## UNRANKED GREEN KNIGHTS UPEND CRUSADERS

**DECEMBER 27 - HACKENSACK, NJ** - Unranked St. Joseph visited the Ice House for a Wednesday night match-up with the Crusaders.

The Green Knights created some transition offensive opportunities in the first six minutes of play, as Bergen was controlling the puck more on the offensive end.

A holding call against the Green Knights at the 6:30 mark gave Bergen the first power play opportunity of the evening. Matt Maglio was able to get a shot off, but otherwise the visitors were effective in killing the penalty.

The Crusaders were trying to make a number of long, cross-ice passes and that high-risk play was costly as Joes intercepted a pass and converted it on a breakaway goal with 1:05 in the first. At the end of one period, SJR 1-BC 0.

After 10 minutes of near misses on both sides due to some acrobatic goaltending on the part of both keepers, including BC's Erez Yacobi, the Crusaders got their second power play of the evening. The Green Knights killed the penalty off and quickly generated a fast break. 35 made a tremendous glove save to shut down the attack.

The second period finished with a flurry of action in front of the SJR net, but BC was unable to break the goal line and continued to the third period still down a goal.

Sixty-seven seconds into the third period, Yacobi came up huge again with a big save, but the team's carelessness with the puck would cost the Crusaders. A Green Knight skater intercepted an errant pass and after Yacobi made the initial save on that shot, no help was near to clear out the shooter, who found the loose puck to the side of the net and buried his own rebound to put his team up by two.

Finally, 3:34 into the third, Declan Quinn found Will Schlechtweg open on the crease. Schlechtweg promptly deposited the puck into the Joes' net, cutting the lead in half.

Unfortunately, the Crusaders were unable to solve the riddle of the St. Joseph defense who played smartly to secure the victory.

## FORD, SHUE, VARGA MEDAL FOR BC IN PENNSYLVANIA

**DECEMBER 27-30 - CANONSBURG, PA** - The Crusader Varsity



Wrestling Team travelled to western Pennsylvania, outside Pittsburg, to compete in one of the nation's most challenging tournaments.

The team finished 9<sup>th</sup> overall with 99 points behind #8 Delbarton (124.5 points), #5 St. Joseph Regional (158). Wyoming Seminary ran away with the title with 229 points. The only other Garden State schools were CBA of Lincroft and Southern Regional. The Colts finished 10<sup>th</sup> with 91.5 points and Southern finished 18<sup>th</sup> with 66 points. A total of 49 schools from no fewer than 10 states competed in the 2023 event.

### MEDAL WINNERS

At 160 pounds, Ryan Ford won his first two bouts before losing to Logan Fowler from Cleveland, TN by a score of 1-0. Fowler lost to the eventual champion in the semifinal round and as Ryan continued to win in the wrestlebacks, until he met Fowler again in the third-place consolations. This time, Ryan was the victor, in the bout that mattered, earning the 2-1 victory and the bronze medal.

Benji Shue was the #4 seed in the 275 weight class. He pinned his first two opponents in :36 each and his third in 1:43 before losing to the

eventual champion in the semifinal. Ben had to wrestle two matches to earn his bronze medal, defeating the #2 seed with a second period pin at 2:44.

Leo Varga won his first bout at 189 pounds by technical fall before taking a step back to the consolation rounds. There he won four bouts until he ran into Lucas Szymbrocki from Cleveland, TN for the second time. For the second time Szymbrocki got the upper hand and Leo took home an 8<sup>th</sup> place medal.

### THE GRAPPLERS

Nathan Braun won his first two bouts before he fell to the eventual silver medalist at 114 pounds in the quarterfinal round. He was unable to continue in the consolations and his tournament ended at 2-1.

Chris Nucifora won his first match before being defeated by the 8 seed at 121 pounds. He responded very well, winning three rounds in the consolations before losing in the 5<sup>th</sup> round of the wrestlebacks.

Chad Sadaka won his first bout in the pigtales 9-2 before falling in the round of 32 to the eventual silver medalist at 133 pounds. He then pinned his opponent in consolation round 2, before being eliminated in consy round 3.

At 139 pounds, Noah Kochman lost in the round of 32 in the battle between 16 and 17 seeds. He wound up with one of the strongest tournaments, wrestling back successfully 5 rounds, before falling one round away from qualifying for a medal bout.

Jayden Iznaga (152 pounds) won a bout in the consolation rounds after winning his opening bout and falling to the wrestlebacks in the quarters.

Frankie Patti (107), Joe Barbarro (145) and Mason Marck (215) all acquitted themselves quite well in the tournament as well. Certainly Crusader Nation is proud of them and all of the wrestlers who gave their best for BC.
