



CRUSADERS WIN 20TH CROWN & FIRST 3-PEAT IN 30 YEARS!

NOVEMBER 28 - EAST RUTHERFORD, NJ - Oh sure the wave made some noise on Tuesday Night, but it was the Crusaders who finished the song, as BC won its twentieth state title and put together the second three-peat in school history; the first since 1991-92-93.



Anthony Perrotti started things off right with a 66-yard kickoff return to get the Crusaders started. Five plays later, Kaj Sanders started off the 2023 title game scoring the way he started the 2022 game, this time a 10-yard run. After Guy Bartolomeo drove the ball through the uprights, BC was on top 7-0.

The Green Wave took the ball and began moving it, generating three straight first downs, moving the ball from their 20 to BC's 36 yard line. Kaden Irby-Mason came through with the big play, sacking the Delbarton passer for a 9 yard loss. On second and nineteen, Elijah Kinsler got his hands on an intermediate pass and batted it into the air. Defensive tackle Delaney Fludd, disengaged with his blocker and laid out to make an incredible diving interception. It was the big junior tackle's second interception of the season and just one of the reasons we like to call him the Great Fludd.



On first down, Dominic Campanile threw a beautiful pass on a crossing route to Anthony Perrotti for a 28 yard gain. The Green Wave was called for an 15-yard penalty which was added to the end of the reception and BC was in business at the Delbarton 12 yard line. After runs by Mu Russell and Sanders, and a completion to Quincy Porter, Dante Kain took a Campanile shovel pass into the endzone for six and BC quickly had a 14-0 lead with 4:47 remaining in the quarter.



From that point, Delbarton took advantage of some fortunate field position due to the punting game. Brandon Arpacilar's punt from his own endzone travelled only 8 yards to the Crusader 15. It appeared as if Arpacilar was roughed or at least run into on the play, but the flag on the ground signaled a facemask against the Crusaders. The ball was moved to the 7 yard-line, first and goal Delbarton. After an illegal procedure call, the Wave was in the endzone on a 12-yard scoring strike and the game was 14-7 at the quarter.



The teams traded possessions and BC drove into scoring position until a sack for an 8 yard loss moved the ball out of field goal range. Bergen punted and the Wave was starting from their own 8. After an illegal procedure penalty and Kaden Irby-Mason recording a tackle-for-a-loss, the Wave was third and fifteen from its own 3 three just over six minutes in the half.

They converted on a crossing route to keep the drive, which would turn out to be a 19-play 6 minute and forty-nine second TD drive to knot the score at 14 with 11 seconds remaining in the half.



The third quarter was a hard-fought and both teams played eleven minutes of scoreless football until the Green Wave made a fatal mistake. An errant snap eluded their quarterback with just over three minutes remaining in the third and an alert Ben Carey jumped on the football.



Eight plays later, Kaj Sanders scored his second TD of the evening and fifth in the past two weeks, lifting Bergen to a 21-14 lead with just 51 seconds remaining in the third.



Despite not scoring a touchdown, Quincy Porter pulled in seven receptions for 97 yards. The junior wide receiver was elusive turning short passes into solid games and picking up five first downs.



The Crusader defense was stingy, yielding only 222 total yards to the state's #2 ranked team.

Junior placekicker, Guy Bartolomeo finished his season perfectly, hitting a 20-yard field goal to end the evening's scoring. Bartolomeo finished the season 44 of 44 on extra-point attempts and 6-for-6 with his field goals for a total of 62 points.

BC PLAYERS OF THE GAME

Benjamin Carey, Bergen Catholic, Jr., DL

The 6-0, 215-pound junior came up with six tackles, one below his season high, and also recorded two sacks and a fumble recovery to pace the Crusaders' stingy defense. Carey generated two of his six tackles for losses, giving him 10 for the season. He finished the year with 48 tackles and six sacks. Carey's season-high seven tackles came in a victory earlier this season over Iona Prep.

Quincy Porter, Bergen Catholic, Jr., WR

Porter caught seven passes for 97 yards from fellow junior QB Dominic Campanile. He failed to reach the end zone for the first time in five games, though helped set the stage for his team's running backs with his receptions. For the season, Porter hauled in 53 passes for 1,107 yards and 19 touchdowns.

Kaj Sanders, Bergen Catholic, Sr., RB

Sanders scored on a 10-yard run in the first quarter to give the Crusaders the initial lead, then helped them dominate possession in the second half with his sturdy consistency. He accumulated 82 of his 110 yards and scored a second TD with another 10-yard run to surpass 1,000 yards for the season. Sanders rushed 125 times for 1,053 yards and 17 touchdowns, scoring five of them in the last two games.

Those who follow Bergen Catholic closely haven't forgotten about Chris Mimmo's impact. The senior defensive back went down in the season opener against Red Bank Catholic with a torn Achilles, but that hasn't changed his role as the emotional leader in the locker room. Mimmo epitomizes what it means to play for the Crusaders. He's 5-10, 180 pounds, though his size doesn't matter. Mimmo has long been a leader for this secondary and even with standout college prospects around him in Kaj Sanders, Naiim Parrish and Jordan Thomas among others, he has been someone for the roster to look up to and learn from at all times. His injury was as devastating as it gets for the program, but he's still very much there for his teammates and he's helping elevate the play of junior Ethan Cohall, senior Brandon Gomez and the rest of this deep defensive backfield.

"It was one of the harder ones I've been through and I've seen some really tough ones. He has been such a rock. He has been a great example for everybody. His emotional leadership has been awesome even in days where he has to step away. The Bosco game was really hard for him and that's really tough. BIRD OF THE WEEK RUFIOUS HUMMINGBIRD



NOVEMBER 26 - COS COB, CT - Br. Fagan and I were able to do some birding on Sunday and were fortunate enough to see some very interesting species. Our "target bird" for Cos Cob, Connecticut was a rare species this side of the Mississippi, the Rufous Hummingbird.

The bird in the photograph is an immature male. You can notice its sides washed in orange, but what is not visible here are the beginnings of bright orange on its throat.

- During their long migrations (3,900 miles one way), Rufous Hummingbirds make a clockwise circuit of western North America each year. They move up the Pacific Coast in late winter and spring, reaching Washington and British Columbia by May. As early as July they may start south again, traveling down the chain of the Rocky Mountains. People first realized this pattern after examining detailed field notes and specimens, noting the birds' characteristic dates of arrival on each part of the circuit.
