helping the Ironmen to a league title, while eliminating BC from a tie for a state championship. BC running back Larry Molloy ran 14 times for 115 yards including a 68-yard TD. QB John VonOhlen threw a pair of TD passes to Ed Whalen (68 and 35 yards) and ran for a 38-yard fourth-quarter TD of his own, but BC fell 27-25 in Ramsey.

1992 - THANKSGIVING - The Crusaders set a school record with its 20th



consecutive win as BC beat Ridgewood 24-7. Fullback Joe DeFranco ran for a pair of scores and halfback Billy Tierney added one of his own as the pair

each rushed for over 100 yards and QB Mark DeRosa passed for over 100 yards. Four QB sacks by Mark Ruoff, Jon Picinic, Ben Tonon and Brian Brosnan highlighted a defensive performance that lived up to Coach Fred Stengel's description of Smash-mouth football. One play in particular, highlighted that adjective as a blitzing Tonon hit a Maroon pulling guard so hard, the lineman fell deep in the backfield and bowled over his own running back for a five-yard loss.

2008 - THANKSGIVING - The Crusaders had no answers for the Green Knights who opened up a 28-7 lead at the half. Doug Rigg, Jeremy Grasso and Nick Gerst all ran for TDs and Anthony Marino caught a Rob Eckrote TD pass, but BC (9-2) fell 42-26 at Crusader Stadium.

Peter's Prep 22-15. The Crusaders finished the Pandemicshortened 2020 season 5-1, winning the BNC United Division and earning a #1 ranking in the state of NJ.






