FROSH - RAMAPO

JANUARY 2 - ORADELL, NJ - The Freshmen kicked off the first home triple-header of the season against a strong Ramapo team. In a competitive game, visitors ultimately prevailed, 63-57.



The Green Raiders took a two-point lead into the second quarter and then held the Crusaders scoreless for 4 minutes as they increased their lead to 8. Charlie Sanders drove to the hoop and was fouled. He converted on both of his free throw and after getting a defensive stop, cut the 'Po lead in half.

The frosh got a pair of strong defensive rebounds from Jamel Hammary as Sander dropped in another bucket to keep BC within four at 28-24. Ramapo scored with 10 seconds remaining in the half and then intercepted BC's inbound, laying it up to increase their lead up

After Ramapo opened the second half with a field goal, Robert Hroncich answered with a three-point basket. Nate Vasquez played solid defense forcing an errant pass and Milo Santos drove the lane for a layup and converted a free throw after being fouled to pull BC back to four. After another defensive stop, Ayden Mendez knocked down a three-point basket and the frosh were down one.

The Crusaders fell victim to some transition offense from the Raiders and perfect free-throw shooting which took the 'Po lead to seven. With two and a half minutes remaining, Santos hit a layup, then followed up with a steal he took the distance to bring BC back to 40-37. He fought for a pair of offensive boards and after Vasquez was fouled, he hit both of his free throws to get Bergen within a point with just over a minute remaining in the third.

The Green Raiders ran a patient offense for 30 seconds, increasing their lead to 3 and then rebound and quick pass to a visitor who got beyond the defense opened the score back up to five with 7.6 seconds.

Aidan Talley found Vasquez inside for an easy layup, but Ramapo shooters were hot.



BIRD OF THE WEEK PINK FOOTED GOOSE

JANUARY 6 - ROCKLEIGH, NJ - This rare goose was reported at the Rockleigh Golf Course on Friday, January 5th. I caught a glimpse on Saturday, but was unable to photograph the bird, so I shared a couple of shots I had from 2021 at Overpeck Park, Henry Hoebel Area.

Looking at PFGs in the water isn't all that cool until they take off (photo 2). You can see that they are different size/shape/coloring than Canada geese, but it is fun to see the pink feet.

The first time I saw one was with my good friend, Ms. Conley as she and I and Br. Hall were returning from a tech convention in Atlantic City. We caught up with the bird, flying, in Toms River.
