
JOE'S SLOWS BC ROLLERS

Her daughter and I grew up together and she was always generous and especially kind. She passed this recipe onto my mom who made it annually and I pass it along to you. I hope you enjoy it!

PRE HEAT THE OVEN 375°

CRUST

^{1/2} LB (2 sticks) salted butter 6 oz. cream cheese 2 cups flour

Mix together (butter and cream cheese need to be at room temperature or they will not mix well with the flour). Roll out to about 1/8 inch thickness and cut with circular (2.25" diameter) cookie cutter. You want the crust to be slightly above the pan.

FILLING

1.5 cup brown sugar3 tablespoon melted butter

3 eggs

2 teaspoons vanilla extract

Mix together. Be sure brown sugar isn't balling up. Pour into each cup and fill about $\frac{3}{4}$ way to the top of each. Do not overfill.



TOPPING

Chop walnuts (or pecans) and spread over top of each tassie.

BAKE

20 minutes at 375° or until crusts are golden brown. Center will rise above crust in the middle. Let cool for 5 minutes. Center will settle.
