ENTER SANDMAN



NOVEMBER 18 - ORADELL, NJ - The eighth play of the game was a sweep to the left to Bergen Catholic senior running back #1, Kaj Sanders. When I saw the play, I thought to myself, that was CLOSE! It was close to being a very big play, and one could just sense it was going to come. While he gained five yards on that one, the Sandman ultimately put the lights out on the Donovan Catholic football season, rushing for 188 yards on 14 carries and three touchdowns. The two "big ones" were runs of 55

and 78 yards in which the sprinter speed in the Rutgers commit was on full display. Bergen romped 42-13, punching its ticket to the state final.

That's not to say it was easy, especially at first. The Griffins made an early first down and then punted, pinning Bergen down to its own seven. After Sanders ran for a first down, the Crusaders fumbled, and DC returned the ball for a touchdown to take an early lead.

BC's next offensive drive was uninspiring as well and the visitors drove from their 29 across midfield. The defense stopped the Donnies, but with a lead and feeling this was their "shot," on fourth and 11, DC elected to run a fake punt. The play put on display the Crusaders' tremendous team speed advantage as a wide-open looking play, turned into coming up six yards short.

Field advantage: Bergen Catholic. It seemed that opening was all the Crusaders needed as Dominic Campanile immediately went to work, finding TE John Morris for a 26-yard gain, placing the ball at the 22-yard line. Three plays later, Sanders was bursting into the end-zone for his first score.



After forcing a punt midway through the second, it took BC just nine seconds to score. Sanders exploded for 55 yards to kick off the Crusaders' second quarter scoring and the team began to roll. Guy Bartolomeo drilled his extra-point up high as Mr. Haas began ringing up \$85 per football lost when he boots it over the 30' high netting into the "swamp."

The defense was stellar all day and Naiim Parrish tied his own personal record with his fifth interception of the season. Parrish had a twenty-five-yard pick six in the second quarter. It was like de ja vu all over, as he picked the same QB for 6 last season in the playoffs.

As the third quarter started, BC once again stopped the Griffins, but BC continued on a path to lose the time of possession battle. Campanile found Quincy Porter for another 9 second touchdown drive. This time, it was a 60-yard completion, helping QP to become only the second 1000-yard receiver in school history and break the all-time career receiving yards record.



The teams traded possessions in the third and BC got the ball back with 1:32 remaining in the third. This would be a relatively "long drive" taking two plays and 42 seconds. The big one was the 78-yard turn-out-the-lights Sanders sprint.

Bergen would drive one last time in the fourth quarter with Campanile



executing a scramble and finding Luca Cuttita in the endzone for six.

The Crusaders will play for their third consecutive state championship (and 20th overall) on Tuesday, November 28, 2023, at 8:00 pm at MetLife Stadium. They will face the #2-seed Delbarton Green Wave who defeated Seton Hall Prep 38-23 in today's other semifinal game.

BIRD OF THE WEEK LIMPKIN



NOVEMBER 18 - ORADELL, NJ - This HAD to be the BOTW. Making news on Facebook, New Jersey 12, e-bird and other sources, this Limpkin is the **FIRST EVER RECORDED IN NEW JERSEY**. I received a number of texts from friends, family members and BC community members alerting me of this bird's presence which I GREATLY APPRECIATE.

The bird was last seen in the wild in Wall Twp./Manasquan before the Manasquan SPCA decided to help a bird allegedly, it deemed to be struggling with dehydration. Birders in the community are upset as they are concerned about when the government tries to help, well, you know. I'm sure we're all hopeful this bird will find its way back to Florida or Georgia where it most likely resides.

The gangly, brown-and-white Limpkin looks a bit like a giant rail or perhaps a young night-heron. Its long bill is bent and twisted at the tip, an adaptation for removing snails from the shell. Limpkins are tropical wetland birds whose range reaches into Florida. They specialize in eating apple snails, which they hunt both day and night, and they often leave telltale piles of snail shells at the edges of freshwater wetlands where hunting is good. This bird's haunting cries, heard mostly at night, are otherworldly and unforgettable.

The name Limpkin purportedly comes from the bird's gait, which appeared to early European settlers as a limp, perhaps when pursued by hunters with dogs. At such times, the usually stolid bird gallops away at unexpectedly high speeds.

The Limpkin's bill is uniquely adapted to foraging on apple snails. The closed bill has a gap just before the tip that makes the bill act like tweezers. The tip itself is often curved slightly to the right so it can be slipped into the right-handed curve of the snail's shell.

I think it opens an opportunity for us all to see the humanity in religious life without it being an opportunity for someone to offer a punchline. It also offers an opportunity to examine how to deal with extra-ordinary difficulties in life in an emotionally healthy, mature way.

Believe it or not, I watched the movie after watching **BARBIE** (the movie). I can't believe I did it, but an anonymous teacher said, "I pity the fool who doesn't watch this movie." Strangely enough, the Barbie movie actually has a similar theme to Trinity's Triumph, encouraging us to wake up from our non-stop party life (or thinking we are living in a non-stop party) and start to embrace our true identities and relationships.

OK. So here are some of my recommendations for Thanksgiving Weekend Movies if you want to be that kind of person. There is a BC next to the ones that have a Bergen Connection. I'll leave it to you to discover what it is.

PLANES, TRAINS and AUTOMOBILES - Aside from a few choice words, a classic, heartfelt dramedy sure for almost anyone to love. Steve Martin and John Candy, a dynamic duo for sure.
